Assistant County Attorney Wilfredo Ferrer noted that the quorum for this Committee required four (4) members to be present; however, it was admissible to address the discussions matters.

Report: *Assistant County Attorney Wilfredo Ferrer read the foregoing discussion matter into the record.*

Ms. Vivian Donnell Rodriguez, the Director of the Miami-Dade County Park and Recreation Department (MDPRD), appeared before the committee and presented an overview of the four (4) committees under the MDPRD that provided sunset review reports as required; including the Kendall Lakes Landscape and Maintenance Special Task District Advisory Board, the Miami-Dade Metro Zoo Oversight Advisory Board, the Park and Recreation Citizen's Advisory Committee; and the Ronald Reagan Equestrian Center Advisory Board. She noted each of these boards had been active and meeting on a regular basis, but she did not have a recommendation at this time other than that these Boards continued to meet.

Commissioner Moss questioned whether any issues existed with members not being appointed. He recommended that members serving on all boards participate in efforts to fill vacancies by submitting the names/resumes to respective commissioners who had appointments to fill.

Ms. Rodriguez noted members were appointed in different ways, and that Commissioner Moss' recommendation would be applicable to the Park and Recreation Citizen's Advisory Committee which was the largest of the four and on which vacancies need to be filled. She stated she would check with each of commissioner regarding appointments to fill these vacancies.

Commissioner Moss recommended that Advisory Board members submit the names and resumes of potential candidates to the respective commissioners who have appointments.

Chairman Souto asked the Miami-Dade County Park and Recreation Department (MDPRD) Director to prepare a report for review at the March 12, 2007, Committee meeting, reflecting which board's departments were recommended to be sunset; including an analysis of the number of vacancies and the number of meetings cancelled

DISCUSSION RE: REVIEWING THE MATTER OF "PRIVATE FUNDS" PROMISED TO THE P.A.C. AND THE COMMITMENT BY THE PEOPLE WHO WERE MEMBERS OF THIS FOUNDATION

Report Received

Report: *Assistant County Attorney Wilfredo Ferrer read the foregoing report into the record.*

Chairman Souto noted this matter was discussed by the County Commission and that members of the Commission raised concern regarding the \$60 million loan with the Civil Bank, during which he voiced concern regarding the County's involvement in this loan.

Mr. Parker Thomson, Chairman of the Trust Board, the Performing Arts Center (PAC), responded to Chairman Souto's concern. He noted this was money that the Foundation had agreed to identify and the Foundation had commitment for pledges from private individuals totaling approximate amount of \$19 million. Mr. Thomson explained that the proposal was that two banks would loan \$16 million, in tax exempt, low interest bonds, which would be paid off with the \$19 million pledges once they had been made. He noted the banks had agreed to approve the \$16 million, provided it was backed by the County.

Assistant County Manager Munoz pointed out that the loan had been approved and the funding had been allocated for construction cost. He explained that the Foundation had the option to pay back the loan directly (with the County's backing), which was explained in the report presented last week. Mr. Munoz also explained that the commitments were linked to a schedule to payback the loan with minimal exposure to the County. He noted this report was in response to the instruction given by members of the Commission last week.

Mr. Thomson clarified that the private sector had received the pledges, but had not cashed out to the extent of \$19 million. He explained that the Foundation would absorb all the cost, but the County's backing was necessary in order for the banks to approve the loan.

Commissioner Moss questioned what happened to prevent the Foundation from cashing out the

pledges timely enough to fulfill the obligation.

Mr. Michael Hardy, President of the PAC, explained that with the exception of a \$10 million gift, all gifts received by the Foundation were traditionally committed on a three to five year pledge basis. He explained that in the past donors had insisted that commitments to pledges be made over a period of time.

Concerning Commissioner Moss' question whether donors were made aware of the hardship this would create for the County, the Foundation and the taxpayers of this community, Mr. Thomson said they were.

Mr. Thomson noted members of the Foundation had tried to persuade each of the donors to accelerate their payments, which had not proven successful in some cases. He said the Foundation would continue to encourage donors to pay off pledges in advance of the obligation data.

