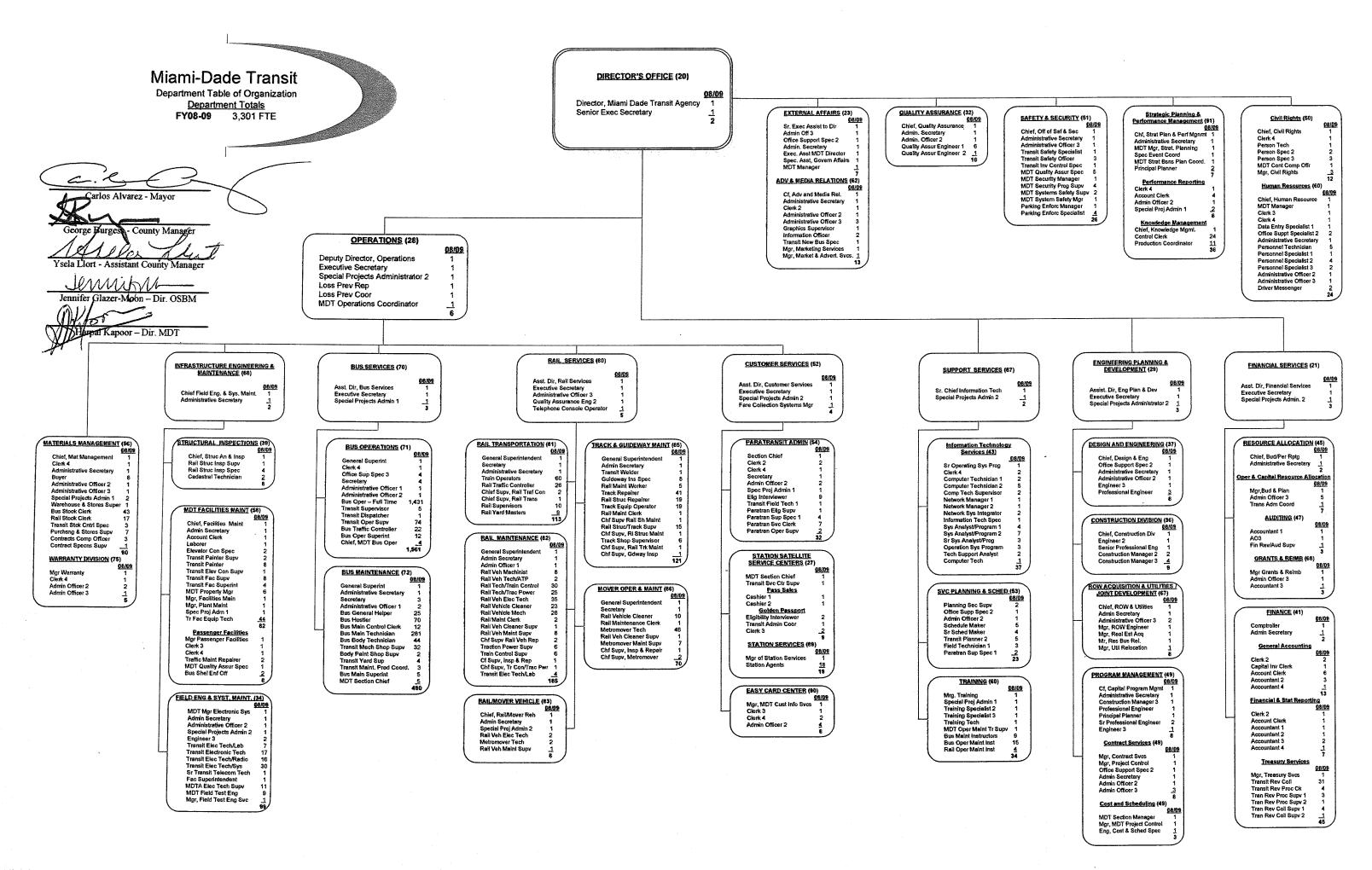

# Office of Safety & Security Highlights 4<sup>th</sup> Quarterly Meeting of 2008

## HIGHLIGHTS:

☐ There were 55 Part I and 19 Part II crimes for the period October through December of 2008. There were 33 Part I and 21 Part II crimes recorded in October through December for the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter for 2007. **Note, Part I Offenses**, the first of two main groupings of Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) classifications consisting of eight offenses (criminal homicide, forcible rape, aggravated assault, robbery, burglary, larceny-theft, motor vehicle theft, and arson). Part II Offenses, the second of two main UCR groupings of crime classifications not already designated in Part I (i.e. fraud, counterfeiting, possession of weapons, vandalism, vagrancy). ☐ During October 2008, MDT assisted with the Barak Obama Rally at Bicentennial Park. Staff provided crowd control at key Metromover stations. Crowds were estimated at 30,000. ☐ Miami-Dade Transit Office of Safety and Security conducted an emergency drill on Saturday, November 15, 2008. The drill was conducted at the Earlington Heights Metrorail Station in cooperation with the Miami-Dade Fire Rescue Department. The drill simulated a Metrorail patron jumping onto the guideway, at the southern end of the EHT northbound platform area, as a northbound train approaches the station. ☐ The individual accused of stealing several Miami Dade Transit buses was arrested on July 22, 2008. The case was closed out on or about Friday December 19, 2008. with the approval of MDT. The defendant was sentenced to 364 days in the Dade County Jail. As a special condition, the defendant will also receive 5 years, reporting probation. A "stay away" order was also entered which will prevent the defendant from being within 1000 feet of any MDT facility. There will be no early termination of the defendant's probation. ☐ MDT Security enhancements, including hardening, cameras, procedural changes such as ID checks, access/egress card and PIN no., etc. ☐ Safety staff is continuing safety oversight of MDT construction projects (Overtown Joint Development and several adjacent construction projects in downtown Miami). ☐ There were two FDOT reportable accidents/incidents at MDT Metrorail/Metromover/Metrobus from October through December 2008.

## Office of Safety & Security Highlights 4<sup>th</sup> Quarterly Meeting of 2008

- On October 26, 2008, there was a murder-suicide at the Dadeland South Metrorail Station surface parking lot (non-revenue facility) involving a male subject who killed his former girlfriend and his infant daughter before killing himself.
