The Biscayne Bay Water Quality Characterization and Pollution Reduction, Phase II, Miami Dade County (MDC) Project Scope of Work for this contract consists of furnishing all supervision, labor, materials, tools, equipment and performing all operations required to construct the work in accordance with the contract documents.</p> <p>Work includes but is not limited to the construction and installation of drainage structures, drainage stormwater treatment systems, regrading swale, miscellaneous drainage improvements, driveway restoration, grading, sodding, and miscellaneous roadway restoration including construction of concrete curb and gutters, and sidewalks where needed, in accordance with the construction plans and specifications.</p> <p>The Contractor shall abide by all conditions set forth on all the approved permits from Federal, State, and Local governments that pertain to this project.</p> <p>The five (5) proposed sites are located at:</p> <p>Project Site #1 - NW 32nd Avenue from NW 99th Street to NW 106th Street</p> <p>The proposed improvements consist of installing one (1) Ecovault structure by EcoSense International and twenty-five (25) SOP Filter Baskets designed to remove solids, Total Nitrogen (TN), Total Phosphorus (TP) and bacteria from stormwater runoff prior to discharge to the Little River C-7 Canal.</p> <p>Project Site #2 - NW 22nd Avenue from NW 94th Street to NW 105th Terrace</p> <p>The proposed improvements consist of installing forty (40) Stormwater Curb Inlet Screens by SOP Technologies and one (1) Jellyfish Filter designed to remove solids, Total Nitrogen (TN), Total Phosphorus (TP) and bacteria from stormwater runoff prior to discharge to the Little River C-7 Canal.</p> <p>Project Site #3 - NW 17th Avenue from NW 89th Street to NW 98th Street</p> <p>The proposed improvements consist of installing one (1) Hydro DryScreen structure and thirty-nine (39) Stormwater Curb Inlet Screens designed to remove solids, Total Nitrogen (TN), Total Phosphorus (TP) and bacteria from stormwater runoff prior to discharge to the Little River C-7 Canal.</p> <p>Project Site #4 - NW 12th Avenue from NW 88th Street to NW 83rd Street, and NW 83rd Street from NW 15th Avenue to NW 12th Avenue</p>						

The proposed improvements consist of installing forty-four (44) StormBasin filters designed to remove solids, Total Nitrogen (TN), Total Phosphorus (TP) and bacteria from stormwater runoff prior to discharge to the Little River C-7 Canal.

Project Site #5 - North Miami Avenue from NW 71st Street to NW 91st Street

The proposed improvements consist of installing forty (40) Stormwater Curb Inlet Screens and six (6) Stormwater Filter Baskets by SOP Technologies and two (2) Ecovault structures by EcoSense International designed to remove solids, Total Nitrogen (TN), Total Phosphorus (TP) and bacteria from stormwater runoff prior to discharge to the Little River C-7 Canal.

The proposed work must be performed by qualified personnel and in a professional and workmanlike manner in accordance with industry standards and practices.

DISCLOSURE:

- Contractor shall indemnify and hold harmless the County and its officers, employees, agents and instrumentalities from any and all liability, losses or damages, including attorneys' fees and costs of defense, which the County or its officers, employees, agents or instrumentalities may incur as a result of claims, demands, suits, causes of actions or proceedings of any kind or nature arising out of, relating to or resulting from the performance of this Agreement by the Contractor or its employees, agents, servants, partners principals or subcontractors. Contractor shall pay all claims and losses in connection therewith and shall investigate and defend all claims, suits or actions of any kind or nature in the name of the County, where applicable, including appellate proceedings, and shall pay all costs, judgments, and attorney's fees which may issue thereon. Contractor expressly understands and agrees that any insurance protection required by this Agreement or otherwise provided by the Contractor shall in no way limit the responsibility to indemnify, keep and save harmless and defend the County or its officers, employees, agents and instrumentalities as herein provided.

