## ***Miami-Dade County Impact Fee Report***

### ***Introduction***

Impact Fees offset Miami-Dade County's cost of providing adequate roadway systems and neighborhood parks as well as police and fire protective services to meet new or expanding housing and commercial development activity. County Fee Ordinances (Miami-Dade Code Sections 33-E, 33-H, 33-I and 33-J) sets forth the mechanisms for collecting annual impact fees from the developers expanding housing and commercial areas. The County is responsible for assessing and collecting all Countywide Roadway and School impact fees, including those derived from Unincorporated Municipal Services Areas (UMSA) and municipal areas. Miami-Dade Fire-Rescue's impact fees are assessed and collected by the County for UMSA and all municipalities with the exception of incorporated areas that have their own fire departments. Also, Miami-Dade Park and Recreation Department (MDPR) and Miami-Dade Police Department (MDPD) impact fees are assessed and collected for unincorporated areas with the exception of municipalities that have their own police and parks departments. It should be noted that many municipalities have their own impact fee requirements unrelated to the County; these fees need to be considered when planning for future development.

All School impact fees are assessed and collected by the County and remitted quarterly to Miami-Dade County Public Schools system which administers the School Impact Fee Capital Improvement Program.

### ***Methodology for Rate Determination***

MDFR, MDPR and MDPD impact fees are based on a fee per unit or square footage. The cost per unit is obtained through an analysis involving, but not limited to, identification of trends, development patterns for areas of concern, demographics, community needs, community council meetings, service area response time, space availability, population density, distance to existing land use, roadways, water and wastewater lines. The roadway impact fee is based on the capital cost of roadway improvements needed to meet the increase in transportation capacity resulting from proposed development activity. The roadway impact fee formula takes into account such items as total trips generated by a unit of development, roadway capacity, new lane miles and construction costs per lane mile.

***Collection and Utilization of Impact Fees***

The Miami-Dade County Planning and Zoning Department (DP&Z) collects all applicable impact fees imposed by the County via the building-structural permitting process. Monies are deposited into an interest bearing account established by impact fee type, within specific benefit districts established by Ordinances. There are nine distinct benefit districts for Roadway impact fees, four for Fire-Rescue, three for Police and three for Park and Recreation. These benefit districts are not geographically related to County Commission Districts. Monies collected and the associated interest income, are utilized for allowable expenditures in the benefit district from which the revenues are derived, within the limits set forth by the Impact Fee Ordinances, established beginning in 1989, which also impose a six year time limit for funds to be utilized. The Code of Miami-Dade County pertaining to impact fees was been amended for MDPD (in 2006), MDPR (in 2006) and MDFR (in 2007) to update the fee schedules to reflect today's costs and ensure that new areas of development support the same, or improved, level of service to the residents.

Impact fees collected to date totaled \$526 million, expenditures \$381 million and commitments to ongoing and planned projects were \$37 million as of September 30, 2007, resulting in net available funds of \$107 million. Specifically, during fiscal year 2007, impact fees funded 222 projects totaling \$60.8 million, throughout the designated benefit districts as follows:

Public Works Department

The Public Works Department (PWD) utilizes impact fee revenues to support countywide constant infrastructure demands and to provide a safe and efficient system of roads and bridges required to improve traffic flow and relieve congestion. Projects are selected and developed with the participation and cooperation of citizens, municipalities, and local planning organizations to ensure that improvement projects both enhance the capacities of arterial corridors, and are tailored to meet the specific needs of the communities in which they are located. Each district program includes five distinct improvement categories: Road and Bridge Projects, Traffic Control Devices, Traffic Operations Projects to Increase Capacity and Safety (TOPICS), Resurfacing, and Right-of-Way Acquisition. During fiscal year 2007, the department expended \$44.6 million to plan, construct or complete 72 impact fee funded projects.

Fire Rescue Department

MFRD utilizes impact fee revenues to acquire equipment and build stations and facilities required to fulfill the mission of protecting people, property, and the environment by providing responsive professional and humanitarian fire rescue services essential to public health, safety, and well-being. Impact fee funding allowed for upgrading services from Basic Life Support (BLS) to Advanced Life Support (ALS) and implementation of additional services, including four (4) new completed stations. During fiscal year 2007, the department expended \$6.7 million to plan, construct or complete 56 impact fee funded projects.

Police Department

MDPD utilizes impact fee revenues to enhance public and police officers' safety, decrease response time and improve the flow of information among operational and investigative units. The purchase and installation of Mobile Computing Units (MCU) in police vehicles, allows officers instant access to critical data derived from the CAD system, which includes citizen requests for emergency and routine calls for service, as well as information on stolen vehicles, wanted persons, stolen property and driver licenses. MCU's afford the department the ability to dispatch the closest available unit to the incident while maximizing the use of resources by

streamlining collection, storage, retrieval and analysis of crucial police data. During fiscal year 2007, the department did not expend any impact fees revenues.

Park and Recreation Department


MPRD utilizes impact fee revenue to ensure that local recreation open space is retained within established level of service measures, currently 2.75 acres per 1,000 residents or higher; to provide sufficient land and facilities to meet the recreational demands of new and existing residents in unincorporated areas. Projects are divided into two categories: acquisition of parkland and development of park facilities. Areas where parkland measures are below the established level of service are allocated funds for land purchase or expansion of existing parks, while areas where facility measures are below the established level of service are allocated funds for basic improvement of the site and landscaping or for construction of programmable buildings, courts and fields. During fiscal year 2007, the department expended \$6.9 million to plan, construct or complete 94 impact fee funded projects.

A Summary of Impact Fee Revenue and Expenditures as of September 30, 2007 depicting impact fee activity since inception is included as part of this report. Also included are graphic representations of projects by impact fee benefit district as well as detailed listings of projects by department for fiscal year 2007, illustrating the status and the impact fee funds expended and budgeted through completion for the particular projects. Lastly, a map showing the specific impact fee benefit district boundaries is included at the end of each department section.



For Fiscal Year 2006-2007**





Public Works Department

The Public Works Department utilizes impact fee revenues to support countywide constant infrastructure demands and to provide a safe and efficient system of roads and bridges required to improve traffic flow and relieve congestion. Projects are selected and developed with the participation and cooperation of citizens, municipalities, and local planning organizations to ensure that improvement projects both enhance the capacities of arterial corridors, and are tailored to meet the specific needs of the communities in which they are located. Each district program includes five distinct improvement categories: Road and Bridge Projects, Traffic Control Devices, Traffic Operations Projects to Increase Capacity and Safety (TOPICS), Resurfacing, and Right-of-Way Acquisition. During fiscal year 2006, the department expended \$20.8 million to plan, construct or complete 61 impact fee funded projects.

Fire Rescue Department

The Miami-Dade Fire Rescue Department utilizes impact fee revenues to acquire equipment and build stations and facilities required to fulfill the mission of protecting people, property, and the environment by providing responsive professional and humanitarian fire rescue services essential to public health, safety, and well-being. Impact fee funding allowed for upgrading services to Advanced Life Support (ALS) as well as additional services, including two (2) new completed stations. During fiscal year 2006, the department expended \$6.9 million to plan, construct or complete 55 impact fee funded projects.

Police Department

The Miami-Dade Police Department utilizes impact fee revenues to enhance public and police officers' safety, decrease response time and improve the flow of information among operational and investigative units. In fiscal year 2006, the benefit districts for Police Impact Fees were rezoned. Impact fee funding allowed for the completion of the Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) system that will benefit all county wide districts and its officers. As such, during fiscal year 2006, the department expended \$6.7 million to plan, construct or complete 5 impact fee funded projects.

Park and Recreation Department


The Park and Recreation Department utilizes impact fee revenue to ensure that local recreation open space is retained within established level of service measures, currently 2.75 acres per 1,000 residents or higher; to provide sufficient land and facilities to meet the recreational demands of new and existing residents in unincorporated areas. Projects are divided into two categories: acquisition of parkland and development of park facilities. Areas where parkland measures are below the established level of service are allocated funds for land purchase or expansion of existing parks, while areas where facility measures are below the established level of service are allocated funds for basic improvement of the site and landscaping or for construction of programmable buildings, courts and fields. During fiscal year 2006, the department expended \$3.9 million to plan, construct or complete 93 impact fee funded projects.

A Summary of Impact Fee Revenue and Expenditures as of September 30, 2006 depicting impact fee activity since inception is included as part of this report. Also included are graphic representations of projects by impact fee benefit district as well as detailed listings of projects by department for fiscal year 2006, illustrating the status and the impact fee funds expended and budgeted through completion for the particular projects.