  - The MDT Office of Safety and Security is awaiting receipt of the police department investigation report to complete the investigation.
- 2. On November 12, 2008, at approximately 11:43am, a male subject sat on the edge of the Brickell Metromover Station platform then slid down onto the guideway (outbound). The subject then laid down on his stomach on the track (concrete running pad). A very short time later Metromover Car #20 proceeded over the subject that was laying on the track. The victim was transported to a local hospital and was pronounced as deceased later in the day.

The MDT Office of Safety and Security is awaiting receipt of the police department investigation report to complete the accident investigation.

#### Scope

- The Orange Line Phase 1: MIC-Earlington Heights Metrorail Extension consists of a 2.4-mile elevated heavy rail extension of the existing Metrorail System.
- It will extend from the existing Earlington Heights Metrorail Station to the proposed Miami Intermodal Center (MIC).
- The project includes one station at the Miami Intermodal Center (MIC).
- In October 2004, the decision was made to implement this project with State and Local funds.

#### Schedule

- ◆ The DEIS was approved by the FTA on May 2, 2003.
- ◆ The LPA was approved by the MPO on September 25, 2003, and the revised LPA was approved by the MPO on March 23, 2006.
- The USCG issued a FONSI on April 4, 2006, and an Environmental Assessment (EA) on April 15, 2006.
- Final Design completed on January 31, 2008.
- Construction begins March 2009.
- Revenue Operations First Quarter of 2012.

**CURRENT STATUS:** MDT staff finalized the determination of apparent low bidder, initiated negotiations and continued Construction Award Recommendation process.

### Issues/Highlight Fourth Quarter (October – December, 2008)

- MDT held a second meeting with the apparent low bidder on October 10, 2008, completed negotiations and continued Construction Award Recommendation process.
- The MDX/MDT Joint Use Agreement (JUA) was approved by the BCC on October 07, 2008 and by CITT on October 29, 2008.
- CSXT Flagging Agreement was approved by TC on October 15. 2008, by CITT Project and Finance Review Committee approval on October 16, 2008 and Full CITT on December 18, 2008.
- The 2nd supplemental agreement to the URS contract for Post-Design Services was approved by TC on September 10, 2008, by BCC on October 7, 2008, by CITT Project and Finance Review Committee on October 16, 2008. and by Full CITT on October 29, 2008;
- Parcel 501: The County Attorney's Office (CAO) Negotiated Settlement agreement was approved by BCC on November 20, 2008 and Full CITT on December 18, 2008.
- Parcel 155: The County Attorney's Office (CAO) Negotiated Settlement agreement was approved by BCC on December 16, 2008.

