Death of Mrs. Jennie F. Reaves who had been critically ill. She died not knowing of the center's naming. Family didn't know.

- September 7, 2007** Pastor Lovett drafts letter for mailing to Commissioners refuting his misrepresentations and misstatements
Note: Letter not completely accurate but Bobbie Mumford accepts it, rather than continued disagreements
- September 13, 2007** Bobbie Mumford meets with District Commissioner Audrey Edmonson requesting Commission action on naming be rescinded. She refuses, but offers to hold community meeting. Mumford originally agrees, but send letter dated 9-17, 2007 declining, in Reaves family does not want a public scene. Comm. later agreed.
- October 11, 2007** Bobbie Mumford meets again with Commissioner Edmonson imploring her to address the matter, legislatively. She refuses, but offers to convene a meeting between the Reaves family and Stewarts. Mumford declines feeling it accomplishes nothing.
- October 29, 2007** Darryl Reaves sent letter to Chairman Bruno Barreiro asking him As Chair of Board requesting the Commission to undo the naming.
- February 6, 2008** Reaves family (B Mumford, Darryl Reaves, Clifford Reaves, Jodi Porter) and community activist Adell Dillard gather for meeting With Commissioner Edmonson and the Stewarts. Commssioner's Staff misunderstood meeting request with the Stewarts, so Stewarts were not informed and did not attend. Commissioner promised to hold community meeting, which Reaves family finally consented.
Note: Only learned of the impending building dedication upon Calling to set up meeting.
- February 7, 2008** Commissioner Edmonson called Bobbie Mumford the night Before; Mumford returned call for Commissioner to say she was holding a community meeting, but moving forward.

in the famed 92nd Division – The Buffalo Soldiers. He was decorated with Three Bronze Stars for his gallant service and bravery.

After serving his country, Jefferson Reaves attended Florida A & M University, Tallahassee, Florida, where he received both a Bachelor of Science degree and later a Master's Degree. While at FAMU, he pledged Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, and was inducted into the Phi Delta Kappa Honor Society.

Rep. Reaves was a devoted member of Antioch Missionary Baptist Church of Brownsville, serving in many capacities, including the choir and the Sunday School department.

Teaching and Coaching

He began his teaching career in Marianna, Florida (North Florida) where he was both a principal and a basketball coach. In Marianna, he met and later married his sweetheart, Jennie Franklin. She would prove to be a driving force in his life and success. In 1957, Jeff Reaves moved his family to Miami, Florida, in the community of Brownsville, where he later founded and served as first President of the Brownsville Neighborhood Civic Association.

Rep. Reaves accomplished over 40 years of service in public education, counseling, and public office. He began teaching at Paul L. Dunbar Elementary in Overtown. There he taught 4th grade math and was the Boy Scouts Master. Later he taught and counseled at Dorsey Junior High and Miami-Northwestern Senior High. He completed his teaching career at Charles R. Drew Elementary. As a public educator, Rep. Reaves developed lifelong relationships and touched the lives of many students.

Public Service

In 1982, Rep. Jefferson Reaves Sr. was elected to serve Liberty City, Brownsville, Allapattah, Wynwood, Melrose and Overtown in the Florida House of Representatives. Upon election, he was assigned by the Dade County School Board as a teacher on special assignment, a position he maintained until retiring in 1986. During his eight years as a member of the Florida House, Rep. Reaves sponsored numerous bills to make life better for the people of Florida and was responsible for millions of dollars in allocations for services in his district. He championed the cause of common people fighting diligently for education dollars, minority contractors, health care, the elderly, drug treatment, and the homeless.

Highlights of his impressive public service record included: his Set-Aside Bill providing that 25 percent of construction contracts with public agencies be set-aside for minorities; his Capital Outlay Bill requiring 10 percent participation of minority businesses with public agencies statewide; his Corrections and Parole Bill assuring that juvenile offenders, prior to release from custody, receive a job skill; his Flee and Felony Bill mandating that police cannot shoot a running felon; and his Civil Conservation Bill providing for special academic training for youths who experience difficulty in securing employment.

In his last legislative session, Rep. Reaves secured over \$3 million in appropriations for Health Care, Youth Development, and various other programs, with funds specifically earmarked for the Overtown Health Center.

"Jeff" as he was fondly known, fell ill during his final session, and as a result was honored by his legislative peers when House Bill 3927 was passed so that the Overtown Health Center was renamed the Jefferson Reaves, Sr. Health Center.

