July is Smart Irrigation Month

Outdoor irrigation accounts for up to 50 percent of water use in Florida, and up to 50 percent of the water applied to lawns is lost to evaporation. To conserve as much of our precious water as

possible, we must be vigilant especially when watering our lawns to make every drop count.

For this reason, the Irrigation Association has named July "Smart Irrigation Month." This July, take a few minutes to identify ways that you and your family can become more water efficient and still maintain beautiful yards and landscaping. One such way to save water and money is to take advantage of the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department's free evaluations of single family homes and large property irrigation systems, which provide recommendations to improve your yard and reduce water use.

Rebates can be earned if recommendations are implemented as a part of the Landscape Irrigation Rebate Program. The evaluation will detail to the property owner how to make their irrigation system more water-efficient.

Homeowners who implement the recommendations and provide verification

of the retrofits will gualify for up to \$500 in rebates, per fiscal year for up to five years. Homeowners do not need to implement all recommendations at once to be eligible for rebates.

They can implement the retrofits for what works best for their system and their budget.

Based on the IBM Watson program, WASD implemented a virtual intelligence chat feature that is available to customers 24 hours a day. This chat feature allows customers

to request bill pay extensions, receive general department information and provides direct weblinks to payment option functions and WASD Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs).

Being able to complete these simple requests without having to speak to a WASD representative, decreases phone wait time and allows for employees to assist customers with more complex questions.

the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department (WASD) earned eight National **Association of Counties** (NACo) Awards out of the 38 awarded to Miami-Dade County, which was the most wins of any County in the state of Florida? Of the eight, five of the awards were submitted under the category of Information Technology of the County's 15 wins in this group, which was the most wins of any County in the nation. After further review and consideration, two of WASD's winning submissions received additional recognition by meeting the high criteria of the organization's designation of being a 100 Brilliant Ideas at Work initiative. Both of these submissions revolved around customer service, a topic the department strives to improve upon daily.



WASD's CIP continues to progress and improve Miami-Dade County's infrastructure

WASD is more than half way through its fourth year of the largest Capital Improvement Program (CIP) in County history and continues to make great strides that will improve service delivery, fire suppression capabilities, as well as water conservation. These improvements and upgrades will allow for future population growth and takes into consideration projections for sea-level rise and storm surge.

So far WASD has:

- invested in more than \$772 million worth of projects and upgrades within the first three years of the CIP
- created nearly \$1.1 billion in assets for the department
- completed 775 projects on time or ahead of established deadlines
- 861 projects in various states of progress.