Commissioner Moss noted lingering concerns of this nature must be addressed, particularly considering the cost associated with the construction of the PAC. He questioned whether pledges were collectible

Mr. Thomson noted to date, the pledges were 100 percent collectible.

Assistant County Manager Munoz expounded on Mr. Thomson's comments at Commissioner Moss' request. He noted the pledges were legally enforceable pursuant to agreements between the Foundation and the donors, which the County would require as a part of the loan closing documents.

Following further discussion, Chairman Souto clarified his concerns regarding the implication of the County's involvement in this loan.

Commissioner Jordan noted she would echo the concerns of Commissioner Moss regarding the time period for collecting pledges. However, she understands that the County had already invested the resources and this was an effort to ensure that the loan was paid off. She noted she was pleased to hear Mr. Hardy's comments that the Foundation declined a gift due to the lengthy payback period. She suggested Committee members accept the report and move forth.

In response to Chairman Souto's concern regarding the repercussion to the County if the loan was not paid, Assistant County Attorney Munoz explained that the County would be guarantor if the loan was not paid. He noted; however, the Foundation received 100 pledges and the two primary pledges totaled approximately \$16.8 million from the Carnival Center and the Knight Foundation. He reiterated that the contracts were legally enforceable and would be treated as collateral.

Following further explanation by Assistant County Manager Munoz, the Committee accepted the report.

Ms. Vivian Donnell Rodriguez, the Director of the Miami-Dade County Park and Recreation Department (MDPRD), provided Committee members with an update on a series of exhibits being sponsored in parks throughout the County for the past few years, which she noted included the cooperation and participation of local artists. She also noted the department was partnering with the Dade County Youth Fair to feature African Heritage and other performances at the Fair. Ms. Donnell Rodriguez said the department had expanded the neighborhood outreach (both on performances and visual arts) and would continue to do so.

Commissioner Souto explained that the intent was to extend this program to feature performances and art exhibits in as many parks as possible throughout the County, using Columbia as a model.

Commissioner Rolle spoke in support of the proposal and commended Ms. Donnell Rodriguez and her staff for their assistance in making improvements at Gwen Cherry Park before the Super Bowl.

Ms. Rodriguez encouraged the Committee members to visit the Gwen Cherry Park to observe the renovations made to that park.

Additionally, Chairman Souto commended Ms. Donnell Rodriguez and Mr. Santiago for the art exhibits featured in libraries throughout the County

Assistant County Attorney Wilfredo Ferrer read the foregoing proposed resolution into the record.

Mr. Ivan Rodriguez, Director, Miami-Dade Art in Public Places, spoke in support of the foregoing resolution. He noted; however, that the department had submitted some proposed amendments to the existing Art in Public Places ordinance, which would accomplish the same intent as this proposed resolution. He noted the proposed amendments submitted by the department differed from this proposed resolution in that unlike the resolution, the proposed amendments identified a funding source. Mr. Rodriguez asked Committee members to defer this proposed resolution, pending their consideration of the amendments.

Chairman Souto, as sponsor of this proposed resolution, agreed to defer it as requested by Mr. Rodriguez.

Hearing no further questions or comments, Vice Chairman Moss called for a motion to defer.

It was moved by Chairman Souto that the foregoing proposed resolution be deferred, pending the Committee's consideration of proposed amendments to the existing Art in Public Places ordinance, as requested by Mr. Rodriguez.

Vice Chairman Moss asked Mr. Rodriguez to provide a brief overview of the proposed amended ordinance

Mr. Rodriguez clarified that the proposed amendments were currently being reviewed by the

Department Directors and had not been submitted for Committee review. Essentially, the amendments would expand the scope of the Art and Public Places ordinance to increase allocations from infrastructure projects, such as medians, sidewalks, roadways, and bridges to one (1%) percent for new construction, in lieu of one half (1/2%) percent; and to include one (1%) percent of the renovations in excess of \$100,000. As proposed, Mr. Rodriguez noted the proposed amendment would provide greater flexibility to feature art in other public places throughout the County, other than specific buildings that generated the funds.

