Subject: Review Item: Environmental Cleanup, Compliance and Related Services for Miami-Dade County Facilities, Project No. E14-RER-03

The Regulatory and Economic Resources Department (RER) has initiated procurement through the Internal Services Department of Professional Services Agreements (PSAs) titled, "Environmental Cleanup, Compliance and Related Services for Miami-Dade County Facilities". These new PSAs will replace the current E08-DERM-01 PSAs. Two separate contracts will be procured; one will be for one (1) SBE – A/E Set-Aside PSA and the other will result in five (5) PSAs with an "Across-the-Board" SBE – A/E measure. The Across-the-Board PSAs will be procured as ISD Project No. E14-RER-03.

Consistent with the aforementioned E08-DERM-01 PSAs, these PSAs will provide RER with a prequalified pool of environmental consultants, with diverse and specialized expertise, immediately available to perform a variety of environmental tasks required of County departments, as directed by the Mayor. Additionally, these PSAs are necessary to protect the health and safety of the employees and citizens of the County by responding to discoveries of levels of contaminants at County owned properties which require immediate action. The PSA language will stipulate that the EDP contract be utilized when appropriate.

Therefore, RER requests that Project No. E14-RER-03 be submitted for review by the Small Business Development Division of the Internal Services Department for determination of participation measures.

As described on the attached Analysis for SBE – A/E Goal Recommendation, five (5) qualified consultants will be retained under non-exclusive professional services agreements with an effective term of three (3) years and a maximum compensation of \$3,000,000 per agreement with no minimum compensation guaranteed. These agreements will provide two one-year renewal options with no additional increase in the maximum compensation limit of \$3,000,000 per agreement.

The proposed scope of work includes performing:

- A. Environmental assessment or rehabilitation and related tasks, including but not limited to drilling, surveying and mapping and laboratory services, at Miami-Dade County owned or operated sites in accordance with Chapter 62-780 of the Florida Administrative Code (FAC), Chapter 24 of the Miami-Dade County Code and all other applicable regulations.
- B. Services related to the modification, repair, removal, replacement, installation or abandonment of any underground or aboveground storage systems, and related tasks, necessary for the investigation, prevention or cleanup of contamination, in accordance with Chapters 62-761 and 62-762 FAC, Chapter 24 of the Miami-Dade County Code and all other applicable regulations.
- C. Services as design criteria professionals and duties related to construction management for environmentally related construction tasks related to A and B above.

- D. Other related environmental work, not identified above, necessary for investigation or prevention of potential or known contamination, for compliance with applicable regulations, for protection of the environment and the public health and for cleanup of environmental contamination.

As indicated above in the proposed scope of work, laboratory services are incidental to, and necessary for, the performance of environmental assessment and rehabilitation. However, no specific Technical Certification category exists for these services. Additionally, drilling services not related to geotechnical investigations, are most often performed by SFWMD licensed water well drillers, not required to be certified in TC category 9.01. Remedial construction activities which fall outside of the Technical Certification categories are required to be performed as well as transportation and disposal of contaminated soil and groundwater, and other miscellaneous non technical support services.

RER has evaluated this project and recommends a 5% SBE – A/E participation measure. The combination of participation measures recommended by RER under E14-RER-01 and E14-RER-03 is equal to a 21% measure, averaged across the contracts, greater than the measure initially approved by SBD for the E13-RER-01 contract, which was subsequently cancelled. Please see attached the Analysis for SBE – A/E Goal Recommendation, in support of the proposed SBE – A/E measure.

ANALYSIS FOR SBE-A/E GOAL RECOMMENDATION

PROJECT TITLE: Professional Services Agreements for Environmental Cleanup, Compliance and Related Services for Miami-Dade County Facilities

PROJECT NUMBER: E14-RER-03

DEPARTMENT: RER

ESTIMATED COST OF SERVICES: Five (5) qualified consultants will be retained under non-exclusive professional services agreements with an effective term of three (3) years and maximum compensation of \$3,000,000 per agreement. The agreements will provide two one-year renewal options with no additional increase in the maximum compensation limit of \$3,000,000 per agreement.

FUNDING SOURCE: Work will be funded by the various Miami-Dade County Departments utilizing these agreements.

DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT: These five (5) agreements will allow environmental assessment or rehabilitation and related tasks at Miami-Dade County owned and/or operated sites in accordance with all applicable regulations; services related to the modification, repair, removal, replacement, installation and abandonment of any underground or aboveground storage systems, and related tasks, in accordance with all applicable regulations; services as design criteria professionals and for construction management for environmentally necessary construction tasks; environmental construction tasks as warranted; and other related environmental work, not identified above, necessary for investigation or prevention of potential or known contamination, for compliance with applicable regulations, for protection of the environment and the public health and for cleanup of environmental contamination.

REQUIRED TECHNICAL CERTIFICATIONS: Based on past use of similar PSAs administered by RER, the estimated technical certification breakdown is as follows:
