Renovated Traffic Management Center and New Adaptive Signal Controllers

I am pleased to announce the Ribbon Cutting Ceremony for the renovated Traffic Management Center (TMC) and new adaptive signal controllers will be taking place on Friday, August 12, 2016, at 10:00 a.m., at 7100 NW 36 Street – behind the Fire Rescue Station (see invitation attached).

This project is part of the original list of improvements contained in the People's Transportation Plan (PTP). The \$1.3 million modernization of the TMC is just one of the many ways we aim to improve mobility in Miami-Dade County.

The Traffic Management Center has been upgraded to provide increased technology and modern traffic management tools. The scope of the renovations include: creation of work stations for traffic engineers; new computer raised flooring; new computers; a new LED video display wall displaying video feeds from cameras along major arterials; and new traffic applications, such as Sunguide, Regional Integrated Transportation Information System (RITIS), CCTV Video Management, Activu Video Management System, and WAZE's Connected Citizens Program (CCP). It is our hope that this upgrade will help relieve congestion on our roadways and make our residents' commutes easier.