Accomplishments

During his long tenure as a public teacher and later legislator, Rep. Reaves received scores of awards and recognitions, his final award being presented by the Miami-Dade Board of County Commissioners proclaiming July 27, 1990, Jefferson Reaves, Sr. Day. The greatest tribute he received from the people whom he represented so well, was bestowed upon his son, Darryl Reaves, when the voters of District 106 elected him to succeed the senior Reaves.

On November 20, 1990, he returned to Tallahassee one last time where he was honored by his legislative colleagues in a farewell luncheon atop the Capitol. In attendance were both Chambers of the Legislature and Lt. Governor Buddy MacKay. His daughter, Bobbie Mumford, serenaded him at the affair with the song, "I Did It My Way."

A Family Man

With his life's work complete, he spent his remaining days in the company and comfort of his ever-loving wife, Jennie Victoria Franklin Reaves.

Rep. Jeff Reaves was survived by his wife, Jennie; daughter, Bobbie Mumford and her husband, A.B. Mumford; and son, Darryl and his wife, Niki Teresa. His elder son, Jefferson Reaves, Jr. preceded him in death in 1978. Also surviving were five grandchildren: Jodi Mumford, Bonnie Mumford, Alonza Mumford, Tarik Reaves and Cara Reaves. Sisters and Brothers surviving were: Margaret Doyle of Webster, Florida; Rev. Coleman Reaves of Punta Gorda, Florida; John Reaves and Clifford Reaves of Miami; and many brothers-in-law, sisters-in-law, nieces, nephews, cousins, constituents and loving friends.

His Legacy

The work of Jefferson Reaves, Sr. was highly respected and honored by his legislative and community colleagues in the naming of these Miami facilities in his memory: The Jefferson Reaves House" Economic Opportunity Family Health Center, Inc., Residential Drug Treatment Center; Jefferson Reaves Sr. Health Center in Overtown, a division of Jackson Memorial Hospital/Public Health Trust; the Brownsville Park expanded and renamed Jefferson Reaves Park; and the renaming of 54th Street from U.S. 1 Highway/Biscayne Boulevard to Northwest 32nd Avenue, as Jefferson Reaves Sr. Boulevard.

To Everett Stewart, Sr. Center – Ceremony set for March 8, 2008
Based on misinformation presented to the Board in their previous decision

Dear Chairman Barreiro:

I, respectfully, request an opportunity to address the full Board of County Commissioners, as soon as possible hopefully by the March 4, 2008 Board meeting, in regards to rescinding the naming of the park building at the Jefferson Reaves, Sr. Park, a pocket park named in memory of the late State Representative Jefferson Reaves, Sr. who suffered an untimely death yet accomplished so much for his constituents, to Everett Stewart, Sr. Center, for these reasons:

1. The Board voted based on misinformation presented to them by Pastor Larrie M. Lovett, II, who has since refuted his misstatements in a letter to all members of the Commission.
2. Board members stated that the Reaves family be contacted and their desires made known to the Board. The family was never contacted. We much later learned of the legislation.
3. Refusal of the District Commissioner to legislatively resolve this matter.
4. Presently, refusal of the District Commissioner to hold a community meeting to allow the community to speak out on this matter, since she never approached the Reaves family or the community in her pursuits of this legislation. While she did offer to hold a community meeting late last year only after I APPROACHED HER, the family did not want to create a public spectacle. That was not Rep. Reaves' way of doing things. However, now it seems inevitable to restore his dignity. I met with her twice, alone, to no legislative resolve. The family, fully upset, met with her yesterday. She promised to hold a community meeting and promised to adhere to community's desires. She called last night, and speaking with her this morning, said she was not going to hold a community meeting.
5. Pocket parks and their buildings traditionally bear the name of the park.

I trust that you would honor this request. Our proposed speakers would be, among others:

1. Myself, Bobbie Mumford, daughter of the late Jefferson Reaves, Sr.
2. Clifford Reaves, brother of the late Jefferson Reaves, Sr.
3. Bishop Jacob Cohen, Brownsville resident-Overtown Pastor
4. Adell Dillard, Model City Advisory Board-Brownsville resident

Both my brother Darryl Reaves and I had spoken with you earlier regarding this matter, and I believe Darryl sent a followup letter to you. Yet, we tried to resolve it with the District Commissioner. Per my conversation with you on last Wednesday (October 24, 2007), I am providing information on the fraudulent naming of the park building at Jefferson Reaves, Sr. Park, (named in honor of my father who as State Representative met an untimely death in 1991), to Everett Stewart, Sr. Park Building.

We are requesting Commission action to undo the naming of this park building. It is not a community center.

Please refer to the attached letter sent to your office from the pastor of the family's church--Antioch Church which states that he misrepresented the family of Jefferson Reaves, Sr. Also read the discussion when this resolution was first proposed as a renaming, and later naming, from the Commission Subcommittee. Bottom line, we did not know a naming had even occurred until the naming ceremony was about to take place on July 13th of this year (2007). It is all detailed in the attachments.

My sister, Bobbie Mumford, met twice with Commissioner Audrey Edmonson to undo her resolution. She has refused. First, she wanted to hold a community meeting for the community to decide. That's divisive and creates a media mess, which she later agreed with. Then, she wanted the Reaves family and Stewart people to meet on resolving the matter—to accomplish what! No one concedes power.

This is a very small neighborhood park (about the size of a football field, if that) with a park building (to accommodate about 50 to 75 people maximum/park office and bathrooms) and park facilities which were constructed in the immediate aftermath of the park renaming from Brownsville Park to Jefferson Reaves, Sr. Park. The intent of the park building was all a part of the park's renaming at that time in 1991.

Dear Commissioner Edmonson:

I sincerely appreciate your meeting with me on this matter and respectfully request, as I stated at the beginning of our discussion (September 13, 2007), that you offer a subsequent resolution to undo the above action and rightfully place the name of Jefferson Reaves, Sr. on the park building at the Jefferson Reaves, Sr. Park. We are very appreciative of you offering to hold a community meeting to gain community opinion on this matter, but the family does not wish to become involved in a public spectacle on this naming, since no Commission sponsored community meetings were held in any previous resolutions, nor did you even inform the immediate family of your intended actions, even though we live in your District 3.

You are our District Commissioner, and you never contacted us.

These are the reasons we respectfully request that you, as the sponsor of the above resolution, present to your colleagues on the Board of County Commissioners a subsequent resolution to appropriately name the park building at the Jefferson Reaves, Sr. Park Center:

1. You, as our District 3 Commissioner, never informed my mother (Jennie F. Reaves), my father's brother (Clifford Reaves), my brother (Darryl F. Reaves) or myself (Bobbie R. Mumford) of your original Resolution No. 060906 (heard by the Intergovernmental, Recreation & Cultural Affairs Committee on April 11, 2006 as a 'Renaming of the Center') or your Resolution No. R-1162-06 (approved by the Board of County Commissioners on October 10, 2006 as a 'Naming'), even though the April 11, 2006 clearly stated that the family should be contacted.
2. You presented these Resolutions to the Board in the context of erroneous information and misrepresentations provided by (a) our Pastor Larrie M. Lovett, II who lied before the April 11, 2006 Board Committee in testifying that the Reaves family was supportive of the 'Renaming of the Center' and/or 'Naming of

the Center' and (b) a letter from Martha P. Anderson, President of the Brownsville Neighborhood Civic Association, which stated, "Mr. Stewart fought night and day to bring this multipurpose recreational facility for Jefferson Reaves, Sr. Park."

3. Mr. Everett Stewart, Sr. may have been a member of the Association at that time (early 90's), but was not at the forefront of the Association and the Association's president was Mr. Lucius Crawford. Mr. Stewart had nothing to do with the original development of the Jefferson Reaves, Sr. Park.
4. Your misinformed statement to the Intergovernmental, Recreation & Cultural Affairs Committee on September 20, 2006 of your support for the Resolution R-1162-06, since 'Mr. Stewart was instrumental in implementing the Brownsville Neighborhood Civic Association and in building the Civic Center...' None of this is truthful information. Mr. Stewart may have attended some early meetings, but the Association was founded by the late State Rep. Jefferson Reaves, Sr. and the late Mr. Willie B. Smith.
5. The building is not a community center. It is a park building which was erected along with recreational facilities being provided for the park, in the immediate aftermath of renaming the park to Jefferson Reaves, Sr. Park from Brownsville Park (May 1991).
6. Pastor Larrie M. Lovett, II has recently sent a letter to all members of the Board of County Commissioners stating that he misrepresented the Reaves family before the Board's Committee to which he did not officially return to provide factual information, even though the Committee asked him to, setting the tone for misinformation which was never clarified. Even you on the recorded Board Committee minutes of April 11, 2006, stated that 'you couldn't believe the Reaves' family pastor would stand before you (the Committee) and lie.' Pastor Lovett did lie.
7. Mrs. Jennie F. Reaves, wife of the late State Rep. Jefferson Reaves, Sr., did not sign a petition in support of the center's naming. Someone wrote in her name with an incorrect phone number on what appeared to be a meeting attendance sheet. Mrs. Reaves died on December 22, 2006.
8. The so-called petitions were not petitions, at all, but several pages of meeting attendance sheets of the Brownsville Neighborhood Civic Association, I assume, as they had no headings or petition language. I understand they were attached to a cover letter from Mrs. Martha Anderson.
9. The park building at Jefferson Reaves, Sr. Park is akin to the park building at the nearby Marva Bannerman Park building in Brownsville, whereby the building is a part of the park facility. It is not separately named, and should not be.

