LOANED EXECUTIVE JOB DESCRIPTION

Job description:

As a United Way of Miami-Dade loaned executive (LE), you have the opportunity to learn firsthand how important and exciting a United Way campaign is – for the companies and organizations that participate and for our community as a whole. Your efforts are key to United Way's success in bringing us together as a community to do what none of us can do alone - create sustainable changes that improve lives.

Every day, in every part of our community, United Way is impacting the issues that matter most to us. Loaned executives serve as an extension of United Way campaign staff, and by helping us during the most crucial campaign months, you help to keep United Way's administrative costs down. That means more dollars for more people in need, right here in Miami-Dade.

Each LE is assigned to a development team at United Way. Most LE's will work with local accounts (companies and organizations with offices in Miami-Dade) to help them run their employee United Way campaigns. However, responsibilities can vary from those listed below; based on the timing of your assignment, your United Way staff person will explain additional responsibilities on an individual basis.

Job responsibilities:

Office Hours: Monday – Friday, 8:30 am – 5:30 pm

- Attend a mandatory five day training that begins on Aug. 15, 2011, to obtain the knowledge & skills to carry out the duties of a Loaned Executive
- Manage a specific group of accounts – your primary responsibility as an LE is to work with accounts and their employee campaign managers (ECM's) to make their employee campaigns as successful as possible
- Review account histories, identify account needs, and develop strategies to meet those needs
- Develop campaign plans to maximize giving and collecting pledges
- Deliver campaign materials and conduct on-site presentations
- Assist/motivate ECM's in planning and completing their campaigns
- Organize/execute agency tours and speakers
- Communicate to employee groups how contributions through United Way benefit our community
- Cultivate new accounts
- Manage account profiles and execute final evaluations at the end of the campaign

Specialized LE job functions:

- Public Speaking (convey the United Way of Miami-Dade message through presentations)
- Administrative (data entry, filing, faxing, supplies, CEO packet preparation, mailings, research, supply delivery, etc.)
- Marketing (secure company sponsorship & auction items for events, company follow-up phone calls, coordinate marketing efforts, etc.)
- Labor (participate in presentations where labor is involved, support AFL-CIO Community Services Liaisons on individual and organizational outreach, etc.)

Performance Review

We will review each LE's performance at the end of his/her time at United Way. There may also be periodic performance/program interviews with assigned staff to ensure a good experience for all involved. You will also have a chance to review the program and critique our performance.
