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### Miami-Dade County International Trade by Region<sup>1</sup> and Country

The value of exports and imports shipped through Miami-Dade’s airport and seaport continued along a positive trend through the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter, although the pace of growth appears to have decelerated during the last four quarters. South and Central America, and the Caribbean dominate international trade through Miami International Airport and Port Miami, representing approximately two-thirds of total trade shipments in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter. The **South American** region represents almost 43% of international trade value of export and import shipments from the County’s ports. Trade shipments from Miami-Dade in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2012 reached \$10 billion, up from \$8.7 billion (+16%) in the second quarter of last year. Year-to-date trade with South America has totaled \$19.7 billion, 16% above last year. **Brazil** remains the largest trading partner, at \$3.3 billion, up 11% from the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of last year and up 16% year-to-date this year over last. **Colombia**, with trade totaling \$2.2 billion is up nearly 24% year-to-date over last year, **Venezuela** at \$1 billion is up 16% year-to-date over last year, and **Chile**, \$998 million, is up nearly 18%.

The South American market for U.S. exports should remain relatively strong for the next two years. According to the IMF *World Economic Outlook* released last April, Brazil’s economy is projected to grow at 4% per year on average from 2013 to 2017, while growth in the volume of the region’s imports is expected to average 6% per year over that same period. Colombia’s rate of growth in GNP is projected to average


4.5% per year with growth of imports averaging nearly 6%. IMF economic forecasts suggest Chile's economy will grow at 4.5% per year, and its imports are projected to grow at nearly 5% per year. Venezuela's economy is expected to underperform compared to the region with annual growth rates averaging 3% per year and the volume of imports actually declining are rates of nearly 6% per year on average.

**Central America and the Caribbean** rank third among regional trade partners in terms of value of total trade with \$5.7 billion in 2nd quarter trade. Year-to-date trade with the region hit

\$10.1 billion, up over 9% from a year ago. Miami-Dade imports from the region were up nearly 25% from the 2nd quarter of last year to \$3.1 billion while exports to the region were down 1.6% from last year to \$2.6 billion. **Costa Rica** is the largest trading partner in this region with \$3.1 billion in total trade from January to June, representing an increase of nearly 48% over the first six months of 2011. The **Dominican Republic** the second largest trading partner for Miami-Dade within the Central American/Caribbean region, and total trade between January and June reached \$1.9 billion, registering a 2% year-over-year decrease. International trade valued at \$1.2 billion in with **Honduras** (3<sup>rd</sup> third largest partner) in the first half of this year was down nearly 17% from the first six months of 2011.

The value of international trade shipments with **Europe** through Miami-Dade ports in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2012 increased by 11.4% relative to the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2011 and reached US\$4.2 billion. Year-to-date trade with Europe

Miami-Dade Imports and Exports Year-to-Date (Billions of US \$)





has hit \$8.2 billion, and despite a slowdown in economic growth, trade shipments from Miami-Dade were 12.5% higher than the same period of last year. The gains in trade shipments to Europe from Miami-Dade this year were significantly stronger than total U.S. trade shipments to the region in the first six months of the year.

**Switzerland** accounted for nearly 55% of the County's total trade with Europe, primarily, gold. Trailing far behind Switzerland, other important European trade partners include **Germany** with \$874 million in total trade year-to-date, off 2% from the same period last year. **France** with \$827 million in trade year-to-date is up nearly 6% from the first six months of 2011, and the **United Kingdom** with \$722 million in trade through June is up 22% year-over-year.

Prospects for future growth in trade with Europe do not seem especially positive according to a recent IMF economic forecast and the uncertainty surrounding the stability of the Euro Zone economies. Real GDP growth in Europe is projected to be in the 0.9 to 1.7% range over the next five years with the volume of imports expected to grow at an average annual rate of 3.6% per year. The forecast has Switzerland's economy is growing at a rate of approximately 1.9% per year from 2013 to 2017, however, more relevant might be the price of gold that has already appreciated beyond most expectations and appears susceptible to a price correction. Growth of the German economy is projected to be in the 1.3 to 1.5% range over the next five years, just behind the growth rate in France at 1.7%. The growth rate in the U.K. is projected to be just a little stronger at an average annual rate of 2.5%.

The final major trade region for Miami-Dade ports is **Asia-Other** (with China and Japan being the largest economies within the group) with \$2.4 billion in trade in the second quarter, which is 15% lower than in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2011. Year-to-date trade is \$4.7 billion, off 12% from the same period last year. Imports from Asia-Other account for 81% of the total with \$1.9 billion traded in the second quarter. This is nearly 20% below the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of last year. Exports to Asia-Other totaled \$460 million in the second quarter, up nearly 10% over the same quarter last year. Trade shipments to **China** in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter were 10% higher than in 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter 2011, reaching \$1.3 billion China accounts for 54% of all Miami-Dade trade with this region. Imports received from China represented 92% total trade shipments with China. Trade shipments to **Japan** were far behind trade with China, standing at \$210 million in trade in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter and \$463 million year-to-date. Nevertheless, trade shipments with Japan increased 22% over the first two quarters of last year boosted, according to IMF analysis, by reconstruction spending following the earthquake and nuclear reactor disaster.

Four commodity categories made up 75% of all commodities shipped through Miami-Dade from January to June. **Machinery** was the largest category traded at \$16.8 billion, up 13.5% from the first six months of 2011, and exports accounted for \$11.3 billion (67%) of the total shipments of machinery. Within this category, **telephone equipment**, at \$3.2 billion year-to-date was up 25% from the same period last year. **Circuit boards** accounted for an additional \$2.7 billion (+36% year-over-year). Exports of machinery to **South America, Central America and the Caribbean** accounted for \$10.4 billion (92%) of all machinery exports (\$8.4B to SA and \$2.0B to Central America/Caribbean). Imports of machinery through Miami-Dade stood at \$5.5 billion from January to June, and 78% of those imports (\$4.3B) originated from **Central America and the Caribbean** (\$2.4B) and **Asia-other** (\$1.9B).

International trade shipments of **stone and glass commodities** from Miami-Dade totaled \$8 billion for the first half of 2012, representing an increase of 32% over the first half of 2011. Precious metals, gem stones and jewelry are included within this category. Exports of stone and glass commodities totaled \$4.5 billion (primarily **gold** at \$3.3 billion) of which \$4 billion was heading to **Europe**. The price of gold appreciated about 10% from the first half of 2011 to the first half of 2012, so much of the growth has come from increased volume of trade and not only price changes. Imports of stone and glass also consisted primarily of gold (75%) and totaled \$3.5 billion from January to June, up 38.5% from last year. South American countries shipped to Miami-Dade about \$2 billion of gold, up 76% year-over-year. Another \$490 million of gold imports came from Central America and the Caribbean.

**Transportation** equipment totaled \$3.9 billion year-to-date, up 16% from last year. Over 70% of this total (\$2.8 billion) was **civilian aircraft engines and parts**, up 25% year over year and \$1.8 billion of these exports were destined for **South America**. An additional \$461 million in exports of aircraft engines and parts were shipped to **Europe**.


**Miscellaneous exports** were the final major category at \$5.7 billion year-to-date, up 20% from a year ago. **Exports of repaired imports and imports of returned exports** accounted for \$1.3 billion worth of shipments from Miami-Dade ports. Exports of **medical instruments** reached \$894 million in the first half of this year, increasing by 7% over the same period last year.