10. After my conversation with Pastor Lovett on the weekend following April 11, 2006 (when he appeared before the Board Committee) and my mother's conversation with him at church sometime in May 2006 that we did not support the naming, we thought the matter was resolved.
11. The family only learned of this naming the day before an official County Naming Ceremony was to be held, July 13, 2007.

We humbly submit our request to you and the entire Board of County Commissioners to restore the dignity to the late State Rep. Jefferson Reaves, Sr. Please refer to attached information which summarizes our concerns in more detail.

Dear Deacon Preston and Deacon Cowart:

We sincerely regret presenting this correspondence to you on First Sunday, but we ask you to please consider our request at upcoming Church Conference, September 5, 2007.

Reaves Family Asks for Church's Support

We respectfully ask Antioch Missionary Baptist Church of Brownsville to support the family of the late State Representative Jefferson Reaves, Sr. and the late Church Mother Jennie F. Reaves (Mother Reaves), both devout members of Antioch, in reversing the Miami-Dade Board of County Commissioners' (Commission) Resolution R-1162-06 naming the community center within Jefferson Reaves, Sr. Park the "Everett Stewart, Sr. Community Center" (October 10, 2006).

With regard to this matter, we humbly request the church's support in undoing the great wrong carried out and perpetrated by Pastor Larrie M. Lovett II through his fraudulent misrepresentations to the Board of County Commissioners. His deceit and subsequent failure to correct his misrepresentations, largely served as the basis for the naming/renaming of the Center at Jefferson Reaves, Sr. Park for Everett Stewart, Sr.

As written in a correspondence from Bobbie Mumford to Pastor Lovett dated August 16, 2007: 15 AM

"State Rep. Jefferson Reaves Sr. was truly a public servant who worked until his death fighting for the people of his community and the state of Florida. He brought millions of dollars in facilities, services and programs to his District. But, he never sought recognition, nor has his family on his behalf. However, we will not allow his name and legacy to be unrightfully stripped away, due to self-serving, underhanded efforts of a few."

We ask Antioch members for a Letter of Support addressed to the Miami-Dade Board of County Commissioners to rightfully place the name of Jefferson Reaves, Sr. on the park building. The park building is part of the park named after Jefferson Reaves, Sr. in 1991.

We humbly request the church's involvement and support, *along with* Pastor Lovett to take corrective action in the letter mentioned above (Attachment A). To date, Pastor Lovett has neither responded in writing to Bobbie Mumford's letter nor taken the corrective action requested.

Regrettably, the record of Rev. Lovett's involvement is very clear and substantiated in the meeting minutes of the County Commission (Attachment B). His dishonesty is documented.

