RESOLUTION APPROVING AN AMENDMENT TO THE FYs 2009 & 2010 UNIFIED PLANNING WORK PROGRAM TO ASSIGN NEW STUDIES TO TASK 3.06 “CALL FOR IDEAS”

WHEREAS, the Interlocal Agreement creating and establishing the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for the Miami Urbanized Area requires that the MPO provide a structure to evaluate the adequacy of the transportation planning and programming process; and

WHEREAS, the Transportation Planning Council (TPC) has been established and charged with the responsibility and duty of fulfilling the aforementioned functions; and

WHEREAS, the TPC has reviewed the FYs 2009 & 2010 UPWP, made a part hereof, and finds it consistent with the goals and objectives of the Transportation Plan for the Miami Urbanized Area,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION FOR THE MIAMI URBANIZED AREA, that the attached amendment to the FYs 2009 & 2010 Unified Planning Work Program to assign new studies to Task 3.06 “Call for Ideas” is hereby approved.

OBJECTIVE C: INTERMODAL TRANSPORTATION PLANNING

TASK NUMBER AND TITLE:

3.06 CALL FOR IDEAS

PURPOSE:

To solicit transportation planning ideas from the general public and other agencies that can lead to effective solutions to deal with traffic congestion in Miami-Dade County for the FY 2010 program.



PREVIOUS WORK:

During the development of this document, ideas submitted were shortlisted and recommended by the UPWP Development Committee for award during the FY 2009 year of this document. Those studies are listed below:

- 2.04 Miami-Dade County Bicycle and Pedestrian Facility Maintenance Program
- 2.06 Transit On-Board Survey
- 2.12 Sign Inventory for pre/post Hurricanes Conditions
- 2.13 Bicycle Boulevard Planning Study
- 3.06 Call for Ideas (new ideas solicitation for 2010)
- 3.07 Locate Sites for Bus Shelter Installation (new)
- 3.08 South Florida Clean Energy & Greenhouse Gas Emission Reduction Program
- 4.16 Aesthetic Guidelines for Transportation Projects in Miami-Dade County

The UPWP Development Committee met several times in the month of May, 2009 and recommended the summarized proposals under this task's End Product.

METHODOLOGY:

- Develop the new “Call for Ideas” brochure for FY 2010.
- Solicit the general public and other agencies through the distribution of the “Call for Ideas” brochure via regular postage mail, emails, quarterly newsletters and presentations to all of the MPO subcommittees.
- Meet with the UPWP Development Committee, which is a subset of the Transportation Planning Council (TPC), to discuss criteria for selection and provide input on each idea.
- Shortlist ideas submitted which are applicable and feasible for transportation planning efforts.
- Recommend studies which should be awarded funds for the FY 2010 program to the TPC and ultimately the MPO Governing Board.
- Studies adopted by the Board will be incorporated into the second fiscal half of this document.

- Studies adopted by the Board will be incorporated into the second fiscal year of this document under this work element.

The study will develop a plan for early procurement of available land to begin ridership patterns in planned transit corridors.</i> 	\$35,000
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Update of the Miami-Dade County GIS Crash Data System - To update the crash data system with all the crashes in Miami-Dade County in 2009. Train personnel for processing, mapping and uploading the crash data in the system with new analysis and reporting features.</i> 	\$50,000
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Miami-Dade Most Dangerous Locations for Elderly Pedestrians - To investigate the safety of elderly pedestrians at road segments and intersections in Miami-Dade County.</i> 	\$67,000
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Countywide High-Crash Location Safety Studies - To identify traffic safety concerns and to recommend countermeasures to improve the operational safety of twenty (20) high-crash locations countywide. These recommendations will be used in the preparation of the conceptual plans.</i> 	\$75,000
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>On-Line Safe Routes to School System Pilot Program - To develop an on-line, safe routes to school system pilot program for selected public elementary schools. The system would select an individualized walking route between a student's home and the school.</i> 	\$75,000
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Comprehensive Parking Study for Freight Transport in Miami-Dade - Identify suitable locations for short-term (overnight) and long-term parking of freight transport in Miami-Dade County.</i> 	\$65,000
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Bicycle Safety Education Program - To develop, implement and evaluate a bicycle safety education pilot program.</i> 	\$50,000
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>TIP Tracking Program - To supplement the on-line capabilities of the Interactive TIP with a tracking program that would allow citizens and elected officials to see the status of projects that are in previous TIPs.</i> 	\$58,000
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Feasibility Study to Implement Car-sharing Program(s) - To complete a feasibility study to implement car-sharing program(s) tailored to municipalities. Facilitate car-sharing in Miami-Dade County and to determine whether the City of Miami, in particular, Downtown Miami, meets the evaluation per the tasks to participate in a program.</i> 	\$25,000
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Evaluation of MDT's Trunk and Feeder Bus System – This task will analyze and evaluate the implemented routes for determining operational conditions by route. A matrix for comparing the service before and after the Trunk and Feeder implementation will be developed.</i> 	\$85,000
<i>Total award for above studies:</i>	\$585,000
