Subject: **Changes to Documentation Supporting Stimulus Agenda Item**

Agenda Item 2.A.1

Please note the following additions and changes regarding the package of information supporting the transportation stimulus issue to be discussed by the Governing Board on February 20th.

1. Addition. –List # 5 (Grey). This list contains items that were found eligible for the Transportation Enhancements Program (TEP) of the USDOT which will also assign funds for Miami-Dade County. Funds available for this program for our area are estimated in the range of \$5 to \$6 million.
2. Addition. - List #6. Reflects project requests from Miami International Airport and from the Port of Miami. As indicated in the original memorandum submitted with the agenda package, Florida's share of stimulus aviation funds are to be assigned at the discretion of the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) with the concurrence of the FDOT. Also, the approved federal stimulus bill did not have funds allocated for maritime projects, so no specific funds appear to be available for seaport operations and internal infrastructure. Items related to issue of land access to Port facilities are eligible for Surface Transportation Program (STP). List # 5 is only for information at this point.
3. Substitution. – List #2 (Lavender) was modified to include only Miami-Dade County projects requested by Miami Dade Transit (MDT). These transit formula funds normally come to the county as MDT is the federally designated recipient for these funds in our urban area. The municipal transit requests that were originally reflected on this list were transferred to pages 11-13 of List #1. In addition, an updated MDT project list is now List #2. This new list supersedes the previous.

The new materials showing the above mentioned changes have been posted in the MPO website and will be distributed to MPO Board members on February 20, 2009. Thank you for your attention to this information.
