Traci Romine joined Audubon of Florida in 2005, first as the Everglades Ecosystem Policy Director and then in her current role as the Climate and Communications Director. Prior to joining Audubon, Ms. Romine prepared reforestation project proposals for clients in Brazil to qualify for carbon credits under the Kyoto Protocol of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change. She also managed communications and English-language publications for the American Chamber of Commerce, Brazil. Prior to joining the Chamber in 1997, Ms. Romine worked for 15 years as campaign coordinator and director of state, national and international fisheries and marine policy issues for Greenpeace International. As a journalist, she worked for the Daily News of Los Angeles and USA Today, as well as writing a column and editing Inside Brazil for Update Magazine, and other publications. Ms. Romine has a bachelor's degree in sociology and journalism from California State University, Northridge, where she was the first woman to be appointed editor in chief of the university newspaper, the Daily Sundial.
