



Grant Purposes

A State or unit of local government that receives a Coverdell grant must use the grant for one or more of these three purposes:

1. To carry out all or a substantial part of a program intended to improve the quality and timeliness of forensic science or medical examiner services in the State, including those services provided by laboratories operated by the State and those operated by units of local government within the State.
2. To eliminate a backlog in the analysis of forensic science evidence, including, among other things, a backlog with respect to firearms examination, latent prints, toxicology, controlled substances, forensic pathology, questioned documents, and trace evidence.
3. To train, assist, and employ forensic laboratory personnel as needed to eliminate such a backlog.

What an Application Should Include

NIJ has designated, for requests for competitive funds, the following application elements as critical: program narrative, budget detail worksheet and budget narrative, and **all four** certifications required by the Coverdell law. This letter sets forth the terms of the agreement (the "Agreement") between Miami-Dade County (the "County") and Agilent Technologies (the "Contractor") to contract for the purchase of Forensic Toxicology Analyzers as described in Attachment 1., for the Miami-Dade Medical Examiner in accordance with the terms and conditions as stated herein. This Agreement contains the entire agreement between the parties as to all matters contained herein.

1) Scope of Services

Miami-Dade County, hereafter referred to as the County, as represented by Miami-Dade Medical Examiner (ME) is contracting Automated Gas Chromatograph Mass Spectrometer (GCMS) to improve the screening method for the detection of drugs and poisons in postmortem fluids utilizing specific instruments and testing methodologies.

The GCMS to be purchased shall be a complete, customized system that will significantly improve processing and turnaround time of medical examiner services and eliminate an unreasonable backlog of toxicology cases that buildup each week. The increasing demand placed on the toxicology laboratory each week is overwhelming due to the number of cases involving drugs requiring a comprehensive screen.

3) Term of Agreement:

This Agreement shall commence upon the date of the purchase order and shall remain in effect until such time as all items purchased in conjunction with this Agreement, have been furnished, delivered and accepted by the County's authorized representative.

4) Shipping Terms and Delivery:

Prices offered by Contract are based on F.O.B. destination and shall hold title to the goods until such time as they are delivered to, and accepted by, an authorized County.

The product(s) to be provided hereunder shall be delivered to the County in full compliance with the Scope of Services. If items provided by Contractor are determined to not meet the specifications as stated herein, either prior to acceptance or upon initial inspection, they will be returned at Contractor's expense. At the County's own option, the Contractor shall either provide a direct replacement for the item, or provide a full credit for the returned item. The Contractor shall not assess any additional charge(s) for any conforming action taken by the County under this clause.

5) Method of Payment: Invoice for Delivery:

The date of the invoice shall not exceed thirty (30) calendar days from the delivery of the equipment. Under no circumstances shall the invoice be submitted in advance of the delivery and acceptance of the equipment. In order for the County to provide payment, the Contractor shall submit a fully documented invoice that shall contain the following basic information:

6) Audits:

Pursuant to County Ordinance No. 03-2, the Contractor will grant access to the Commission Auditor to all financial and performance related records, property, and equipment purchased in whole or in part with government funds. The Contractor agrees to maintain an accounting system that provides accounting records that are supported with adequate documentation, and adequate procedures.

7) Termination:

The County may at any time, in its sole discretion, with or without cause, terminate this Agreement by written notice to the Contractor. In the event that the County exercises its right to terminate this Agreement, the Contractor will be compensated as stated in the payment Articles herein for the 1) portion of the Services completed in accordance with the Agreement up to the termination date; and 2) non-cancelable deliverables that are not capable of use except in the performance of this Agreement and has been specifically developed for the sole purpose of this Agreement.

8) Indemnification

Contractor shall indemnify and hold harmless the County and its officers, employees, agents and instrumentalities from any and all liability, losses or damages, including attorneys' fees and costs of defense, which the County or its officers, employees, agents or instrumentalities may incur as a result of claims, demands, suits, causes of actions or proceedings of any kind or nature arising out of, relating to or resulting from the performance of this Agreement by the Contractor or its employees, agents, servants, partners principals or subcontractors. Contractor shall pay all claims and losses in connection therewith and shall investigate and defend all claims, suits or actions of any kind or nature in the name of the County, where applicable, including appellate proceedings, and shall pay all costs, judgments, and attorney's fees which may issue thereon. Contractor expressly understands and agrees that any insurance protection required by this Agreement or otherwise provided by Contractor shall in no way limit the responsibility to indemnify, keep and save harmless and defend the County or its officers, employees, agents and instrumentalities as herein provided.

9) Warranty shall be for (3) Three Years

A. Type of Warranty Coverage Required

In addition to all other warranties that may be supplied by the Contractor, the Contractor shall warrant its product and/or service against faulty labor and/or defective material for a minimum period of three years after the date of acceptance of the labor, materials and/or equipment by the County.

This warranty requirement shall remain in force for the full period identified above; regardless of whether the Contractor is under contract with the County at the time of defect.

Any payment by the County on behalf of the goods or services received from the Contractor does not constitute a waiver of these warranty provisions. For items supplied but not manufactured by Agilent, the warranty terms of the manufacturer will be transferred to the buyer.

B. Correcting Defects Covered Under Warranty

The Contractor shall be responsible for promptly correcting any deficiency, at no cost to the County, within ten (10) calendar days after the County notifies the Contractor of such deficiency in writing. If the Contractor fails to honor the warranty and/or fails to correct or replace the defective work or items within the period specified, the County may, at its discretion, notify the Contractor, in writing, that the Contractor may be debarred as a County Contractor and/or subject to contractual default if the corrections or replacements are not completed to the satisfaction of the County within the time specified. If the Contractor fails to satisfy the warranty within the period specified in the notice, the County may (a) place the Contractor in default of its contract, and/or (b) procure the products or services from another vendor and charge the Contractor for any additional costs that are incurred by the County for this work or items.

10) Vendor Registration and Conflict of Interest:

The Contractor shall be a registered vendor with the County – Internal Services Department, Procurement Management Division, for the duration of this Agreement. Section 2-11.1(d) of Miami-Dade County Code requires that any County employee or any member of the employee’s immediate family who has a controlling financial interest, direct or indirect, with Miami-Dade County or any person or agency acting for Miami-Dade County, competing or applying for a contract, must first request a conflict of interest opinion from the County’s Ethics Commission prior to their or their immediate family member’s entering into any contract or transacting any business through a firm, corporation, partnership or business entity in which the employee or any member of the employee’s immediate family has a controlling financial interest, direct or indirect, with Miami-Dade County or any person or agency acting for Miami-Dade County. Any such contract or business engagement entered in violation of this subsection, as amended, shall be rendered voidable. For additional information, please contact the Ethics Commission hotline at (305) 579-2593.

11) Local, State and Federal Compliance Requirements:

Contractor agrees to comply, subject to applicable professional standards, with the provisions of any and all applicable Federal, State and the County orders, statutes, ordinances, rules and regulations which may pertain to the performance of this Agreement.

12) Governing Law:

This Agreement, including appendices, and all matters relating to this Agreement (whether in contract, statute, tort (such as negligence), or otherwise) shall be governed by, and construed in accordance with, the laws of the State of Florida. Venue shall be Miami-Dade County.

13) Survival:

The parties acknowledge that any of the obligations in this Agreement will survive the term, termination and cancellation hereof. Accordingly, the respective obligations of the Contractor and the County under this Agreement, which by nature would continue beyond the termination, cancellation or expiration thereof, shall survive termination, cancellation or expiration hereof.
