RESOLUTION APPROVING ISSUANCE BY THE CITY OF HOMESTEAD OF ONE OR MORE SERIES AND FROM TIME TO TIME OF ITS INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT REVENUE BONDS IN AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$105,000,000 ON BEHALF OF LINCOLN-MARTI COMMUNITY AGENCY, INC. FOR PURPOSES OF SECTION 147(F) OF THE INTERNAL REVENUE CODE OF 1986, AS AMENDED; APPROVING FORM OF AND AUTHORIZING MAYOR OR HIS DESIGNEE TO EXECUTE INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT WITH CITY OF HOMESTEAD; AND AUTHORIZING COUNTY OFFICIALS TO TAKE ALL ACTION AND TO DO ALL THINGS NECESSARY TO ASSIST IN THE ISSUANCE OF THE BONDS

Report: Chairman Barreiro relinquished the Chair to Vice Chairwoman Jordan, and made a motion to adopt the foregoing proposed resolution. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Sosa for discussion.

In response to Commissioner Moss' request for clarification of this resolution, Assistant County Attorney Gerald Heffernan noted approval of the foregoing proposed resolution would authorize the issuance of bonds by the City of Homestead on behalf of Lincoln-Marti to finance a series of schools located in the City of Homestead, and throughout the County. He further noted that Chapter 159 of the Florida Statutes permitted this type of financing through a governmental entity, and the obligation to repay the bonds would fall solely on the borrower, not the City of Homestead.

Assistant County Attorney Heffernan further explained that the Federal Tax Code required the highest governmental body with jurisdiction over the municipalities to approve issuance of the bonds once a public hearing was conducted, or the results of a public hearing were reviewed. Mr. Heffernan noted a public hearing was conducted by the City of Homestead for which no citizen appeared to object to this proposal and the results were substantiated in Agenda Item 11A23 Supplement. Additionally, he noted some of the projects being financed were outside the jurisdiction of the City of Homestead and required an interlocal agreement with the County.

Commissioner Moss noted he was told that the bonds being issued were for the purpose of allowing private investors to acquire the properties.

Assistant County Attorney Heffernan noted he understood the City of Homestead would issue bonds on behalf of a private entity for the acquisition of land to construct schools.

Mr. Gary Johnson, Bond Council for the City of Homestead, appeared before the Board and clarified that this particular transaction involved schools currently in existence and operating that were owned by a for-profit entity to be sold to a not-for-profit entity in order to finance them in this manner. He further noted the schools would be managed by a for-profit entity, Lincoln-Marti, which had operated schools for the last thirty years.

In response to Commissioner Moss' question regarding the name of the not-for profit entity and its principles, Mr. Johnson noted that Lincoln Marti Community Agency, Inc. was the name of the not-for-profit entity whose only principle was its Board of Directors. He also noted the for-profit entity principles would manage the schools, but the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) code required some separation between the for-profit and the not-for profit entities. Mr. Johnson further noted that Lincoln Marti Community Agency Incorporated was an independent 501(C) 3 entity as required under the IRS code.

Mr. Demetrio Perez appeared before the Board and introduced himself as Vice-President of the Board of Directors for Lincoln Marti Community Agency, Inc. He noted other members of the Board of Directors were Dr. Arminda Espinosa, President and Ms. Maria Delsio (phoenetic), Secretary/Treasurer. Mr. Perez clarified this transaction was a bond financing transaction through Wachovia National Bank that would be reviewed by the Fitch Credit Rating Agency. He further noted that the bonds would be sold to institutional investors to acquire the interest in the properties, which would secure the repayment of the bonds. Mr. Perez also

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noted the properties would be appraised by MAI Certified Appraisers and the transactions would be reviewed by the attorneys representing all entities involved.

Assistant County Attorney Heffernan noted that based on the language in the foregoing resolution, he understood this was an acquisition of properties to construct schools and not necessarily an exchange of ownership; and that he did not realize this involved a not-for profit acquiring existing facilities from a for-profit entity. Mr. Heffernan noted, however, that a mechanism existed in the Federal Code that would allow this type of transaction for a for-profit entity to sell the schools to a not-for profit entity and investors to purchase the bonds, which would be secured by the mortgage on the properties until the bonds were paid off.

