CURRENT STATUS:

Miami Dade Transit (MDT) continues to coordinate with the City of South Miami alternatives for the location of the proposed pedestrian overpass. This extended coordination effort is as a result of the City deeming the property earmarked to be acquired for the project's preferred alternative/location, as historic. A site visit with City officials was held on May 2nd to evaluate the SW 71 Street alternative. An alternative analysis was prepared by the consultant for two options at this location. One with the east tower placed within public right of way and the other one placing the east tower at the current Akashi Restaurant. MDT is currently evaluating the warrant criteria to determine if an evaluation of a pedestrian overpass at this location is warranted.
