Subject: Resolution Authorizing Award of Competitive Contracts

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners approve the attached award of competitive contracts, rejection of bids, and contract modifications with authority to exercise options-to-renew.

Contract amounts and department allocations represent the maximum spending authority based on past utilization. This action does not guarantee that the total contract amount/value will be expended by County departments and/or agencies.

Scope

The impact of the items in the accompanying Award of Competitive Contracts Package is countywide in nature.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

Funding will be expended only if departmental budgets can support the expenditures approved in their Resource Allocation Plan adopted annually by the Board. There is no additional fiscal impact beyond what is stated on the individual items in this package. Allocations have been rounded consistent with standard auditing practices.

Track Record/Monitor

There are no known performance issues with the vendors recommended for award in the Award of Competitive Contracts Package. Each department's contract manager is reflected in the Award of Competitive Contracts Package.

Delegated Authority

If this item is approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee will have the authority to exercise, in their discretion, subsequent options-to-renew (OTR) and extend contracts for purchase of goods and services in accordance with the terms and conditions of the each contract.

Background

Section 1 AWARD OF COMPETITIVE BIDS

The contracts listed in this section are being recommended for award to the responsive, responsible bidder(s) who met the requirements of the respective solicitation.

Item 1.1: Quicklime is to award this contract for purchase and delivery of quicklime for the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department. The amount being requested is **\$63,000,000**. If the County chooses to exercise the one, five-year option-to-renew period, the cumulative value is \$126,000,000.

Item 1.2: Repair, Replace, Purchase, and Install Awnings and Canopies, Pre-qualification of Vendors is to award this contract to repair, replace, purchase, and install awnings and canopies for various County departments. The amount being requested is **\$2,462,500**.

Item 1.3: Removal, Installation, Repair, Maintenance, and Testing of Service Station Equipment and Fuel Storage Facilities is to award this contract to supply removal, installation, repair, maintenance, and testing of service station equipment and fuel storage supplies for various County departments. The amount being requested is **\$16,007,000**. If the County chooses to exercise the one, five-year option-to-renew period, the cumulative value is \$32,014,000.

Section 2 REJECTED BIDS

A bid may be rejected when adverse conditions exist such as the proposal not conforming to the specifications and/or solicitation documents, insufficient financial resources, technical ability, physical capacity and/or skill of the vendor, unfair and unreasonable pricing, insufficient competition and for any other cause in the best interest of the County.

There are no items for this section.

Section 3 COMPETITIVE CONTRACT MODIFICATIONS

A competitive contract modification is an award of a supplemental allocation for goods or services within the scope of the original contract award.

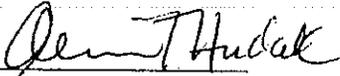
Item 3.1: Janitorial Services for Miami-Dade Transit's Metrorail Systems is to modify this contract to provide the Miami-Dade Transit Department additional time and spending authority to purchase janitorial services for Metrorail and Metromover stations and various Miami-Dade Transit buildings. The additional amount being requested is **\$2,487,000**.

Item 3.2: Cleaning Services for South Dade Bus Way Stations is to modify this contract to provide the Miami-Dade Transit Department additional time and spending authority to purchase cleaning services for various bus way stations and Park and Ride lots throughout the County. The additional amount being requested is **\$173,000**.

Item 3.3: Repair Services for Shop Equipment and Tools, Pre-qualification of Vendors is to modify this contract to add an allocation funded by MDT Operating

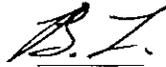

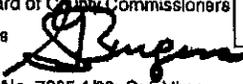

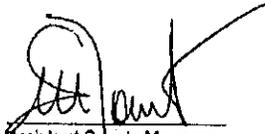

BACKGROUND

This replacement contract is for purchase and delivery of quicklime in truck and railcar loads for the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department. Quicklime is a chemical used in the treatment of potable water. The allocation for the five year term is consistent with the current allocation.

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On a daily basis, an average of 320 million gallons of raw water is treated by the Hialeah/Preston and Alexander Orr Water Treatment Plants. The proposed contract allocation is necessary because the Miami-Dade Water and Sewer Department must purchase 130 to 160 tons of quicklime daily for three treatment plants. The amount of quicklime purchased daily may increase between 290 to 350 tons when either the lime kiln at Hialeah/Preston or Alexander Orr is taken out of service due to scheduled maintenance or unforeseen emergency repairs.

BACKGROUND

This replacement contract is utilized by various County departments for purchase, repair and/or replacement of awnings and canopies. These structures are essential to the Miami-Dade Park and Recreation Department as they are used at various exhibition areas which shelter zoo animals from harsh weather conditions. The canopies and awnings are also installed throughout County parks to provide shade from the sun and rain for visitors.

The Miami-Dade Aviation Department has canopies and awnings throughout their facilities to shield visitors, tenants and employees from inclement weather. These shelters are also installed at the aircraft operating and passenger loading bridge areas assisting in protecting costly equipment such as portable luggage x-ray systems and generators from the environment.

General Services Administration uses these structures at most building entrances and/or walkways managed by the department.

The Seaport Department has numerous canopies and awning structures throughout the Port. These structures are installed at cruise ship terminal drop off and walkway areas, at Customs Border Protection inspection stations, as well as at provision inspection stations.

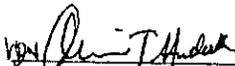

REASON FOR CHANGE

Miami-Dade Transit (Transit) Department is requesting additional time and spending authority to purchase janitorial services until a successor contract is awarded. This contract provides janitorial services for Metrorail and Metromover stations and various Miami-Dade Transit buildings. The additional spending authority will also cover the costs of a 2.12% price adjustment based on changes to the 2010 Living Wage rates.

This contract does not have remaining renewal options. Approval of this contract modification will ensure continuity of services while a successor contract is established. The new contract is expected to be awarded by September 2011. Staff is working with various County department to standardize specifications for the consolidation of several janitorial contracts. The consolidation will improve efficient contract management and ease of contract oversight.
