



Quarterly Trade Summary: 3rd Quarter 2010



Trade by Region

- Miami-Dade County imports grew from the 3rd Quarter of 2009 by 40.1% at the Airport, 20% at the Port and 32.1% overall in the County.
- The largest regional source of imports continued to be Central America (23%) which grew by 35% year over year to \$1.7 Billion.
- Europe (20%, \$1.4B) was close behind followed by South America and Asia. China was the largest individual trading partner, accounting for nearly \$1 Billion of imports.
- Exports grew from the third quarter of 2009 by 22.2% for the County, 24.3% at the Airport and 15.4% at the Sea Port.
- Exports were dominated by South American trade, accounting for over 55% of the total with a year over year growth rate of 23.4%. The total value reached \$6.3 billion.
- Europe (+38.9%) grew the most rapidly to \$1.9 billion, Central America (\$1.4b) and the Caribbean (\$1.0b) also exceeded a billion dollars of exports.
- Brazil was, once again, the largest export destination accounting for over \$2.4 Billion in exports from Miami-Dade. Number two was Switzerland, receiving about half as much, \$1.3 billion.



Trade by Commodity


- The largest category of commodities imported through Miami-Dade was machinery with over \$2.1b imported and which grew by over 38% from the 3rd quarter of 2009. Of this total, \$1.5b was imported through MIA, and the remainder through the Port
- The next largest category of imports was textiles (\$1.1b), almost all of which (\$947m), came through the Port. Imports of stone and glass also approached the \$1b mark (\$996m) of which most was either non-monetary gold or scrap gold and jewelry.
- Exports of machinery (\$5.0b) dominated exports from Miami-Dade and grew by 22.5% over the 3rd quarter of 2009. It accounted for 44% of all exports and was dominated by smaller digital machinery such as cell phones and automatic data processing equipment.
- The second largest category of exports was transportation products (\$1.5b), primarily aircraft parts, which accounted for only 13% of total, and stone and glass (\$1.4b) made up mainly of scrap precious metals, and represented 12% of the total.



Miami-Dade Exports by Region and Country, 3rd Quarter, 2010










