

Subject: Recommendation for Approval to Award: Acoustic Gunshot Detection Solution



Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners approve award of *Contract No. RFP-00327, Acoustic Gunshot Detection Solution* to ShotSpotter, Inc. for the Miami-Dade Police Department. The Acoustic Gunshot Detection Solution (Solution) will be used by law enforcement to detect gunshots in three (3) high incident geographic zones located within unincorporated Miami-Dade County. The Solution will expedite response times to incidents, assist in the apprehension of suspects, and improve the collection of forensic gunshot evidence. The contract includes hardware and software, hosting services, implementation, installation, reporting, training, customization, and ongoing maintenance and technical support. The contract provides for certified expert witness testimony to help interpret and clarify crime scene activity received from the Solution.

ShotSpotter, Inc.'s qualified professionals will review each acoustic incident detected by the Solution. Once a gunshot incident has been confirmed, notification will be provided to the Police Department's Real Time Crime Center via a secure incident review portal. Information provided by the Solution includes latitude and longitude, street address, the exact time and number of shots fired, shooter position, speed and direction of travel, as well as gunshot incident history and pattern analysis. The Solution will be integrated with the gunshot detection solutions currently utilized by the City of Miami and the City of Miami Gardens.

Scope

The scope of this item is countywide in nature. However, the three (3) gunshot detection zones included in this contract are located within Commission Districts 3 and 9, which are represented by Commissioner Audrey Edmonson and Commissioner Dennis Moss, respectively.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

The fiscal impact for the five (5) year term is \$2,619,000. Should the County choose to exercise, at its sole discretion, the one (1), five-year option to renew, the estimated cumulative value will be \$5,635,994. Staff negotiated all hardware, implementation, setup, installation, and training services free of charge, resulting in a cost avoidance of over \$206,000 from the proposed cost.

Delegated Authority

If this item is approved, the County Mayor or County Mayor’s designee will have the authority to exercise all provisions of the contract pursuant to Section 2-8.1 of the County Code and Implementing Order 3-38, including any cancellation, renewal, and extension provisions.

Vendor Recommended for Award

A Request for Proposals (RFP) was issued under full and open competition on March 10, 2016. The RFP method of award was used to obtain the best value to the County. One (1) proposal was received in response to the solicitation. The Competitive Selection Committee determined that the proposer has the relevant experience, qualifications, and past performance required to successfully perform the services.