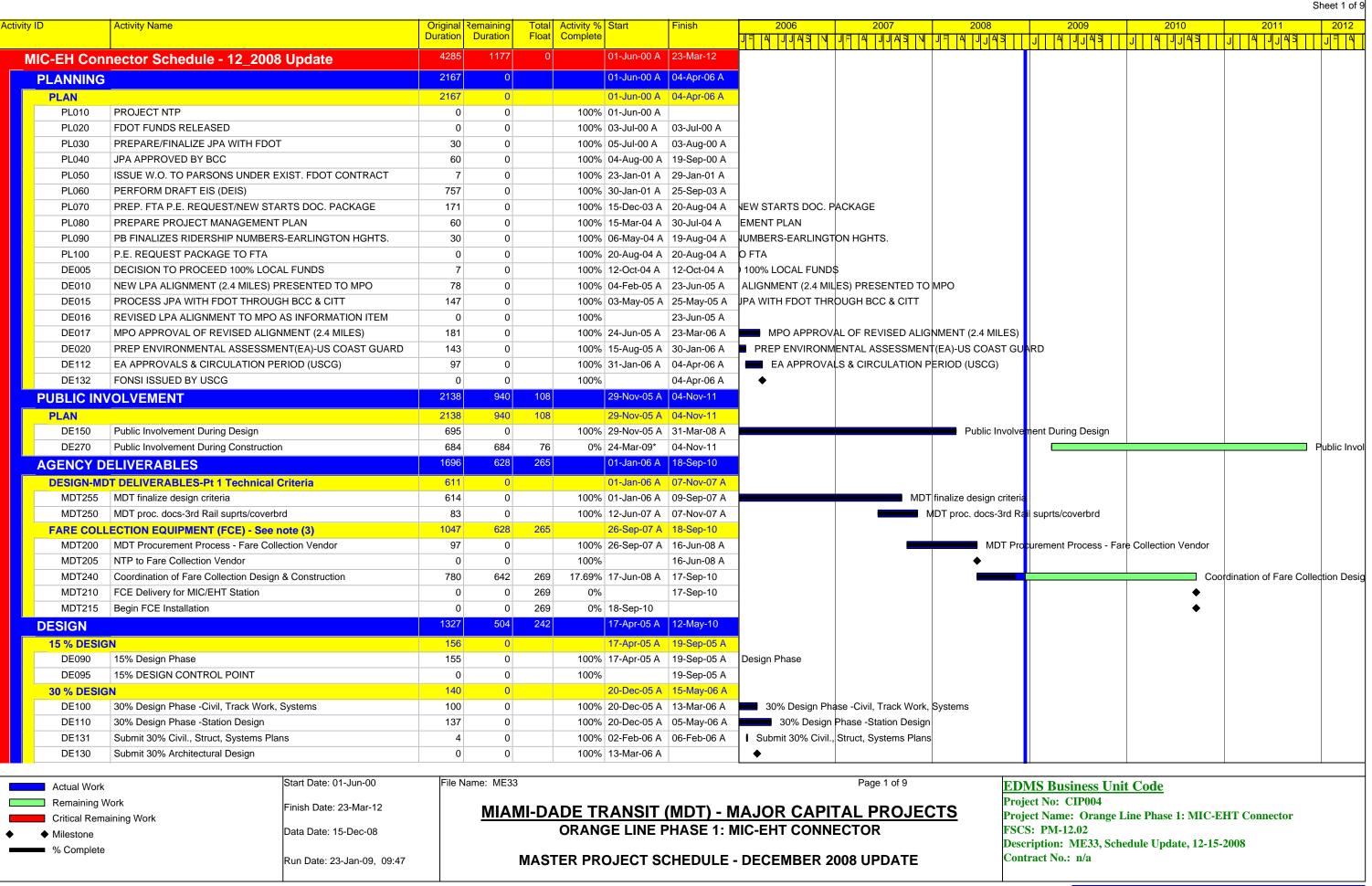

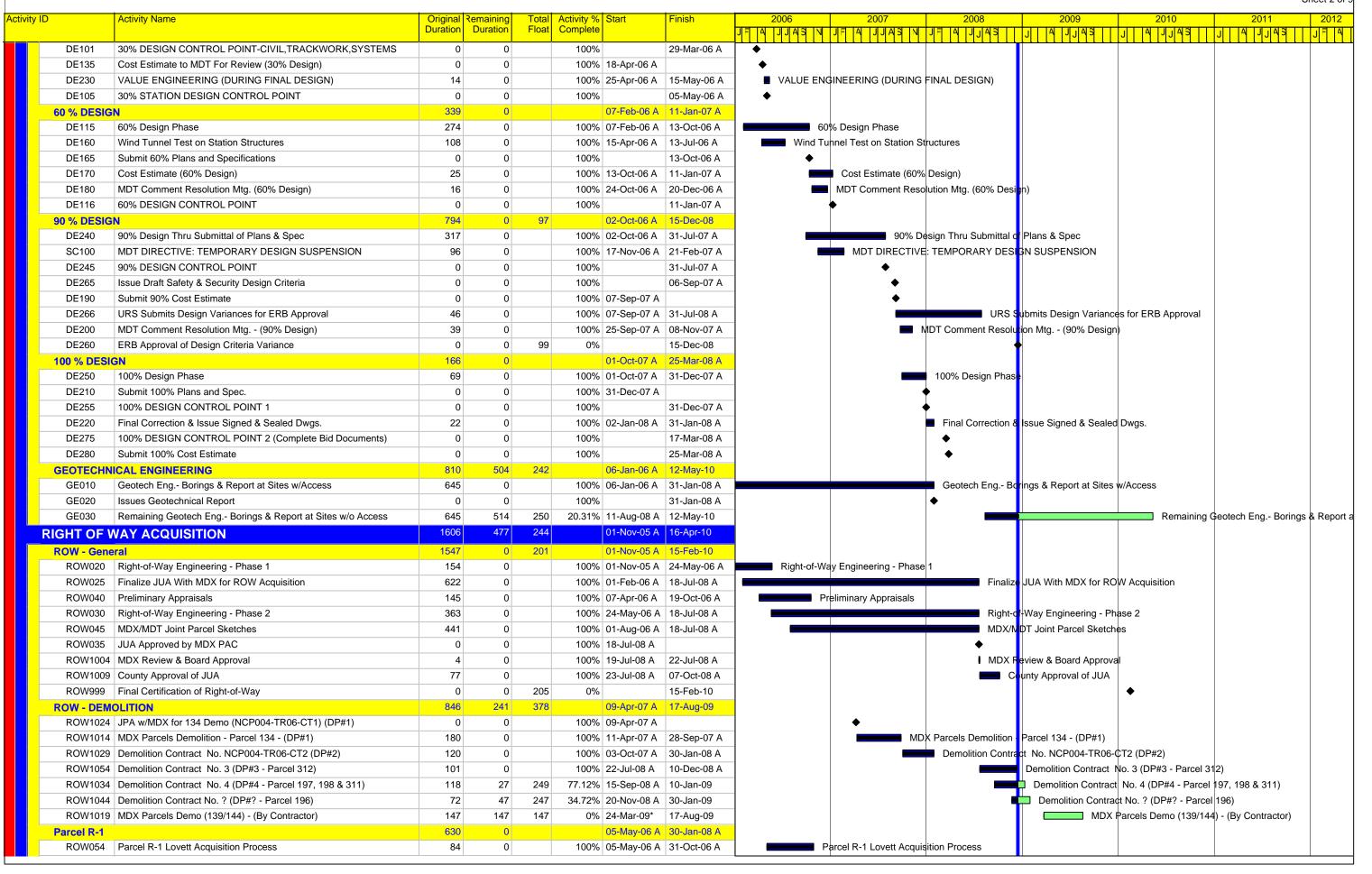

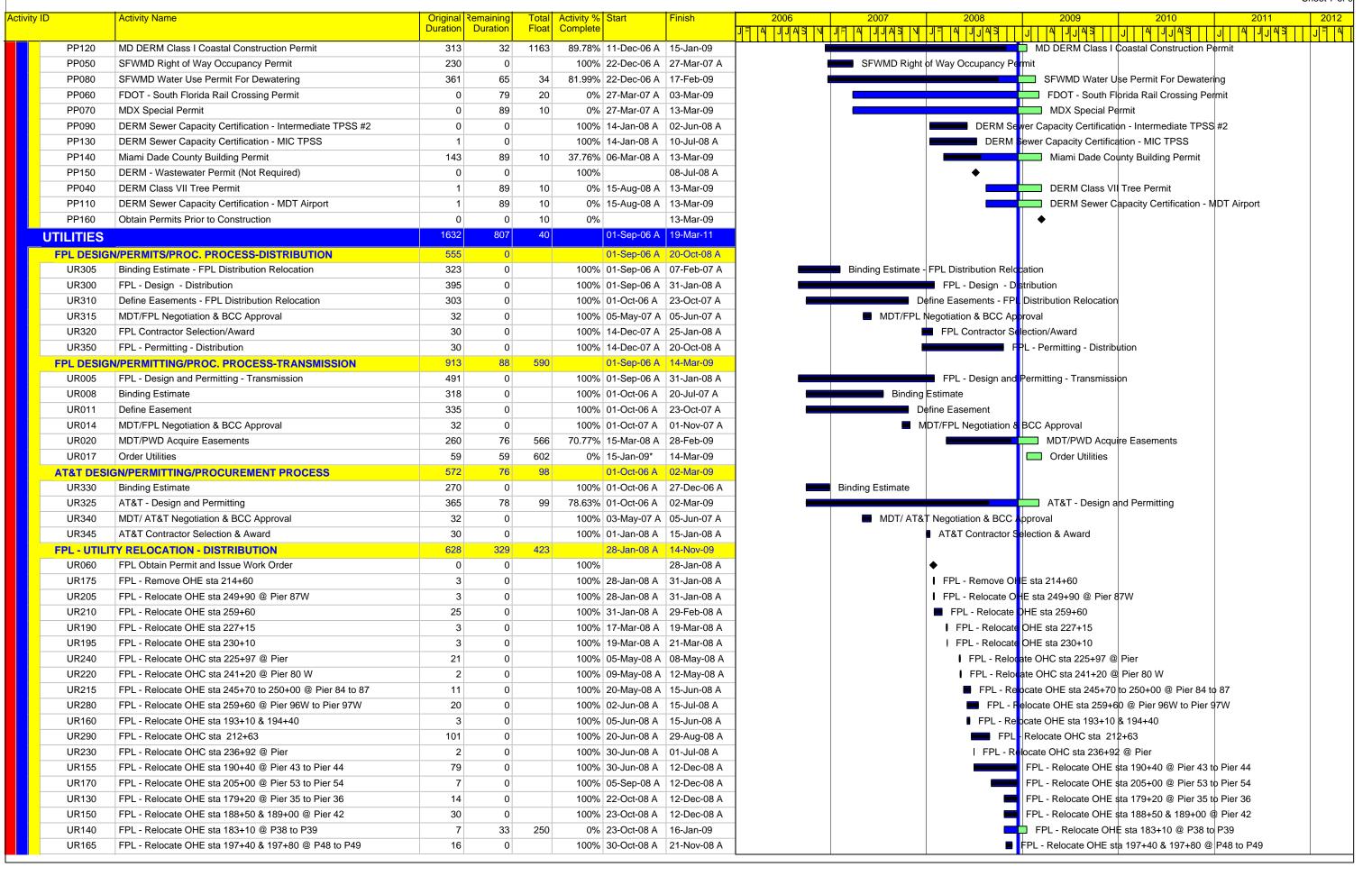

CURRENT STATUS: The design plans for New Starts Preliminary Engineering (NSPE) and the Systems Design/Furnish/Install Procurement have been advanced to a level necessary to adequately define the project scope, cost and schedule. The NSPE plans were submitted to the FTA/PMOC in April 2008 and a preliminary Risk Assessment has been undertaken by the PMOC. A stop work order has been issued to PTG, the corridor design consultant, until the Financial Plan issues are resolved. FTA approved the FONSI for the SEA on November 7, 2008. A Transit Summit was hosted by Miami Dade County on November 15, 2008 to address the financial plan issues with the public. A transit alternatives scope is being developed to determine a path forward. Informally advised of a "Medium-low" FY 2010 rating from FTA after December 2008.

