State-Funded Mentoring Program Performance Mixed; Take Stock and Best Buddies Do Well

Background

The state provides funding to support six mentoring programs that are intended to help students enhance their social, life, and/or academic skills. As shown in Exhibit 1, the Legislature appropriated the six programs approximately \$10 million from state and federal sources for Fiscal Year 2010-11.¹ Of this amount, \$9.7 million was from general revenue and the remaining \$320,000 was from federal stimulus funds. The Legislature also appropriated over \$5 million to the Florida Department of Education to award as grants to numerous entities that provide mentoring services; these grant recipients, not included in this review, are described in Appendix A.²

¹The \$10 million does not include all funding in special categories of Education appropriations, such as the \$2.6 million for the Black Male Explorers, Girl Scouts of Florida, Learning for Life, and the Project to Advance School Success.

at a glance

The Legislature appropriated \$10 million for Fiscal Year 2010-11 to six mentoring programs intended to help K-12 students enhance their social, life, and/or academic skills. These programs served over 28,000 students during the past year. Although there is some overlap, the programs generally vary in structure, portion of budget supported by state appropriations, and primary focus.

Students who participated in two programs (Best Buddies and Take Stock in Children) outperformed comparison groups of similar students in three or more performance areas by achieving better academic and behavioral outcomes, such as reading at grade level and having few disciplinary incidents. Results for the remaining programs were mixed, with students exceeding the performance of peers in some areas but performing comparably or lower in other areas.

Scope

As directed by the Legislature, OPAGA examined six state-supported mentoring programs for K-12 students. This report describes the variation among programs and analyzes participants' performance outcomes compared to those of students with similar characteristics. The programs reviewed were Best Buddies, Bigs in Schools (Big Brothers Big

administrators tended to select students who have unstable home environments, this could result in participants being more at risk of not meeting performance standards. However, this higher level of risk would not be captured in existing demographic data.

Participants in two mentoring programs outperformed their peers in multiple areas and did not fall behind for any outcomes

Students in Take Stock in Children surpassed similar students in all of the performance areas we examined. Outcomes for participants in Best Buddies exceeded those of their peers in three areas.

Students in Take Stock in Children were above their peers in all seven performance areas we examined. Take Stock in Children focuses on encouraging students to finish high school and pursue a college education. A key component of the program is that it provides participants with a pre-paid scholarship designed to help them afford college. Ninety-nine percent of these students come from low income families.

As shown in Exhibit 4, participants in Take Stock in Children outperformed their comparison group in each of the seven areas we examined. For example, participants had higher FCAT math scores (86% compared to 76%) and lower rates of disciplinary incidents (15% compared to 23%). They also had better outcomes for FCAT reading scores, high school completion rates, and chronic absences.

and considered a program's performance outcome different from the comparison group if the difference was statistically significant at the 95% level of confidence and greater than one percentage point.³

To make this comparison, we looked at students' baseline performance before entering a mentoring program and their outcomes for 2009-10 after participating for a year or more.⁴ We then identified a comparison group of students for each performance measure by selecting students with similar baseline characteristics.⁵ Appendix B provides additional information about our methodology for testing statistical difference.

We encountered two challenges when examining student outcomes. First, programs do not routinely report identifying information about their participants to the Department of Education. The department provided as much information as was available, but we needed to gather information on individual participants from each mentoring program. Second, when identifying comparison groups, we could not factor in every characteristic that may lead to students being selected for a mentoring program and thus affect their outcomes. For example, if

Take Stock in Children (TSlC) at Miami Dade College has been operating since 1995 to help provide deserving, at risk students in South Florida with mentors, advocacy, scholarships and hope. We are currently serving 500 students throughout 89 schools in Miami Dade County.

TSlC recruits students who have at risk characteristics of dropping out of high school when they are still in middle school. We target average students with a 2.0 GPA. We look for certain at risk indicators, such as: poverty level, single parent, minority, both parents not completing college or high school, one parent incarcerated, student with a disability, etc. Once the student enters our program we provide the student with a volunteer mentor who visits with the student once a week for approximately one half hour at their school site. The mentor provides the student with support and guidance depending on the individual circumstances of the student.

