

- Miami-Dade Transit is the largest transit department in Florida. It provides more than 50 percent of the trips taken on transit in the state. Over 800 buses provide service on more than 90 bus routes every day.
- Through hands-on training, learn the necessary skills to drive state-of-the-art buses and how to provide excellent customer service.
- Work in a safe environment. Our high-tech buses are equipped with surveillance cameras, a Global Positioning System that identifies the location of buses at all times, radio communication, and other technology that ensures a comfortable and safe ride.

What do I need to apply?

- A high school diploma or a General Education Diploma (GED).

- Photo identification, such as a Florida driver's license.