1. For nearly three years, Pastor Lovett was a lead party/organizer in the effort to rename (name) the park building at Jefferson Reaves, Sr. Park after Everett Stewart, Sr.
2. Organizers circulated a list which they called a 'petition' in support of the renaming and claimed, as widely reported in the media, that Mother Reaves signed it (Attachment C).
3. Mother Reaves' name was forged. Someone printed Mother Reaves' name on the list, as it appears they did for others. The list includes some three dozen names.
4. In spite of the fact that Pastor Lovett never approached us to discuss this or ask our position, Pastor Lovett, Mrs. Andrea Lovett and Darryl Lovett names were all listed, using the church as their address.
5. Still, never speaking with Mother Reaves or our family about this, Pastor Lovett went before the County Commission and told them that the Reaves family supported the naming.
6. When multiple members of the Commission expressed serious reservation and hesitation about the renaming/naming, Pastor Lovett again assured them that the Reaves family supported this.
7. When our family happened to hear about Pastor Lovett's misrepresentations, Mother Reaves and Bobbie Mumford both approached him in April/May 2006 to inform him that the family did not support this action. They believed he resolved the matter.
8. The Commission asked Pastor Lovett to come back before them to confirm the support of the Reaves family.
9. Even though at this time he specifically had been told that we were not in support, he failed to go back before the Commission and correct his earlier statements.
10. The Commission, relying largely on and believing Pastor Lovett's statements regarding the Reaves family support, with some hesitation ultimately voted to approve the naming.
11. Pastor Lovett still said nothing to us about this. Our family first learned that this had moved forward on the eve of a renaming/naming ceremony planned for July 14, 2007.
12. Even though members of our family have been in countless one-on-one conversations with Pastor Lovett, from the time we spoke with him in April 2006 until July 13, 2007 (over a year), we were totally unaware that any of this was happening.

It pains our family greatly to use such harsh terms like deceit, fraudulent misrepresentations, dishonesty and underhanded in describing the actions of our Pastor. But the record is clear.

His deceit is evidenced in his own words to the County Commission and failure to correct them, then or even now. His underhandedness is evidenced in his refusal to even approach our family and discuss this for nearly three years.

How can a pastor tell a lie, know it's a lie and not correct it?

How can Pastor Lovett look Mother Reaves and our family in the face Sunday after Sunday and never said a mumbling word about what he was doing?

We trusted this "Man of God" and it is very hurtful when Pastor Lovett, whom we have always treated with the highest respect, would engage in such betrayal and flagrant deceit.

Troubling

As troubling as this is for our family, we remain prayerful that this is not a part of a pattern of behavior by Pastor Lovett which may be at the root of our dwindling membership and half-empty pews.

Historically, Antioch is a church of families who believe in this institution and hold our spiritual leaders in high regard. We trust and believe in our pastor as one whom God has "called."

As such, our family has no intention of being run off from Antioch, a church that our family has been members of for 48 years, since 1959. But other families and individuals, many who were deeply rooted at Antioch, have been run off.

When Rev. J.W. Stepherson turned over the pastorage of our great church to Rev. Lovett, our pews were filled, our ministries were vibrant and members fulfilled, and our financial coffers were full.

Perhaps, there are a lot of other issues which need to be addressed with regard to the pastoral leadership, finances and direction of Antioch. There are certain facts that we should not avoid if we want to ensure the longevity of our church. No man should be allowed to run our church – God's church – into the ground, especially one who is not a member of Antioch, and yet not even then.

Pastor Lovett changed his membership from Antioch Missionary Baptist Church of Brownsville to Sweet Home Missionary Baptist Church in Perrine. New pastors are mentored everyday by established pastors, but it does not require them to change their membership.

We Need Church's Help

However, at this point, we are humbly asking the church to help the Reaves family and community undo the wrong which has been done against the honor and dignity of the late State Rep. Jefferson Reaves, Sr. and his wife, the late Church Mother Jennie F. Reaves.

Jefferson Reaves was an everyday, commonplace man. He didn't seek publicity or notoriety. However, in as much as honors have been bestowed upon him (in death) for the programs, services, progressive legislation and millions of dollars he brought to his District and Florida residents, we cannot idly witness its unraveling.

But we need the help of every member of Antioch Missionary Baptist Church of Brownsville. Your prompt and considerate attention is gratefully requested and needed.

FURTHER BACKGROUND ON CONCERNS MENTIONED:

Pastor Larrie M. Lovett, II Misrepresented Reaves Family and Church

"Reverend Larrie M. Lovett, Antioch Missionary Baptist Church, 2799 Northwest 46 Street appeared before the Committee in support of the foregoing resolution." – giving his name, church name and church address.

(Commission Committee minutes of April 11, 2006—see attached)

Pastor Larrie M. Lovett, II (Pastor Lovett) lied to the Commission's Intergovernmental, Recreation & Cultural Affairs Committee (Committee) on the naming, "Reverend Lovett who reassured Commissioners that the Reaves Family supported the renaming of the building...In response to Commissioner (Javier) Souto's concern (in opposition to the naming), Pastor Lovett clarified that the name of the Park would remain 'Jefferson Reaves.' He explained that as proposed, the Community Center building existing within the park would be renamed in honor of Mr. Stewart."

