

## NOTICE

Re: Planting on public right-of-way.

The Public Works Department (PWD) offers the following information regarding planting on public-right-of-way:

The PWD does not object to the planting of trees within the public right-of-way, as long as certain criteria and requirements are met:

- On a property survey or site sketch, please show the location of the proposed trees. Refer to the attached PWD Standard Detail G5.1, "Location of Planting within Public R/W", for requirements. Note that the minimum distance between the edge of pavement and the proposed planting shall be six (6) feet to the face of the tree trunk at the time of its maturity. Also, the minimum clear trunk distance shall be 4.5 feet from the ground surface.
- Refer to the attached list for acceptable species appropriate for planting in the public right-of-way.
- Preparation and recordation of a maintenance covenant (individual or corporation) must be submitted. Copies of the covenant are attached for your use. The covenant, which ever applies, must be recorded by the homeowner/corporation at the County Court Office, located at 22 NW 1<sup>st</sup> Street, or 11805 SW 26 Street.
- After completion of all the requirements previously stated, the homeowner/corporation then submits all documents to the PWD's Permit Section at the Miami-Dade County Stephen P. Clark Center, Suite 1420, 111 NW 1<sup>st</sup> Street or the Miami-Dade County Herbert S. Saffir Permitting and Inspection Center, 11805 SW 26 Street (Coral Way), for issuance of a permit. Please note, as of October 1, 2002, a fee of \$10.00 per tree shall be access to the permit.
- Please note that you must contact "Sunshine State One-Call" @ (800) 432-4770 for location of underground facilities before engaging in any excavation or demotion.