## Item 8 - Operations - Metrorail Vehicle Procurement

## **Vehicle Rehabilitation Project**

 Best and Final Offer (BAFO) proposals in response to RFP 439 for the rehabilitation of the 136 Metrorail Vehicles were received on April 7, 2006 from Bombardier, Ansaldobreda, and CAF. Upon completion of evaluation of the three proposals, the results were as follows:

> Bombardier – 795.49 points CAF USA – 786.95 points Ansaldobreda – 744.26 points.

- Negotiation meetings with the top ranked proposer, Bombardier Transportation, concluded on November 1, 2006 and Bombardier submitted their final price offer of \$274,495,000 (or \$2.018 million per vehicle) by letter dated November 8, 2006.
- After a careful review of the results of the negotiations, a thorough assessment of
  the marketplace in regard to new versus rehabilitated vehicles was undertaken.
  Factors considered in this analysis include: the impact on existing service; the
  need for additional new vehicles for the planned Metrorail extensions; market
  options for providing the County the best rail service possible; a life cycle cost
  comparison of new versus rehabilitated vehicles; and cost factors related to
  maintenance and parts inventory.
- The result of the above noted analysis clearly showed that the procurement of new vehicles in lieu of rehabilitation would represent the best value procurement option for the County. A request to reject all proposals received in response to RFP 439 was approved by the Board on March 18, 2008.

