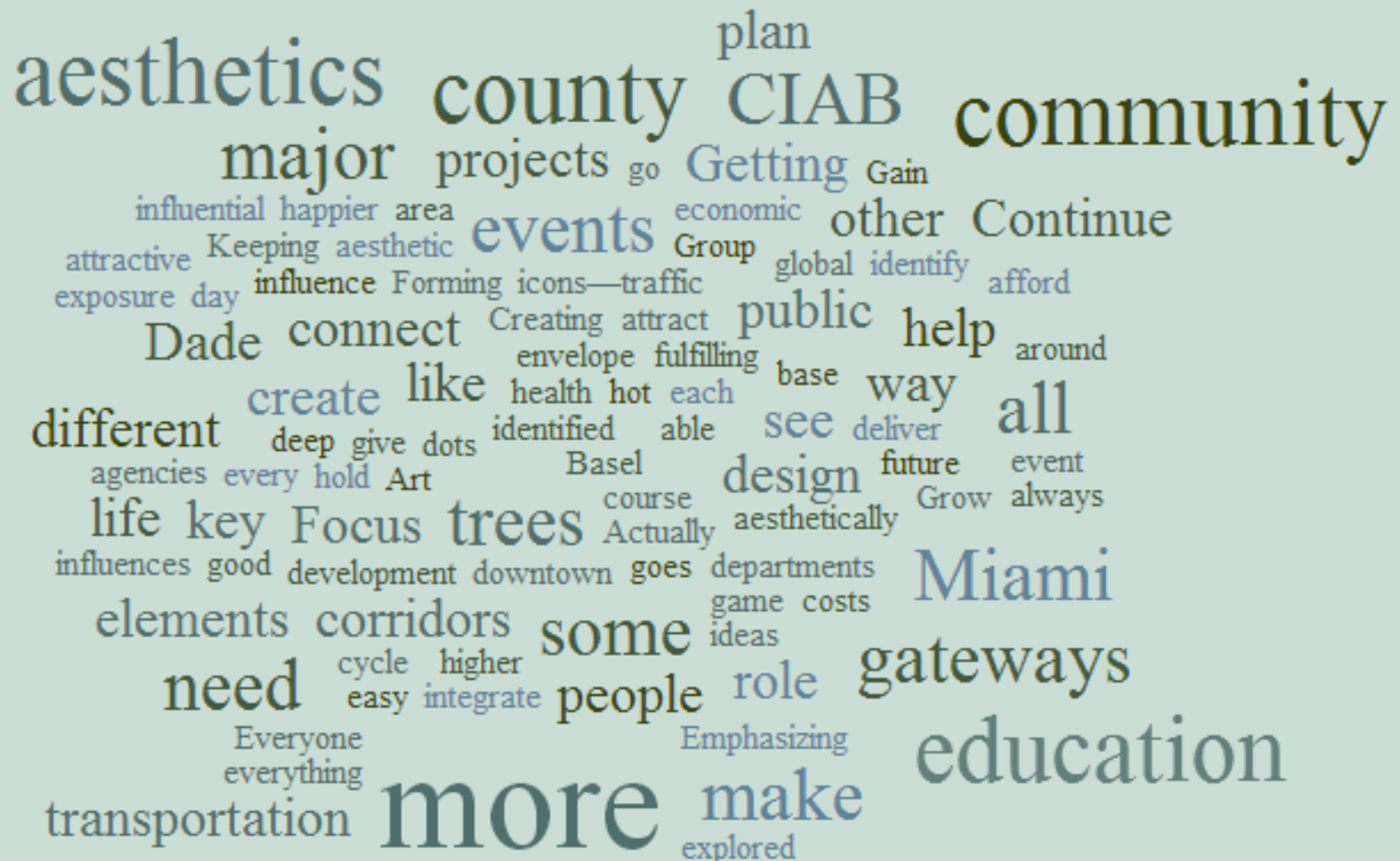

Million Trees Miami Status Report

- ◉ 161,000 trees planted since 2011
- ◉ 12-14% tree canopy
- ◉ Funding source for street trees is other agencies or grants...
- ◉ Working on Tree Canopy update
- ◉ Soliciting corporate sponsors
- ◉ Maintenance is an obstacle