Pastor Lovett Never Reported back to Commission Committee, As they asked

The Commission's Committee asked Pastor Lovett to reappear before the Committee (Commission) to inform them of the Reaves family desires. He never reported back to Committee, according to Commission minutes.

"Commissioner Souto...noted he and Mr. Reaves served in the Florida Legislature together and he was uncomfortable with changing the facilities named in his honor. Commissioner Souto noted he would like to have spoken with one of the Reaves Family members before voting on this proposed resolution. Commissioner (Natacha) Seijas noted, for the record, that she had consistently not supported the naming of County facilities and roadways in honor of people who were alive, and that she would not support this proposed resolution as well. Commissioner Seijas concurred with Commissioner Souto that she would like to hear from the Reaves Family before voting on this proposal. Commissioner (Dennis) Moss noted that he had also had consistently not supported the renaming of County facilities and roadways in honor of people while they were not alive and he would not support this proposal."

“Commissioner (Sally) Heyman asked Reverend Lovett to contact the Reaves Family and ensure that Commissioner Souto’s concern was addressed before this resolution was considered by the County Commission.”

“Commissioner (Carlos) Gimenez...was opposed to un-naming facilities named in honor of an individual and renaming them in honor of another individual.”

(From Commission Committee Minutes of April 11, 2006)

Mother Reaves and Bobbie Mumford Told Pastor, They Did Not Support Naming

Mother Reaves and daughter, Bobbie Mumford, both approached and told Pastor Lovett they did not support naming, after they learned of his lies before the Commission from someone else (April-May 2006). He never approached the Reaves Family about any of this prior to the April 11, 2006 Commission meeting up until the family heard of a naming ceremony on July 13, 2007, over one year later.

Mother Reaves Did Not Sign Petition – Name Forged

Mother Reaves never signed her name/signature on a petition in support of the naming. Someone wrote in her name, address and phone number on a form.

County Funded Jefferson Reaves Park and Park Building, Intentioned the Same

The Park House building is not a community center. County funding for the park and park recreational facilities were provided following Commission Resolution of May 21, 1991 to rename Brownsville Park, Jefferson Reaves, Sr. Park, after his untimely death February 9, 1991.

The building and development of Jefferson Reaves Park were one in the same. Unlike the Carrie P. Meek Center at Hadley Park, built decades after the Hadley Park designation.

The building at Olinda Park was later named, but Olinda is a county subdivision name, not the name of an individual who has made significant contributions to a community.

The park building at Marva Bannerman Park near Brownsville Middle School and the park building at Jefferson Reaves, Sr. Park are the same type facilities.

Name new Park Pavilion in Honor of Everett Stewart, Sr.

We strongly recommend naming the new Pavilion with basketball courts and tot lot in honor of Mr. Stewart, since these are park facilities accomplished under his direct leadership of the Brownsville Association, completed in 2006.

Mr. Stewart is a fine gentleman and community worker, as are so many outstanding community people. He did not ‘fight for the multipurpose recreational facility’ at the park. He was not ‘instrumental in implementing the Brownsville Neighborhood Civic Association,’ misinformation which we have found on correspondences involving the Commission. The Association was founded by Jefferson Reaves, Sr. and the late Mr. Willie “Tully” Smith of First Baptist Church of Brownsville.

Pastor Lovett Deceives Reaves Family, We Did Not Know

After Mother Reaves and Bobbie Mumford spoke with Pastor Lovett, in whom we had total confidence, that we were not in support of the naming, we believed that he had resolved the matter with the Commission.

We did not know that the park building had been named for Everett Stewart until July 13, 2007 when Darryl Reaves was shown a flyer by a neighbor inviting residents to the Everett Stewart Community Center Ceremony on July 14, 2007.

We did not know that the Commission had passed a resolution (October 10, 2006) on the naming until after Bobbie Mumford was able to research County Commission public records and learn much of Pastor Lovett's lies and deceit, following her hospital release (hospitalized July 9-July 21, 2007).

Darryl Reaves saw Rev. Carlis Jackson and Trustee Mack Jackson at the Jefferson Reaves Park on that July 14, 2007 for the ceremony. Pastor Lovett also told Bobbie Mumford that Mack Jackson stated that Mother Reaves supported the building naming.

Pastor Lovett Betrayed Reaves Family While Mother Reaves Deathly Ill

For well over a year (prior to April 11, 2006-July 13, 2007), Pastor Lovett looked in our faces nearly every week, talked with us, shook our hands, worked on church projects with us, and funeralized Mother Reaves while working against his faithful church members.