#### **New Vehicle Procurement Project**

- On May 6, 2008 by Resolution R-488-08 (attached), the Board approved a PTP amendment to purchase 136 new Metrorail vehicles in lieu of rehabilitation of the existing vehicles.
- The RFP documents (technical specifications, RFP and General Provisions) for the new vehicle purchase have been developed by the consultant, Washington Division of URS, Miami Dade Transit and the Department of Procurement Management, in consultation with the County Attorney's Office.
- The technical specifications have undergone intensive review by various parties in the transit industry and incorporates recommendations received and accepted through these reviews.
- The technical specifications were released for industry review in March 2008.
   Among others, comments were received from Alstom, Bombardier, Kawasaki,

Siemens, Sojitz, Sumitomo and Wabtec. The project team also met with several car builders and subsystem suppliers to address various vehicle design concepts to reduce vehicle costs. Comments to the specifications were also received from the FTA's Project Management Oversight Consultant (PMOC) and MDT's Project Management Consultants (PMC).

- A Value Engineering (VE) study was conducted September 22-26, 2008 by the consulting firm of Lea + Elliott Inc selected through the Equitable Distribution Program through MDC's Office of Capital Improvement. Recommendations were submitted in a draft report.
- A Peer Review was conducted October 20-23, 2008 by the American Public Transportation Association (APTA). The Peer Review participants included persons from APTA, The Bay Area Rapid Transit (BART), the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority (WMATA), and New York City Transit (NYCT). The Peer Review Team presented findings/recommendations at the exit interview and a final report has been received.
- The 98% revised draft RFP 654 documents incorporating comments and recommendations from all of the above reviews was posted on the County's website in December 2008.

#### **KEY FEATURES OF THE NEW VEHICLE RFP**

- The Request For Proposals (RFP) will be for the purchase of 144 new heavy rail vehicles that will consist of 136 vehicles to replace the existing Metrorail fleet as approved by the Board on May 6, 2008, and 8 vehicles to support revenue operations on the Miami Intermodal Center-Earlington Heights (MIC/EHT) extension. The RFP incorporates procurement principles of best value through a full and open competitive process. It places a "cap" on the procurement of \$2.419 million per vehicle. The per vehicle price was developed by MDT in September 2007, which considered a detailed analysis of the costs for the vehicle shell and subsystems at that time, and cost factors related to rail service delivery.
- A combination of Surtax and state funds are anticipated for the 144 vehicle purchase. The procurement will, however, be in accordance with all Federal guidelines.
- The RFP includes the requirement for proposers to submit a Proposal Guarantee Deposit/Proposal Security Bond. All proposals shall be accompanied by a Certified Check, Cashier's Check, Irrevocable Letter of Credit or Proposal Bond in the amount of \$3,480,000 (approximately 1% of the contract value for the base purchase) payable to Miami-Dade Board of County Commissioners, and conditioned upon the successful Proposer executing a contract in accordance with the terms of this RFP and the proposal submitted. This proposal guarantee is being secured in case of failure or refusal by the selected contractor to execute a contract in the form and manner required by the County. In the event of such failure, the Proposal Security will be forfeited.

- ► The Evaluation/Selection Committee ("Committee") will be composed of senior county staff members with appropriate backgrounds and up to two outside industry subject matter experts.
- The RFP requires the Contractor to decommission and dispose of the County's existing heavy rail fleet (136 vehicles). Such work would include removing the vehicles from County property and disposing of them in any number of legal methods; including sale of parts or scrap, and sale of the vehicle(s) in whole, or disposal of the vehicles in a legal manner. Any sale of the vehicle, parts or scrap will be subject to an agreed upon revenue sharing plan.

