Report: *Assistant County Attorney Bruce Libhaber read the foregoing proposed ordinance into the record.*

The public hearing was opened by Chairman Rolle; however, it was closed after no one appeared in response to Chairman Rolle's call for persons wishing to be heard in connection with the foregoing proposed ordinance.

Assistant County Attorney Libhaber noted that Commissioner Souto, as the original sponsor of this ordinance, had submitted a friendly amendment to the proposed ordinance.

Assistant County Attorney Libhaber read into the record the friendly amendment to add the following language after the last sentence of Section 29-124(a) of the County Code: "Surtax proceeds may be applied to those Patriot Passport fare-free transit services provided since the commencement of the initial pilot program on June 18, 2004."

Assistant County Attorney Libhaber noted that a Patriot Passport pilot program had been active from June 18, 2004 to June 18, 2007, and was funded by Charter County Transit System Surtax proceeds. He further noted that the Patriot Passport program had continued from the expiration date of the pilot program to the current date. Mr. Libhaber clarified that this ordinance

would fill the funding gap between June 18, 2007 and the present for the Patriot Passport program. Assistant County Attorney Libhaber also noted that the proposed ordinance would allow Surtax funds to be applied to reimburse Miami-Dade Transit (MDT) for the cost of the Patriot Passport program.

Commissioner Sorenson noted her concerns that the Surtax funds had been budgeted to address needs other than reimbursing MDT for the cost of the Patriot Passport program.

Ms. Mayra Bustamante, MDT Deputy Director of Administration, noted that MDT had received Surtax funds for FY 06-07 through June 2007. However, she added, MDT had not received Surtax funds for July through September 2007.

Commissioner Sorenson asked whether Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust (CITT) staff had determined that CITT had no need for the Surtax funds, and that, therefore, the Surtax funds could be budgeted to address other needs.

Ms. Bustamante noted that MDT staff annually presented MDT's budget requests to CITT, and that MDT invoiced CITT based on MDT's budget. Ms. Bustamante also noted that the cost of the program for July through September was approximately \$200,000.

In response to Commissioner Sorenson's inquiry as to whether one of her constituents' Golden Passports could be adjusted to indicate that he was a veteran, Ms. Ruby Adams, MDT Assistant Director, Customer Service, noted that MDT would be placing a background on the Golden Passport photograph to indicate whether the individual was a veteran. Ms. Adams further noted that placement of the background would have no fiscal impact.

Commissioner Rolle asked Assistant County Manager Alina Hudak to identify a funding source(s) for future projects other than the Charter County Transit System Surtax proceeds, as proposed in this ordinance.

The Board proceeded to vote on this ordinance as amended.