We remember his comment to Darryl and Bobbie in planning funeral program about why weren't we inviting Commissioner Javier Souto (who opposed Stewart building name) to speak at Mother Reaves' funeral, since he was such a good family friend.

While we were attending to our mother's health, Pastor Lovett was betraying the Reaves family. The park building was named Everett Stewart, Sr. Community Center on October 10, 2006. Mother Reaves died December 22, 2006

Dear Pastor Lovett:

This is to respectfully request that you immediately submit a Letter of Request to all members of the Miami-Dade Board of County Commissioners, as well as its Intergovernmental, Recreation & Cultural Affairs Committee inclusive of the Board, asking that the name of Jefferson Reaves Sr. be rightfully placed on the Park House building at the Jefferson Reaves Sr. Park and undo the Everett Stewart Sr. naming.

This course of action is requested in that you spoke before the Intergovernmental, Recreation & Cultural Affairs Committee on April 11, 2006, and misrepresented factual information regarding the family of the late Jefferson Reaves Sr. by supporting a Resolution: Renaming the Jefferson Reaves Sr. Park Community Center to the "Everett Stewart Sr. Community Center." In your remarks to the Board's Committee, you said it was a naming of a community center, not a renaming, but the resolution read "Renaming."

The ultimate decision of the Miami-Dade Board of County Commissioners in October 2006 was largely predicated on your initial misrepresentations and false statements, as our church pastor.

Specifically, the reasons I am asking you to take this corrective action are:

1. As pastor of Antioch Missionary Baptist Church of Brownsville and pastor for the late Mrs. Jennie F. Reaves—Mother of the Church (at that time) and wife of the late Jefferson Reaves Sr., you "reassured Commissioners that the Reaves family supported the renaming (naming) of the building," when in fact Mrs. Jennie F. Reaves and her daughter, myself—Bobbie Mumford, nor son—Darryl Reaves, had no knowledge of this effort taken then and/or leading up to April 11, 2006. Nor did we support this undertaking. I immediately brought this to your attention, upon learning of your actions.

2. Your original appearance before the Board's Recreation Committee led to a subsequent Resolution: Naming the Community Center within Jefferson Reaves Sr. Park the "Everett Stewart, Sr. Community Center," passed by the Miami-Dade Board of County Commissioners at its October 10, 2006 meeting, after being approved and forwarded from the Board's Intergovernmental, Recreation & Cultural Affairs Committee on September 20, 2006.
3. When I telephoned and spoke with you a couple days following the presentation that you made before the Board's Intergovernmental, Recreation & Cultural Affairs Committee (since a viewer of the April 11, 2006 proceedings contacted me on your involvement), I directly told you that neither myself nor my mother, Mrs. Jennie F. Reaves, had any knowledge of this "renaming" (or naming as you prefer to say) effort. Note: you *never volunteered* any information to me (or my mother) on this matter prior to April 11, 2006 up until the date of this letter August 15, 2007, even though I am in weekly church services (unless ill or out-of-town and have worked with you on church projects—well over one year.
4. Upon my call to you, you shared with me that Mack Jackson (a Trustee in our church) told you that Mrs. Reaves had signed a petition and approved "renaming" the Jefferson Reaves Sr. Center.
5. My mother, Mrs. Reaves, after church services in either April or May 2006²⁰⁰⁶ after I made her aware of your efforts, also told you that she was not aware of the "Renaming" (Naming) nor did she approve of it.
6. My mother, Mrs. Reaves, never signed a petition. Her name was handwritten by someone on a form, other than herself. Her signature never appeared.
7. You led and participated in an underhanded effort to undermine the family of the late Jefferson Reaves Sr. and his family members of Antioch of Brownsville, namely Church Mother—Mrs. Jennie F. Reaves, her daughter—Bobbie Mumford, her son—Darryl F. Reaves, son-in-law—Alonzo B. Mumford, granddaughter—Jodi M. Porter and her children—Brittany Porter, Craig Michael Porter and Justin Porter, throughout this effort. This was started at a time when Mrs. Reaves was active in the church and she, herself, informed you that she was not in support of this effort. Yet you continued to misrepresent her to County officials while she was active in the church and throughout her terminal illness. Further, you selectively chose not to be truthful and honest with us. Note: Mrs. Reaves died on December 22, 2006.

