Subject: 2014 *Every Drop Counts* Poster Contest Winners

On January 22, 2009, the Board of County Commissioners (Board) approved Resolution No. R-89-09. The resolution calls for the development of an outreach plan to educate school children on the importance and the benefits of water conservation. As part of the outreach plan, Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department's Water Use Efficiency Section in collaboration with Community Information and Outreach developed the *Every Drop Counts* water conservation poster contest. The 2014 contest yielded more than 1,000 entries from kindergarten through grade five school children, with submittals from all of the thirteen (13) County Districts. The 2014 District Winners are listed below. Each winner will be recognized at the May 20, 2014 Board meeting by the student's respective Commissioner. The winning posters were on display in the Stephen P. Clark Center during the month of April in recognition of Water Conservation Month.
