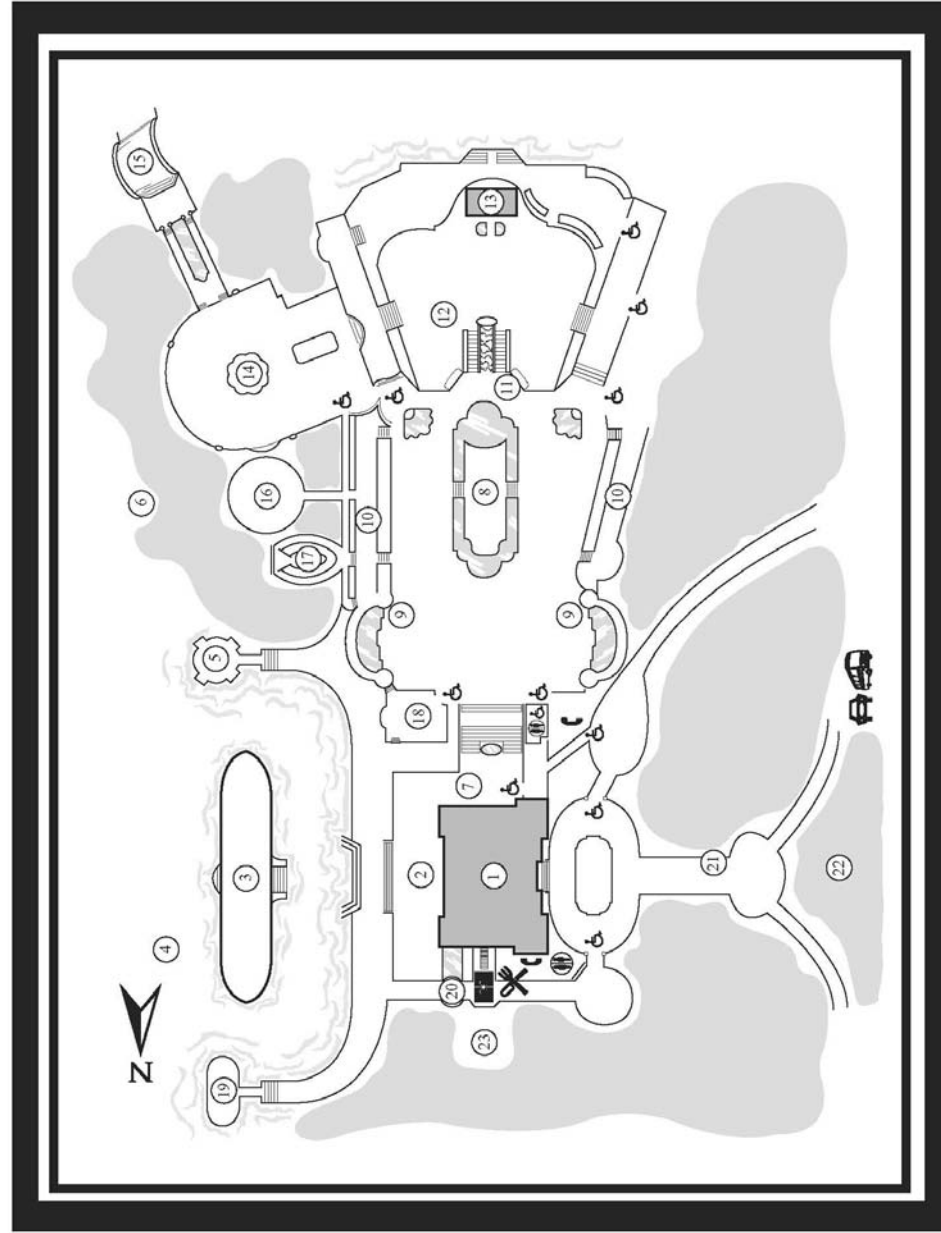

School Group Guidelines & Behavior



We appreciate your cooperation to help us preserve Vizcaya!

By reserving a school tour or self-guided visit as school personnel or a volunteer chaperone you have agreed to abide by all museum guidelines and procedures, which ultimately serve to protect our visitors and the museum.

- If at anytime Security Officers or other staff witness behavior that puts the group, other visitors, the estate or collection at risk, you may be asked to leave the premises and forfeit the remainder of your museum experience.
- Groups that do not meet student and chaperone expectations may not be confirmed for future tours.

Vizcaya is special due to its status as a National Historic Landmark.

- Please be aware and cautious of the many steps and uneven floors and terrain throughout Vizcaya's Main House, gardens, and grounds.

Stay with your group.

- No running is permitted inside the Main House.
- Teachers and chaperones are responsible for the supervision of students at all times in any area of the estate, inside and outside, during guided or self-guided visits.

Vizcaya welcomes a diversity of visitors throughout each day, everyday.

- The Museum is open to the public during all school programs and we ask your cooperation to support these guidelines to ensure all visitors enjoy their museum experience.
- Vizcaya requires that self-guided groups yield to scheduled activities taking place indoors or outdoors at the time of their self-guided visit.

Photographs and videos are not permitted in the Main House

- This includes still photography as well as video photography for the benefit of other visitors and to protect our collections. Visitors to Vizcaya are welcome to take photographs or videos in the gardens only.

Visitors may not touch museum objects.

- Keep an arm's length between you and any object. Because even clean hands have oils on them, no visitors may touch the art and objects in the museum.
- Please be mindful of the fragile nature of the whole house and gardens as historic objects. Do not lean or climb on doors, gates, stanchions, walls, or wall fabrics. Do not stand or sit on statuary, fountains, or railings.
- **The outdoor gardens are also part of the museum, and are different from a playground or a park.**
- Please do not touch the statuary or architecture, including garden gates.
- When walking through the gardens and grounds please remain on the stone, gravel or dirt pathways at all times.
- Please do not move any plants or pick any flowers while visiting the gardens.
- It is permissible to congregate students and sit on low walls, such as those surrounding the Center Island in the formal gardens.

Backpacks are not allowed in the Main House.

- Vizcaya does not have a bag check. Please leave backpacks at school or on the bus.

Food and drinks (including gum and water bottles) are not allowed in the Main House.

- Picnic lunches stowed in boxes or coolers may be stored inside the Main House until the group is ready for lunch. Security officers or Volunteer Guides can direct you to this storage area upon entry of the Main House.

We appreciate your cooperation to help us preserve Vizcaya.

- Security officers are located throughout the Museum and grounds. Security officers may travel with tours to help visitors remember our guidelines and to help groups move through the Museum and estate efficiently. Security officers may also be called upon for assistance in the event of an emergency.

Vizcaya welcomes teachers and students to engage in art activities in the Main House and Gardens.

- Sketching and painting outdoors is permitted.
- When sketching indoors, only graphite pencils are permitted to safeguard the house and collection.
- No sprayed materials, permanent markers or electrical tools are permitted.
- No rubbings should be performed on any statuary or architectural features.
- Vizcaya Museum and Gardens reserves the right to prohibit any materials security officers or staff deem unsafe for the public, estate or collection.