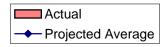

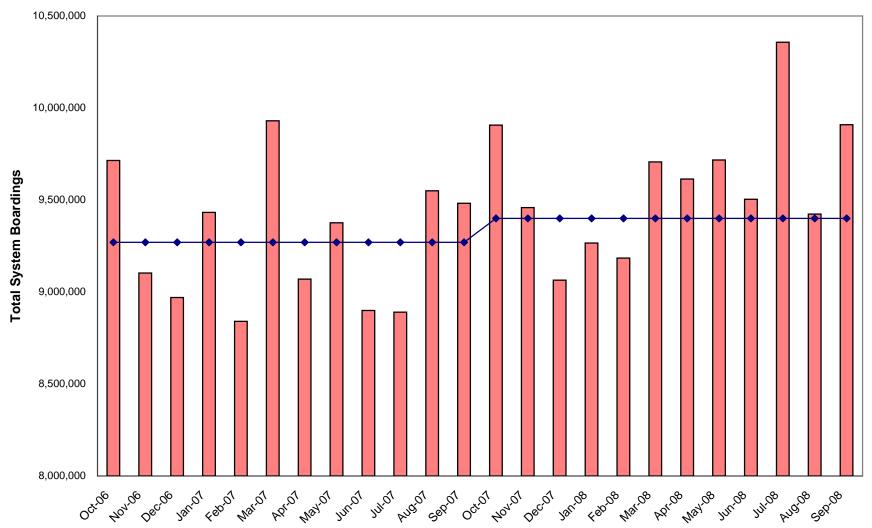

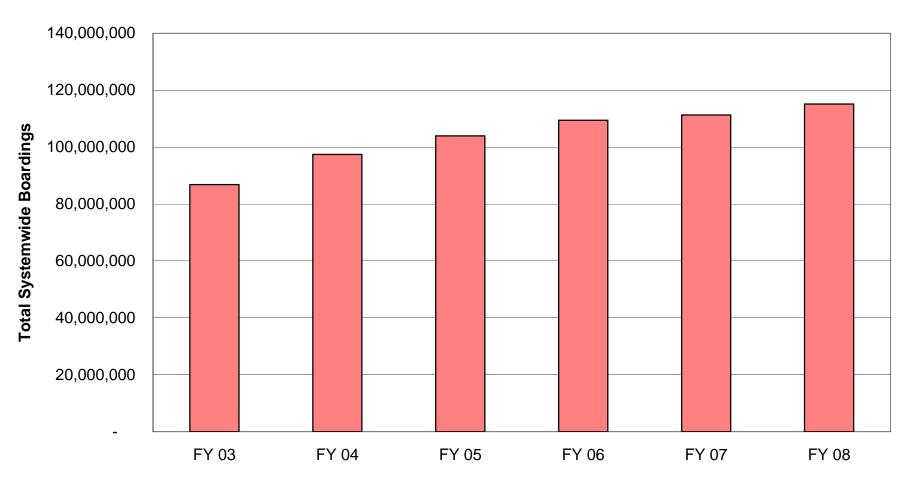

## Miami-Dade Transit Total FY 07 & 08 Systemwide Boardings Actual Versus Projected





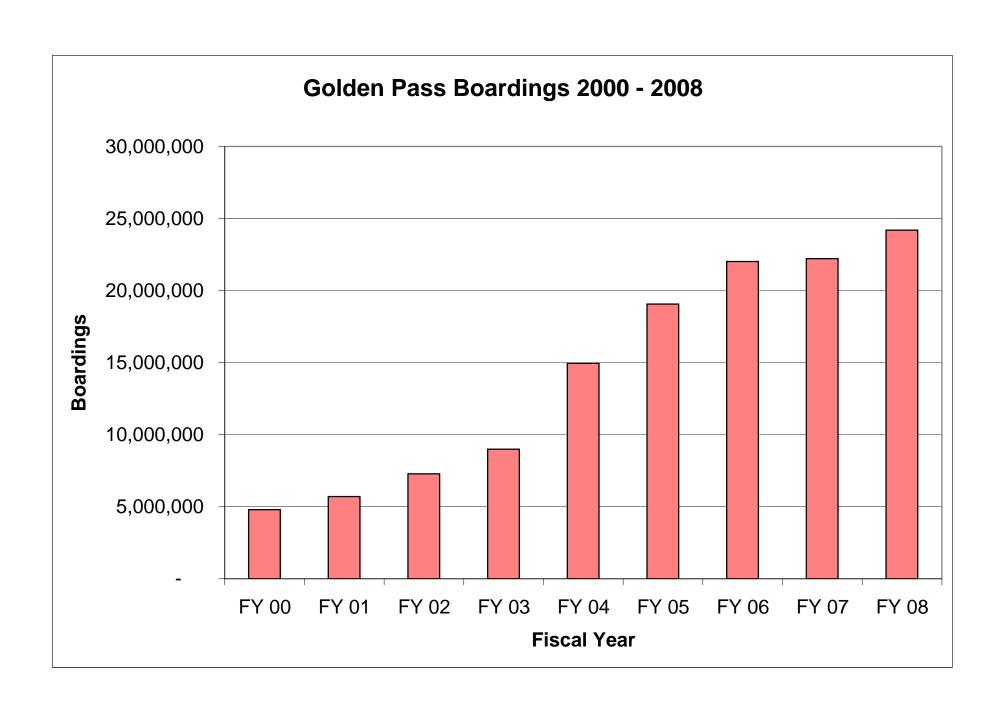
# Miami-Dade Transit Total Systemwide Boardings FY 03 - FY 08

# Office of Civil Rights & Labor Relations

### Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Compliance –1st Quarter FY 2009 Performance Report

Goal: To ensure that customers with disabilities have equal access and full participation in MDT's programs, services, and activities.

#### ADA Title I - Reasonable Accommodation Requests (RAR):

During the first reporting period of fiscal year 2009, 12 requests for accommodation were processed under the
applicable provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), Title I. As shown in Exhibit 1, requests for
accommodation experienced 11 points (48%) decrease during this reporting period in comparison with the first
quarter of fiscal year 2008.