Commissioner Jordan suggested that Chairman Souto be listed as the sponsor of the proposed amendments.

Following further comments by Chairman Souto, the Committee proceeded to vote.

Assistant County Attorney Wilfredo Ferrer explained that the resolution was deferred to the March 12th Committee meeting.

Assistant County Manager Alex Munoz clarified that he would ensure that this proposed resolution was deferred, pending the Committee's consideration of the amendments.

Commissioner Sorenson noted she had met with a Community Council member earlier today who expressed concern regarding the number of soccer fields and lack of maintenance. She questioned whether the County had a plan in place to maintain soccer fields within the County.

Ms. Donnell Rodriguez explained the soccer fields were in good condition and that a number of new facilities (approximately 26) had been built exclusively for tournaments which were attracting numerous events. She suggested Commissioner Sorenson provide her with the name of this individual (council member) and she would contact him/her and try to resolve their concern.

Chairman Souto commented on the efforts underway to improve soccer fields.

Concerning Commissioner Rolle's request that the Oak Grove Park be included in the 26 soccer field in the pipeline, Ms. Donnell Rodriguez said she would explore this matter and contact Commissioner Rolle directly.

Commissioner Rolle emphasized that the Oak Grove Park was located in area that was highly populated with Haitian Americans and soccer was their primary sport.

Report: *Assistant County Attorney Wilfredo Ferrer read the foregoing proposed resolution into the record.*

Mr. Bill Johnson, Director, Seaport and the Performing Arts Center (PAC) Project, explained that a companion report, Agenda Item, 7F, was one today's agenda, which was the County Manager's Update. He asked that this report be considered along with this proposed resolution.

Hearing no objection, the Committee considered Agenda Item 4A and 7F simultaneously.

Mr. Johnson proceeded to provide the County Manager's update on the status of the PAC. He noted less than three hours ago, the City of Miami issued a final Certificate of Occupancy (CO) for the Concert Hall and a copy was available for review. Additionally, Mr. Johnson noted the punch list for the Concert Hall had been completed, and the final CO on the Ballet Opera House would be issued in 30 days or less. He said he was pleased to report that the project 19.11% CSBE participation goal had been satisfied; and that the contractor, Mr. Jesus Vasquez, was available to address commissioner's questions/concerns. He noted the 10% CSBE Management Goal included on the project was 11%, which exceeded the 10% goal.

Additionally, Mr. Johnson noted the workforce comprised 5,600 employees and that there were not serious injuries or loss of life; that all measures for local employment were exceeded. Mr. Johnson said he PAC would rank as one of the top centers in the world.

Concerning Agenda Item 4A, Mr. Johnson explained that Change Order No. 88 in the amount of \$12.5 million was completely in line with the

outline projections to the BCC in 2005, in terms of the additional money needed.

Commissioner Sorenson questioned whether the funding would be allocated from Convention Development Tax (CDT) funding or the Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) funding for project.

Mr. Johnson noted that a conceptual agreement was negotiated with the previous Manager for the City of Miami; that agreement, in principle, was under negotiation with the currently City Manager, Pedro Hernandez, which was subject to approval by the Miami City Commission serving as the CRA and subject to approval by this Commission, which would provide for an additional 35% of the growth in the increment on that particular CRA through the year of 2027 or the life of the CRA.

Commissioner Sorenson questioned whether this would be an adjustment to the existing contract with the CRA.

Mr. Johnson concurred, noting the City Manager and the Mayor had endorsed this agreement. He also noted the funding would be allocation through County's budgetary appropriation process (the Sunshine Loan); that it was anticipated that funding source would be coming through the Omni CRA from the 35% increment.

Mr. Johnson noted that the Finance Director would be able to provide the dollar amount given to PAC annually and the projections were lucrative.

