

Subject: Neighborhood Stabilization Program 2 (NSP2) Status Report

In response to a request from the Economic Development and Social Services (EDSS) Committee, the following is a weekly update from the Miami-Dade Neighborhood Stabilization Program 2 (NSP2) Consortium (The Consortium) on the status of NSP2 for the week ending February 3, 2012.

Background

The Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP) is a federally funded program through the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) that provides funding to stabilize communities that have suffered foreclosures and abandonment. NSP1 was authorized by the Housing and Economic Recovery Act of 2008. It provided grants to all states and selected local governments on a formula basis. NSP2 was authorized under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009. NSP2 grants provide funding on a competitive basis to states, and local governments but also to nonprofits and a consortium of nonprofit entities. Although, Miami-Dade County (County) submitted an application for NSP2 funds, the County was not awarded.

The Consortium is comprised of the Opa-Locka Community Development Corporation, the Neighborhood Housing Service of South Florida, Carrfour Supportive Housing Corporation, the Urban League of Greater Miami, St. John Community Development Corporation, the Little Haiti Housing Association, and the City of North Miami. The Consortium was awarded \$89,375,000 in NSP2 funds and these funds are used to acquire foreclosed, vacant, and abandoned properties for the purpose of redeveloping those parcels into affordable rental and homeownership opportunities for low and moderate income families. Additionally, the Consortium focuses on stabilizing neighborhoods in north central Miami-Dade County through the acquisition and rehabilitation of existing housing units or the redevelopment of vacant or blighted structures. The target is 1,255 units of rental and homeownership housing with the potential to roll over funds for additional units.

Status

To date, approximately \$87,923,000 of those funds has been allocated to various viable projects and approximately \$45,679,000 has been disbursed, which represents 98.4% and 51.1% of the total NSP2 grant award, respectively. As you know, it is required by HUD to utilize fifty percent of the grant by February 11, 2012. Currently, the Consortium's level of disbursements has surpassed the 50% goal within the time requirement.