8. The living family of Jefferson Reaves Sr. only learned of the "Naming of the Everett Stewart, Sr. Community Center" and the ceremony one day before it was to occur on July 14, 2007. We learned about the naming and ceremony from flyers distributed in the Brownsville community, one day before on July 13, 2007.
9. I didn't know about the "naming" or the ceremony. My brother, Darryl Reaves, didn't know about any of this. Yet, Mr. Mack Jackson and Rev. Carlis Jackson, both of Antioch of Brownsville, showed up for the ceremony at the Jefferson Reaves Sr. Park, on July 14, 2007.
10. The building at Jefferson Reaves Sr. Park is a Park House, not a community center. The funds were provided for the design and construction of the Park House, at or about the same time that the park was developed and renovated, into a functioning park facility, following the renaming of the Brownsville Park in honor and memory of the untiring works of Jefferson Reaves Sr., following his untimely death on February 9, 1991.

State Rep. Jefferson Reaves Sr. was truly a public servant who worked until his death fighting for the people of his community and the state of Florida. He brought millions of dollars in facilities, services and programs to his District. But, he never sought recognition, nor has his family on his behalf. However, we will not allow his name and legacy to be unrightfully stripped away, due to self-serving, underhanded efforts of a few.

I personally find it unconscionable that my pastor would participate in such underhanded dealings. I would greatly appreciate your prompt action to rectify this situation in which you were a lead party from the very beginning. I realize that August is vacation month for the Miami-Dade Board of County Commissioners. However, I trust that you will forward your correspondence to all of the Board members within the next two weeks from receipt of this letter which should be on or about August 16, 2007. With your letters to Commissioners in place and upon their return from vacation, I am sure this will receive their utmost attention. Please copy me on correspondences forwarded to Board members. Thank you very much.




Tower build-to-line from streets and drives: minimum 10' when colonnade is provided in all urban centers; minimum 25' in Metropolitan Urban Centers when colonnade is not provided, minimum 20' in Community Urban Centers when colonnade is not provided. The build-to-line setback shall be hard surfaced and finished to match the adjoining sidewalk when a colonnade is not provided.

Penthouse build-to-line from streets and drives: for up to a minimum of 50% of the building frontage, minimum 20' when colonnade is provided in all urban centers; minimum 35' in Metropolitan Urban Centers when colonnade is not provided, minimum 30' in Community Urban Centers when colonnade is not provided. The build-to-line setback shall be hard surfaced and finished to match the adjoining sidewalk when a colonnade is not provided.

When non residential uses are located across the street from single family zoned property, the build-to-line shall be 30' for the pedestal, except 20' if colonnade is provided, a minimum of 40' for the tower and a minimum of 50' for the penthouse.

(b) Interior side: 0' in all urban centers, except 30' minimum for all portions of the building including parking structures when adjacent to single family residential zoned districts.

(c) Rear side: 0' minimum in all urban centers including the metrorail station guideway, except 30' minimum for all portions of the building including parking structures when adjacent to single family residential zoned districts

(3) Floor Area Ratio (f.a.r.). The floor area ratio for Rapid Transit Zone station development shall be as follows:

(a) Community Urban Centers (; Civic Center Station; Coconut Grove Station; Culmer Station; the undeveloped portion of Douglas Road Station) shall have a minimum f.a.r. of 1.5.

(4) Density. The maximum densities for Rapid Transit Zone station development shall be as follows:

(a) Metropolitan Urban Centers: 250 units per net acre.

(b) Community Urban Centers: 125 units per net acre.

A 25% density bonus above the listed maximum urban center densities is permitted for residential rapid transit developments being designed for and having registered for certification for a Gold certification rating from LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) or a similar organization accredited by the U.S. Green Building Council (USGBC). Residential developments being designed and having registered for certification for a Silver certification rating from LEED or a similar organization accredited by the U.S. Green Building Council (USGC) is permitted a density bonus of 12.5% above the listed maximum urban center densities.

(5) Building Heights. The maximum building heights for all Rapid Transit Zone station development shall be as follows:

(a) Metropolitan Urban Centers: 25 stories (maximum – 7 stories pedestal, 13 stories tower, 5 stories penthouse)

(b) Community Urban Centers: 15 stories (maximum – 5 stories pedestal, 8 stories tower, 2 stories penthouse)

(c) Coconut Grove Station: 19 stories, maximum height 250' (pedestal maximum 9 stories, balance for the tower)
