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A GOOD PLACE TO LIVE: DORAL, FLORIDA

Doral is one of thirty-four municipalities in Miami-Dade County, Florida. Conveniently located just one mile from Miami International Airport and twelve miles from Downtown Miami, the City of Doral occupies a land area of 15 square miles bordered on the west by the Ronald Reagan Turnpike, to the north by the Town of Medley, to the east by the Palmetto Expressway and to the South by the City of Sweetwater.

TRANSPORTATION

Miami Dade Transit route 132 Doral/Tri-Rail Shuttle provides service area to Doral Executive Center, Doral Country Club, Atrium Shopping Center, Miami Springs, Hialeah Market, and Tri-Rail Station. Although Miami-Dade County Transportation does service the Doral area, it does not service inner Doral. Therefore, in February 2008, the City of Doral began a pilot program for a new form of transportation for residents, the Doral Trolley. With stops all over the city, the trolley runs all the way from Ronald W. Reagan/Doral Senior High School to the city limit at NW 87 Ave. It services all Doral area public schools (with the exception of Doral Academy Charter School) and many



COMMUNITY

City of Doral Ranks 51st in Top 100 Places to live in the U.S. by *CNNMoney.com*, and was named the third best place in the USA to retire by *US News & World Report*. The city has experienced population growth of 77% in the last 8 years and 8,000 new homes and mixed use units are planned in the next 7 to 10 years.

Pinecrest is a suburban village in Miami-Dade County, Florida. It was incorporated on March 12, 1996 and is one of thirty-four municipalities in Miami-Dade County. Pinecrest is conveniently located twenty minutes south of Downtown Miami and Miami International Airport. Pinecrest encompasses eight square miles and is recognized as one of the most beautiful residential areas in South Florida; it is also one of the most affluent communities within Miami-Dade County making it a highly desirable place to live.

Two Miami Dade Transit routes provide service to the Pinecrest area:

- Route 57, which includes stops at the Tri-Rail Airport Station, Miami International Airport, South Miami Metrorail Station, Red Road (NW/SW 57 Avenue), Busway at SW 152 Street, SW 152 Street Park & Ride, Jackson South Hospital.
- Route 136, which includes stops at the U.S. Immigration & Naturalization Office, Kendall-Tamiami Executive Airport, The Falls, Coral Gables, Cocoplum Plaza, Douglas Road Metrorail Station, the Busway, Dadeland South Metrorail Station

In addition, the Village will develop a transportation master plan to help guide the Village in planning for improved streets and transit corridors.

COMMUNITY

The Village of Pinecrest identifies itself as one of the most beautiful and desirable residential areas in South Florida. Residents have access to seven recreational parks. Pinecrest Gardens is the crown jewel of the village's park system. The park also offers various programs including summer camps. The park is located on the former site of the world famous Parrot Jungle. Other parks include: Pinecrest Gardens, Flagler Grove Park, Coral Pine Park, Evelyn Greer Park, Veterans Wayside Park, and Suniland Park.

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A GOOD PLACE TO LIVE: HIALEAH GARDENS, FLORIDA

Hialeah Gardens lies in the northwestern portion of Miami-Dade County just west of another predominantly Hispanic municipality, Hialeah. Its large Hispanic population and high voter turnout rate have made the city one of the few municipalities in the city to elect a Cuban mayor.

TRANSPORTATION

The City of Hialeah Gardens is serviced by the Hialeah Transit System (HTS.) HTS and Miami Dade Transit share a common transfer and fare policy. HTS customers can purchase a date- stamped 1-Day EASY Ticket for \$5 when boarding either system. A 1-Day EASY Ticket purchased on a HTS bus is good for one day of unlimited rides on Miami-Dade Transit and HTS buses only. Miami-Dade Transit customers who present an EASY Card or unstamped EASY Ticket when boarding a HTS bus at the Hialeah Metrorail Station only pay a 50-cent transfer fee. HTS honors all Miami-Dade Transit discount-fare EASY Cards and Golden Passport, Patriot Passport and STS EASY Cards.

COMMUNITY

The city places an emphasis on providing and maintaining open space for parks and recreational activities as well as the development of single and multi-family residential areas. The Parks and Recreation Department offers recreational services to its residents in four main park facilities plus several smaller neighborhood parks. The primary location, Westland Gardens Park, is currently being renovated and new facilities added. The Park also boasts a variety of programs for the community's youth such as an ongoing baseball league, a swim team, tennis and dance classes, YMCA summer program, karate classes, soccer, and a basketball league. In addition, The City of Hialeah Gardens' Human Services Department is committed to providing the elderly community with a better quality of life. In addition to the nutrition program, activities such as dominoes, bingo, card games, holiday/birthday celebrations, and field trips are part of the center's itinerary.

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A GOOD PLACE TO LIVE: CORAL GABLES, FLORIDA

Coral Gables was one of the first planned communities, and foreshadowed the development of the gated community and the homeowners association. Coral Gables is the only city in Florida, and only one of two cities nationwide to have a Class 1 Fire Department, a fully accredited Police Department, the highest awarded building and zoning department, and "AAA" bond ratings from Moody's and Standard and Poor.

The majority of the businesses in Coral Gables serve local and international clientele. There is low-level manufacturing within the City but strong investment in commercial development and in professional services/administrative operations. The City's major employers are a diverse collection of education, hospitality, healthcare, and professional operations.

The City of Coral Gables has magnet high schools, elementary, middle schools, special education programs, kindergarten, and preschool programs. The City is also home to the University of Miami, one of only 29 private research universities in the nation.

Miami Springs is a Miami suburban city located in Miami-Dade County, Florida. It, along with other Miami suburbs such as Coral Gables, Florida and Opa-locka, Florida, formed some of the first planned communities in the state.

Miami Springs is one of the more economically prosperous municipalities in Miami-Dade County, posting higher average and per capita incomes, and lower poverty rates than the county. Miami Springs has seen an economic resurgence with the continuing growth of Miami International Airport.
