

## TYPES OF BENEFIT PAYMENTS

**This table summarizes the types of payments you may receive if you are injured on or by October 1, 2003.** If you have been injured before that date, call your employer's workers' compensation carrier or the Employee Assistance Office of the Division of Workers' Compensation at **1-800-342-1741** (or any EAO field office listed at the end of this booklet) to learn more about the benefits you may receive.

HOW LONG YOU CAN RECEIVE PAYMENT	104 weeks or until your doctor releases you to modified duty work or says you have reached maximum medical improvement (MMI)	Up to 6 months from the date of accident	104 weeks or until your doctor says you have reached MMI	For each percentage point of your permanent impairment rating you will receive 3 weeks of benefits	26 weeks with an extension of 26 weeks if approved	Until you are reemployed	Until a total of \$150,000 has been paid; there are certain exceptions
