- Resolution approving the City of Miami codesignation of SW 5th Avenue from SW 7th Streetto SW 8th Street as "Azucar Avenue" in honor of Celia Cruz's well-known signature catchphrase, "¡Azúcar!" and Celia Cruz's contributions to Calle Ocho.
- State Road SW 22nd Avenue and SW 8th Street "Celia Cruz Way" does appear in <u>Google Maps</u> and the existence was confirmed with Miami-Dade County Department of Transportation and Public Works.