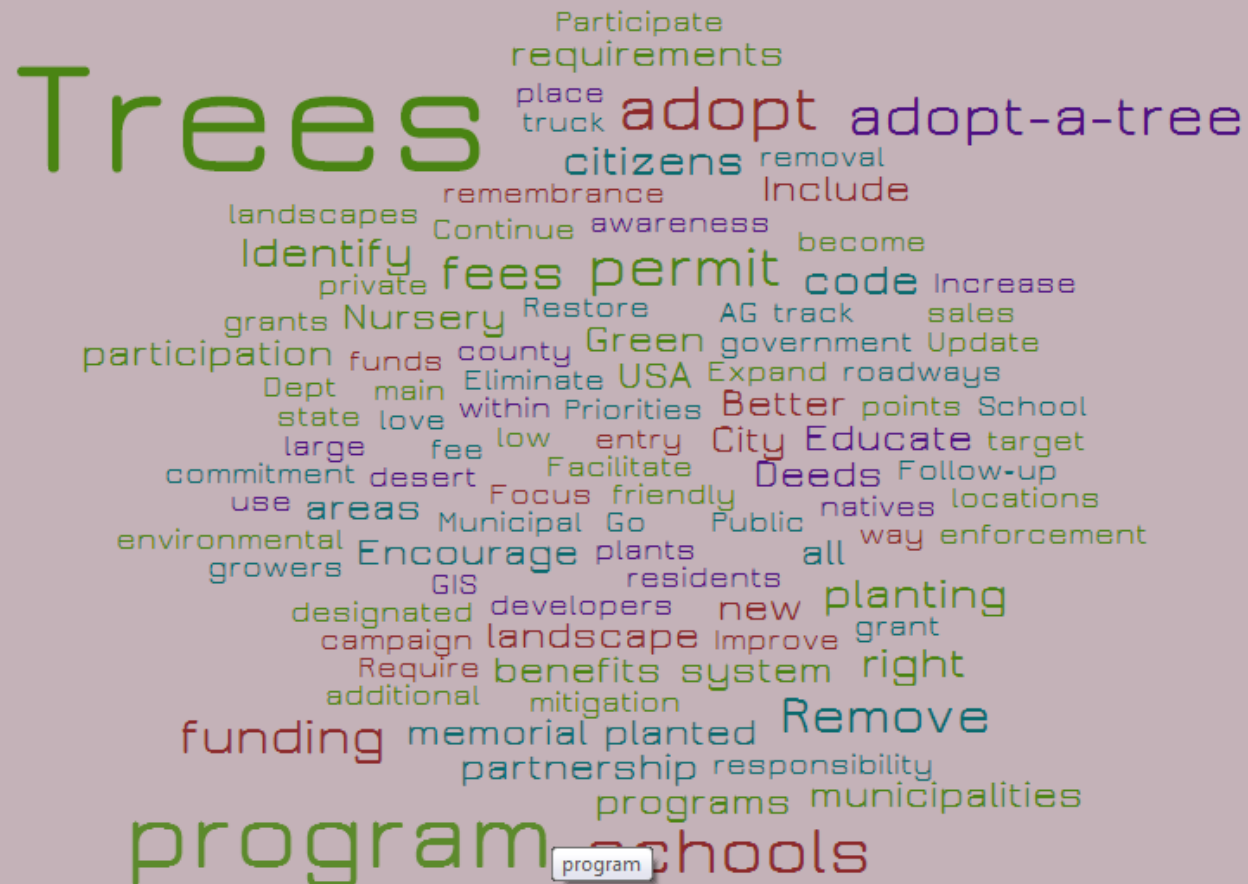

Member Wrap-Up Thoughts

- Set ½ dozen priority areas and focus on:
 - Litter
 - Trees
 - Maintenance
- Run PSAs quarterly to promote CIAB in those areas.
- Identify 6 main topics and run them through a public campaign using social and conventional media.