Mr. Johnson noted the not-for-profit entity, Lincoln Marti Community Agency Inc., would be the property owner and would have no share holders or motivation in this process for profit. He noted this transaction was a mechanism to mortgage these properties to finance the bonds, and the mortgages would serve as security to the bond holders. Additionally, he noted these bonds would not be sold to the general public, but sold to institutional investors; that no investors would hold the real estate but the real estate would be conveyed to the not-for-profit entity.

In response to Commissioner Jordan's request for clarification regarding an implication of construction, Assistant County Attorney Heffernan noted any capital acquisition could be bond-financed, without necessarily requiring construction. He explained that this transaction involved a capital acquisition of existing facilities; that it was an acquisition of a capital asset (a capital expense) that was permitted to be acquired with bond proceeds under the IRS Code and Florida Statutes.

Commissioner Sosa asked whether a similar item adopted on Tuesday's (10/02/07) BCC agenda could be reconsidered for discussion; and asked whether representatives from Barry University were present today to respond to questions.

County Attorney Robert Cuevas cautioned Commission members that the item adopted on Tuesday's agenda could be reconsidered; however, it involved a public hearing, and actions today might require additional procedural steps.

In response to Commissioner Rolle's question as to whether the County Attorney's recommendation remained the same based on the representations made in today's discussion, and whether the County would have any liability as a result of this transaction, Assistant County Attorney Heffernan noted the County Attorney's recommendation was the same, and the County would have no liability.

Commissioner Gimenez asked for clarification as to why the City of Homestead needed the County's approval in this transaction.

Assistant County Attorney Heffernan explained that in 1986, the Federal Government became concerned with the amount of bonds being issued by governmental entities and passed a law requiring approval from the highest governing body for bond financing as an additional step in the process to discourage issuance of these type bonds.

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Commissioner Diaz recalled that these bonds were once called "Pass-thru Municipal Bonds" and had never been denied since he had been in office. He inquired whether these types of bonds had ever been denied.

Assistant County Attorney Heffernan noted he could not recall any being denied since he came to the County Attorney's Office in 1994.

In response to Commissioner Diaz' question whether all parties involved in this particular transaction had met the requirements needed to acquire this type of loan, and if background checks were conducted, Assistant County Heffernan affirmed that the parties involved had met the requirements in this process and the properties were properly advertised with public hearings conducted by the City of Homestead. Additionally, he noted that nothing in the IRS Code or Florida Statutes required a background check, but doing so was a prudent practice of the bond issuer, and the assumption was made that the City of Homestead did that.

Chairman Barreiro spoke in support of this resolution, noting this type of transaction had been done in the past for schools already built that were held by for-profit entities and sold to not-for-profit entities.

Upon conclusion of discussion, the Board proceeded to vote on the foregoing proposed resolution as presented.

Commissioner Jordan noted the foregoing supplemental report was related to a previous report regarding the disposition of the Opa-locka Public Housing development that omitted any mention of the oversight administrator. She asked Ms. Warren to provide an overview of the foregoing supplemental report.

Ms. Kris Warren, Director, Miami-Dade Housing Agency, noted the Opa-locka Public Housing Development was approved in 1999 for rehabilitation homeownership. She noted a time lapse had occurred between the time the application was submitted to HUD and the approval of homeownership for the vacant units. She noted the Agency was supposed to follow-up based on the approval but due to the transition of the Agency and HUD issues, the paperwork was lost in the shuffle. Ms. Warren noted the Agency had issues with moving forward the homeownership portion of the program quicker than they had the capacity to do so and looked to HUD to change the disposition type, and bring in another non-profit entity with a good track record, such as Habitat for Humanity to do the disposition rather than the Agency. She noted that once approved by HUD, the plan would be presented to the Board before any action was taken or any disposition was completed. She noted the HUD Oversight Administrator would oversee this plan, which would be presented to this Board before moving forward.

Commissioner Gimenez noted he understood at Tuesday's BCC meeting, that this program would definitely go to Habitat for Humanity.

Commissioner Jordan clarified that the language in the foregoing supplemental report differed from the language in the report presented at last Tuesday's BCC meeting to reflect only the intent to use Habitat for Humanity because HUD requested the Agency not identify a specific agency in their application to be submitted to HUD. She noted that after conferring with staff, it was suggested the supplemental report only reflect the intent, which remained the same.