The Contractor shall furnish to **Regulatory and Economic Resources, Water Management Division, 701 NW 1 CT 5th Floor, Miami FI 33136**, Certificate(s) of Insurance which indicate that insurance coverage has been obtained which meets the requirements as outlined below:

- A.** Worker's Compensation Insurance for all employees of the Contractor as required by Florida Statute 440.
 - a. If applicable should include coverage required under the U.S. Longshoremen and Harbor Workers' Act (USL&H) and/or Jones Act for any activities on or about navigable water.
- B.** Commercial General Liability in an amount not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence, and \$2,000,000 in the aggregate. Miami-Dade County must be shown as an additional insured with respect to this coverage.
- C.** Automobile Liability Insurance covering all owned, non-owned and hired vehicles used in connection with the work, in an amount not less than \$1,000,000 combined single limit per occurrence for bodily injury and property damage.

*Under no circumstances are Contractors permitted on the Aviation Department, Aircraft Operating Airside (A.O.A) at Miami International Airport without increasing automobile coverage to \$5 million. Only vehicles owned or leased by a company will be authorized. \$1 million limit applies at all other airports.

- 7360 RPQs are NOT SBE-Con 100% Set-aside solicitation, however the RPQ may be assigned a SBE-Con Trade set-aside and goal. The SBE-Con Trade-aside and goal if applicable will be will be stipulated on the RPQ and the Invitation to Bid or in the Project's Solicitation Documents.
- All Prime Contractors submitting a bid for RPQ/Project with a Small Business Measures (s) MUST submit the Small Business Development "CERTIFICATE OF ASSURANCE" form properly completed, signed and notarized with their bid document at the time of Bid Submittal. FAILURE TO SUBMIT THE REQUIRED CERTIFICATE OF ASSURANCE FORM AT THE TIME OF BID SUBMISSION SHALL RENDER THE BID NON COMPLIANT TO THE CONTRACT REQUIREMENT AND SECTION 10.33.02 OF THE CODE OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY.
- 7360 RPQs Federally Funded may be subject to the Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Program. The DBE goal will be stipulated on the RPQ and the Invitation to Bid or in the Project's Solicitation Documents.
- 7040 and 7360 RPQs with an estimated project value in excess of \$700,000.00 may be assigned a Small Business Enterprise Goods (SBE-G) or Small Business Services (SBE-S) program goal. The SBE-G or SBE-S goal if applicable will be will be stipulated on the RPQ and the Invitation to Bid or in the Project's Solicitation Documents.
- All RPQs with an estimated project value \$100,000 or above are subject to Responsible Wage Rates. The wage rate will be stipulated on the RPQ and the Invitation to Bid or in the Project's Solicitation Documents.
- All Projects, where price (Proposals/Bids) received are in excess of \$200,000 will require the submission of the Payment and Performance Bond as required by State of Florida Statute.

VERIFICATION OF EMPLOYMENT ELIGIBILITY (E-VERIFY):

By entering the Contract, the Awarded Bidder becomes obligated to comply with the provisions of Section 448.095, Florida Statute, titled "Verification of Employment Eligibility." This includes but is not limited to utilization of the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's E-Verify System to verify the employment eligibility of all newly hired employees by the Awarded Bidder effective, January 1, 2021, and requiring all Subcontractors to provide an affidavit attesting that the Subcontractor does not employ, contract with, or subcontract with, an unauthorized alien. Failure to comply may lead to termination of this Awarded Bidder, or if a Subcontractor knowingly violates the statute, the subcontract must be terminated immediately. Any challenge to termination under this provision must be filed in the Circuit Court no later than twenty (20) calendar days after the date of termination. If this Contract is terminated for a violation of the statute by the Awarded Bidder, the Awarded

Bidder may not be awarded a public contract for a period of one year after the date of termination, and the Awarded Bidder may be liable for any additional costs incurred by the County resulting from the termination of the Contract. Public and private employers must enroll in the E-Verify System (<http://www.uscis.gov/e-verify>) and retain the I-9 Forms for inspection.