Member Wrap-Up Thoughts

- Quality of tree is a huge issue
- Broward enforces and everyone in landscaping knows they have to maintain the quality
- Enhance the quality of inspections



Member Wrap-Up Thoughts

- Launch a bigger campaign to target tourist areas and crack down on sign violations. Ramp up code enforcement in those areas
- In process of bolstering Landscape Code to try to connect landscape needs to building and zoning requirements

Member Wrap-Up Thoughts

- Create “Green Routes” that connect communities and highlight canopy streets.
- Develop a map that shows the location of the Green Routes and encourages activity.
- As part of its multi-modal plan, S. Miami is designating certain streets “Greenways”

Member Wrap-Up Thoughts

- ◉ Address the obstacles of launching a Tree Challenge by awarding the winning City the rights to next year's Adopt a Tree.
- ◉ Cities determine corridors where they will plant trees.
- ◉ Target tree planting along streets to reinforce the connection between the value of shade and trees.

Member Wrap-Up Thoughts

- Use Downtown Enhancement Teams as a model for maintenance.
(Formerly homeless individuals who help clean up downtown streets and sidewalks.. Win/Win)



Member Wrap-Up Thoughts

- ◉ Make connection with Building and Zoning officials about best tree species and appropriate “hurricane proof” trees.
- ◉ Bring P&Z into the discussion
- ◉ Consider legislation that makes connection so trees are part of hurricane preparedness

Chairman's parting words

- ◉ Keep up the fight!
- ◉ Continue to advocate on behalf of the Gateways.
- ◉ Express your concerns when maintenance lags.
- ◉ It isn't easy to preach the gospel, but it's definitely worth it!

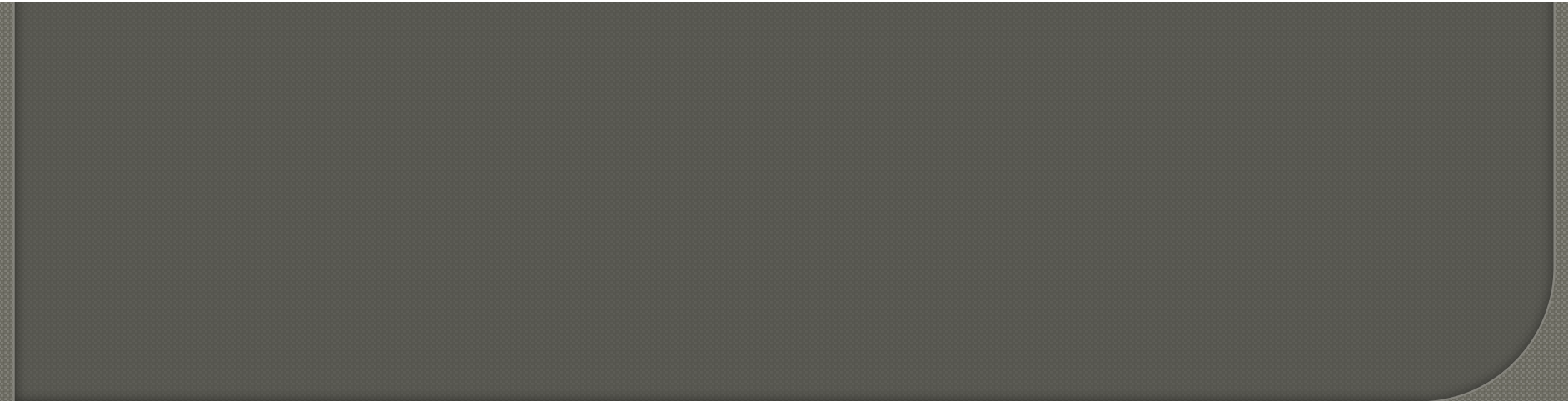