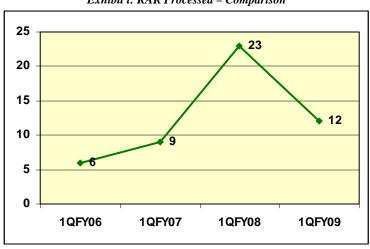


Exhibit t: RAR Processed - Comparison

#### **Special Transportation Service (STS) Appeals**

 As shown in Exhibit 2, 28 STS appeals requests were processed during the first reporting period of fiscal year 2009, which exceeds by one point the number of appeal requests processed in the first quarter of fiscal year 2008.

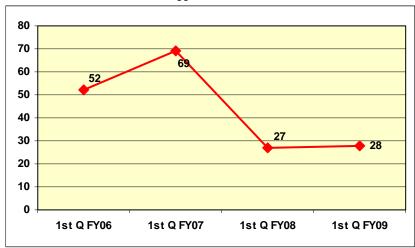


Exhibit 2: Total STS Appeals Processed

#### **Bus Stop Announcements and Route Identification Efforts**

• The Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Quarterly Bus Stop Announcements Assessment was conducted from 9/6/08 through 9/17/08. The sampling of "Secret Shoppers" Survey Reports indicates that MDT has achieved a cumulative 78% percent adherence to the ADA Bus Stop Announcements and Passenger/Vehicle Identification Efforts requirements during the fourth quarter of fiscal year 08. As shown in Exhibit 3, this is a 12 point increase from the 66% percent adherence to the Bus Stop Announcements and Passenger/Vehicle Identification Efforts requirements achieved during the first quarter of fiscal year 2008.

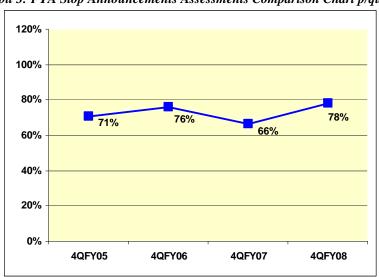


Exhibit 3: FTA Stop Announcements Assessments Comparison Chart p/quarter

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 As shown in Exhibit 4, the Central Garage achieved a greater compliance with the Stop Announcements and Route Identification requirements. Automatic voice annunciator system (AVAS) announced 94% percent of the bus stops required to be announced.

- On October 29, 2008, staff provided MDT Budget and Finance Performance with information regarding the Department of Transportation (DOT) ADA requirements when a customer using a mobility aid cannot board the bus due to an inoperable lift or ramp.
- On October 30, 2008, staff completed the review of the Conceptual Design of the Dadeland South Comfort Station.
   Comments were sent to appropriate staff for response and corrective measures.
- On November 3, 2008, MDT Procurement and Contracts was provided with information regarding MDT Quarterly Transit Operator Performance Audit Services requirements for Budget and Finance Approval.
- On November 4, 2008, staff processed a complaint regarding Special Transportation Service (STS) certification. Complaint and comments were sent to appropriate staff for review and corrective action.
- On November 4, 2008, staff made necessary arrangements for the provision of American Sign Language Interpreting Services for the People's Transportation Plan Summit to be held on November 15, 2008.
- On November 10, 2008, staff forwarded to appropriate staff the list of randomly selected routes to be monitored in December 2008 to ensure compliance with the Bus Stop Announcements and Route identification Efforts requirements.
- On November 14, 2008, a review of the presentation of the Electronic Signage Information System (ESIS) project
  was conducted. Findings were sent to appropriate staff for review and corrective measures. On December 22,
  2008, ESIS project was presented to the Commission on Disabilities Issues (CODI) for input and in compliance with
  public participation requirements.
- On November 19, 2008, staff sent to Dean Perkins and Debora Cabrera from the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) a request for pedestrian crossing signals at NW 186<sup>TH</sup> Street and NW 73<sup>RD</sup> Avenue. The pedestrian crossing signals are required at this uncontrolled intersection in order to assist customers with disabilities and elderly customers to access the bus stops from the new Park and Ride Facility.
- On November 20, 2008, staff sent to Systems Maintenance the list of buses identified as running with non-working AVAS during the quarterly assessment of the Bus Stop Announcements and Route Identification Efforts

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requirements conducted in September 2008. All identified buses were checked and repaired by December 12, 2008.

- On December 3, 2008, staff conducted an assessment of the Busway System and the new P&R Facility serving the Busway station at SW 236<sup>TH</sup> Street. Preliminary findings were sent to appropriate staff for response and corrective measures.