In addition, each student is assigned a student advocate who is employed by Miami Dade College. The advocate is responsible for monitoring the student's academic performance, attendance, behavior, etc. If the student is not performing well, then the advocate offers certain interventions that will hopefully bring the student back on task. In addition, the students and their parents are required to attend bi-monthly workshops that are offered at the college. The workshops topics include, but are not limited to: goal setting, time management, financial aid, test-taking strategies, career exploration, SAT/ACT Prep, applying for college, etc. Our juniors are given the opportunity to go on a college tour throughout the state of Florida, visiting eight college campuses, and all juniors and seniors are provided with online SAT/ACT Prep software to help them improve their scores.

When the student graduates from high school, TSlC provides the student with a four year tuition scholarship that can be used throughout the state of Florida. We purchase the scholarship through the Florida Pre-Paid Tuition Program each year. The scholarships are owned by TSlC and assigned to the student upon graduation. In addition, we then offer students with transition and retention services while they are in college. Our goal is to ensure that our students receive a college degree.

Our success rate is phenomenal, with 92% of our students graduating from high school, 88% going to college, and 59% graduating college within four years. Our student sponsors receive quarterly updates on the students they sponsor, and our sponsors are highlighted at all of our events and communications. Currently, we have a minimum of five events each year, with an average attendance of 500 people per event. The cost to sponsor a student is \$10,000. This will be used to purchase a four year tuition scholarship for the student, and provide a mentor, student advocate, and workshops throughout the years the student is in the program.

Another issue is that the City would prefer to see something like a day care center at this location, but with no control over any of the property, the City cannot force this choice of use from among the myriad of permissible commercial uses allowed on the site based on zoning and the City's Comprehensive Plan. Thus, it is the City's desire that the County sell the lot to the City so the City will have some input about what is developed here.

There are several issues here. The lot, though commercially zoned, is only 6,650 square feet, and 50 feet wide. This makes its development for any commercial purpose problematic. After required setbacks, the remaining portion of the lot which can be built upon is very narrow and lends itself to few commercial operations. For this reason, assembling the six lots together to make a single parcel of 39,900 square feet makes more sense. However, the County owns the lot in the middle of the six, so there is difficulty developing anything there without first obtaining the County lot.

The City would still like to purchase the lot from the County. Our Commission adopted a Resolution on August 24, 2010, approving the acquisition and the City has agreed to pay the full appraised value for the lot.


When we explained the protracted process we would go through for the County to be able to convey the lot to the City, their interest waned because of the time periods involved. They eventually leased another location on Krome Avenue and have since established a successful facility there near the State Farmers' Market.

Our letter to the County dated March 6, 2009, explained that we been approached at that time by a successful day care center operator who was interested in constructing another facility in Florida City. They approached us about our assistance in assembling the six lots on the corner of NW 9th Avenue and Lucy Street, one of which is owned by Miami-Dade County OCED.



As long as the lot remains in County ownership, all five lots will probably remain undeveloped as a whole. Though this particular day care center will face the same issues if we do not do something now. By owning the lot, the City can encourage the assemblage and use of the six lots for a commercial venture that promotes the community interest and welfare. Also, by conveying the parcel to the City, the County will no longer have to pay the cost of maintenance of the vacant lot.

The Hospital Governance Taskforce would like to offer a few interim recommendations that may be useful in your deliberations concerning the Public Health Trust and the potential establishment of a Financial Recovery Board. This Taskforce was created to make recommendations on alternative hospital governance models, and it is the Taskforce's hope to be supportive of your deliberations and to work with and support whatever governing body the Board of County Commission determines to be appropriate.

1. In regard to May 3, 2011 BCC Agenda Item 4(I), we recommend that the two-thirds vote requirement apply to both the override of PHT or Recovery Board decisions and to Commission directives to the PHT or Recovery Board adopted by resolution. Doing so will greatly enhance the ability of the governing body to make the hard decisions that are ahead.

2. We urge emphasis on ethics and absence of perceptions of conflicts of interest in the governing body. Members should have no conflicts of interest, personally or as stakeholders, in the outcome of their decisions. The governing body's sole interest should be the future of Jackson Healthcare System.

3. Additionally, we urge inclusion of diversity in the governing body.

In summary, the governing body must be able to show that it can nimbly and without perceptions of conflicts of interest make the necessary tough decisions in consultation with stakeholders.
