Subject: Mayoral Appointment – Director of the Miami-Dade Transit Department

Pursuant to the authority vested in me under provisions of Sections 2.02C and D of the Miami-Dade Home Rule Charter, I hereby appoint Ysela Llort to the position of Director for the Miami-Dade Transit Department to provide continuity of business operations within the department.

On August 5, 2011, I appointed Ms. Llort to serve as the interim Transit Director and I advised that a national recruitment was being conducted. The interim appointment has served to provide business continuity and leadership to our Transit agency as it faces multiple challenges. At this time the term of that interim appointment has expired and The Rules of Procedure require that I make an appointment. At the appropriate time, I will determine whether to again pursue recruitment.

Ms. Llort is a well-qualified transportation professional with more than 26 years of experience in this field. Her educational credentials include a Bachelor of Arts in Economics and Anthropology from Duke University, and a Master of City and Regional Planning, Clemson University. Most recently, she served as Assistant County Manager with responsibility for a portfolio of major transportation departments including Aviation, Seaport, Transit, Public Works, and Consumer Services as well as the MPO. In addition, Ms. Llort previously served as Assistant Secretary for Intermodal Systems Development at the Florida Department of Transportation.

Ms. Llort is a leader in her field and I am confident that she will fulfill the responsibilities of this challenging position. Ms. Llort's resume is attached for your review. Please join me in commending her for her professional dedication.

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Experience

Interim Director of Miami-Dade Transit, Miami-Dade County, Florida (August 5, 2011 to Present)

Directs all aspects of planning, construction and operations of Miami-Dade Transit, the 14th largest system in the United States and largest in Florida.

Assistant County Manager, Miami-Dade County, Florida (March 2007 to August 2011)

Oversee all transportation activities within Miami-Dade County including the Miami-Dade Aviation Department, Seaport Department, Public Works Department, Miami-Dade Transit, Metropolitan Planning Organization, Office of the Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust, Office of Capital Improvements and the Consumer Services Department. Analyze legislative and administrative concerns regarding these departments; advise the Mayor and County Manager of potential challenges as well as evaluate options and implement solutions. Inform elected officials, stakeholders and the general public of relevant matters. Represent Mayor and County Manager at internal and external transportation forums including Board of County Commission meetings and meetings with other public and private agencies.

Specific programs of interest in transportation portfolio include:

- Execution of the Aviation Department's multi-billion dollar Capital Improvement Program (CIP), including activities associated with the expansion of the airport terminal as well as, the design-build-operate-maintain project that will connect the Miami Intermodal Center (MIC) to Miami International Airport,
- Implementation of the People's Transportation Plan (PTP) which includes:
 - ❖ planning and construction of the Airport Link transit expansion as well as procurement of rolling stock and other transit capital assets;
 - ❖ the implementation of major highway and road improvements;
 - ❖ upgrades to the County's traffic signalization system
- Planning and delivery of Seaport capital projects including the Port of Miami Tunnel and the Deep Dredge.

Responsible for the executive management and generation of the Intermodal Systems Development Program which includes the following offices: Office of Policy Planning, Systems Planning Office, Transportation Statistics Office, Aviation Office, Rail Office, Seaports Office, Transit Office and Environmental

Management Office. Formulates transportation policies and priorities to produce the Department's Annual Capital Improvement Plan. Facilitates the development of consensus among private stakeholders relative to transportation priorities and funding of same. Lead advisor to the Secretary of Transportation on multimodal transportation policy. Responsible for the development of long range and strategic planning and performance monitoring for the agency. Responsible for the Strategic Intermodal System plan and program. Represents the department with the Governor, Legislature, the Florida Transportation Commission, state and federal agencies, Metropolitan Planning Organization, local government, and special interest groups.

Deputy Assistant Secretary, State Transportation Planner, Florida Department of Transportation (August 1994 to October 2003)

Responsible for the executive management and operation of the Department's planning and environmental programs including oversight of the Office of Policy Planning, Systems Planning Office, Environmental Management Office, and the Transportation Statistics Office as well as coordination of district planning and environmental programs. Formulates transportation policies and priorities to guide the agency's multi-billion annual capital improvement plan. Facilitates development of consensus among public and private transportation stakeholders relative to transportation priorities. Recommends multimodal transportation policy to the Secretary of Transportation. Responsible for the development of long range and strategic planning and performance monitoring for the agency. Serves as the lead policy advisor on federal legislative matters. Serves as a member of the Executive Committee, which is the Department's policy making body. Represents the Department as liaison with the Governor, the Legislature, the Florida Transportation Commission, state and federal agencies, Metropolitan Planning Organizations, local governments, and special interest groups.

Assistant District Engineer for Planning and Operations, Virginia Department of Transportation, Northern Virginia District (May 1987 to August 1994)

Responsible for directing all planning and operation programs and activities including Traffic Engineering, Traffic Management Systems (ITS), a Land Development Review, Access Management Permitting, and Transportation Planning. Responsible for all construction and maintenance activities related to operations. Approved budgets and manpower needs assessments; evaluated program effectiveness as well as managed subordinate department heads. Coordinated for the district all activities relative to the Metropolitan Planning Organization as well as numerous regional transportation organizations including transit operators. Represented the Department on boards, before elected officials, federal, state, and local governments, professional organizations, and special interest groups.

Acting Resident Engineer, Virginia Department of Transportation, Fairfax Residency, Interim Assignment (March 1992 – August 1992)

Responsible for the management of all aspects of the most urban residency in the Virginia Department of Transportation system: oversaw transportation construction program, maintenance of transportation facilities, permit operations for both roadways access and commercial motor vehicles, and administration of budgets and personnel. Responsible for staff in excess of 500 employees as well as extensive consultant forces. Developed the six—year capital improvement plan and annual budget in partnership with the local government. Developed a consolidated Interstate maintenance plan for the jurisdiction. Instituted contracting procedures and implemented improvement plans. Conducted public meeting with citizens, business leaders, and elected officials to address transportation concerns,

District Transportation Planning Engineer, Virginia Department of Transportation, Northern Virginia District (January 1986 – May 1987)

Managed the Transportation Planning Department responsible for the review of land development proposals. Supervised group of professional engineers and planners who conducted the review of the transportation impacts of comprehensive plans and amendments, rezoning and site plans for a four county district. Coordinated work with local governments, regional planning and transportation organizations, and Department transportation construction program. Took the lead in resolving the problems arising from conflicting transportation and land use policies on the part of the counties, the Department, citizens, and developers. Established techniques and procedures for data collection and analysis; maintained liaison with transit, rail, air, and port companies to assist in the development of projects. Reviewed construction plans of Department projects for compatibility with private sector projects. Represented the agency in front of various governmental, civic, and business groups.

Reviewed site plans for Fairfax, Prince William, and Loudoun Counties to ensure compliance with Virginia Department of Transportation design standards and transportation goals. Analyzed traffic impacts of proposed land development, evaluated trip generation, highway capacity, access management, relationship to other existing land use to planned development and to planned transportation facilities. Participated in the resolution of problems arising from conflicting transportation and land use policies and plans.