Concerning Commissioner Sorenson's question regarding baseline figure, Mr. Johnson noted the Finance Director would have to respond to Commissioner Sorenson's question; that considering the existing status, this project had become a catalyst for the Omni CRA and the greater part of the downtown area. Consequently, it appeared that revenue adjustments could be made to maintain this facility and complex.

Commissioner Sorenson noted although she supported efforts to maintain this facility, she wanted to ensure that the neighborhood was maintained as well, particularly considering the CRA was created to address the blighted area. She clarified that she did not have a problem with revenue sharing provided infrastructure and other

improvements were made within the neighborhood.

Mr. Johnson said the previous Executive Director for the particular CRA, Frank Rawlinson, worked closely—and participated on the PAC Construction Committee and attend its monthly meetings, He reminded Committee members that it was the support of the Omni CRA that generated in excess of \$5 million for infrastructure on the Super Block.

Commissioner Sorenson asked Assistant County Manager Alex Munoz to provide her with a report on the Omni Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA); including the baseline figures versus the current figures, the anticipated growth rate, and a proposal on how the remaining dollars would be spent.

Assistant County Manager Alex Munoz noted the information requested by Commissioner Sorenson's would be forwarded to the County Commission along with this proposed resolution,

Mr. Johnson responded to questions from Commissioner Rolle regarding the funding source. He noted the County would back the funding source regardless of whether or not it was the Omni CRA. He also noted the County Manager along with the Finance Director was exploring the feasibility of swapping CDT funding; that the funding sources would either be incremental CRA funding or CDT bed taxes. He said ad valorem property tax would not be used as a funding source.

Commissioner Rolle questioned the probability of using the Omni CRA as a funding source.

Mr. Johnson noted this would be subject to final approval by the City of Miami Commission (serving as the CRA Board) and this County Commission.

Concerning Commissioner Rolle's that the County always falls short in negotiations or cooperative agreements with the City of Miami Mr. Johnson noted the County Manager had negotiated an agreement with City Manager, Pete Hernandez, and the percentage rate increased from 30 to 35%, which was better then the agreement on the table a year ago. Mr. Johnson noted that the agreement had not yet been signed because it had to be approved by both the City and this Commission

first.

Commissioner Moss noted that other areas needed to be redeveloped and it was important that resources be available to redevelop those areas in the future.

In conclusion, Mr. Johnson explained that the incremental funding would be always subject to the approval of this Commission, subject to an annual appropriation.

Hearing no further questions or comments, Chairman Souto motioned that the Committee members proceeded to vote.

Mr. Johnson asked that Chairman Souto ask the County Commission Chairman to waive the Board's rules and procedures and allow this report to be forwarded to the February 20, 2007, County Commission Meeting.

Commissioner Moss emphasized the importance of the County Manager to ensure that the operational aspect of the PAC and individuals with expertise were assigned to manage and monitor that process.

Chairman Souto asked Assistant County Manager Alex Munoz to monitor the PAC continually to identify any potential problems and to submit quarterly reports on the financial status of the PAC for Committee review.

Assistant County Manager Alex Munoz noted the County Manager had instructed staff to create quarterly reports and had been working with the Office of Strategic Business Management to address this issue.

Commissioner Jordan asked that the quarterly reports requested by Chairman Souto be prepared as a comparative analysis based on a three year Performa (projection/analysis over the next three years).

Mr. Munoz stated that he would work with the Cultural Affairs Department Director and members of the Cultural Affairs Council to conduct a comprehensive review, including the increase in cost per square foot, the revenues, and the marketing strategy and targeted audience

Commissioner Moss asked Assistant County Manager Alex Munoz to ensure that the Performing Arts Center remained competitive in

terms of the type of concerts and other performances scheduled.

Additionally, Chairman Souto noted that in terms of the financial status of the PAC, he had discussed with Mr. Springs strategies to promote the center by placing advertisements over graffiti.

Chairman Souto asked staff to prepare the appropriate memorandum requesting that the County Commission's Chairman Bruno A. Barreiro waive the Committee's rules and allow the foregoing proposed resolution to be heard at the February 20, 2007 County Commission meeting.
