

SUMMARY OF MIAMI-DADE INTERNATIONAL TRADE IN GOODS:

2015 through the 2nd Quarter

The total value of international trade handled through Miami International Airport (MIA) and PortMiami dipped to \$39.9 billion over the first six months of 2015 according to data from the U.S. Census Bureau Customs Report. This represents a 9% decrease from the same period last year. Exports were down 7.3% to \$22.2 billion, with MIA, the 6th-busiest air cargo port in the United States, accounting for \$17 billion of the total; and PortMiami, an integral component of Miami-Dade's economic engine, accounting for \$5.3 billion. Imports dropped 6.4% to \$17.7 billion, with \$10.4 billion in goods handled through MIA, and \$7.3 billion in merchandise shipped through PortMiami. One of the only bright spots in the data was that MIA and PortMiami remain among the few ports in the Country with a trade surplus as, combined, exports topped imports by over \$4.5 billion.

Trade by region: Three of Miami-Dade's four largest trade-region partners, by value, South America, Central America and the Caribbean, and Asia - Other, saw a drop in the value of trade over the same period last year. Trade with South America, accounting for over 42% of all Miami-Dade trade,

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declined 11.6% to \$16.9 billion over last year. Central America and the Caribbean ranked 2nd and accounting for 23% of total trade, fell 7% from a year ago to \$9.3 billion. Finally, Asia-other, which includes China and Hong Kong and accounts for 13% of all trade, dropped 17.8% to \$5.3 billion in trade from the first half of last year. Combined, these three regions, accounting for 79% of the value of all county trade, dropped over 11% from the first half of 2014. Among the top four region partners, only Europe experienced a trade increase, from \$5.3 billion to over \$6.1 billion, a 17% increase over the first half of last year.

Trade by commodity:

Commodity trade by value in the first half of this year showed mixed results over 2014. Among all commodities traded through Miami-Dade, machinery remained the largest category, accounting for 32% of the total and 20% of imports. However, the value of machinery imports declined 36% over last year to \$3.5 billion. Commodities in this category include, primarily, communications equipment.

Imports of miscellaneous, not medical, which accounts for 18% of all imports, increased 24.5% over last year to \$3.2 billion. This category is dominated by imports of returned exports and charity products.



The next largest category, stone and glass, which accounts for over 17% of imports, declined 10.5% to \$3.1 billion. Gold accounts for 74% of this category. Over the last year, June 2014 to June 2015, the price of gold dropped from \$1,279 to \$1,181 per ounce, an 8% decrease, accounting for most of the decrease in this category.


Animal and vegetable products, accounting for an additional 12% of import trade, shed 0.7% to \$2.1 billion. And finally, imports of textiles, 11% of the total, fell 15% in the first half of 2015 over the same time period last year to \$2 billion.

Machinery was also the largest commodity category exported from Miami-Dade, accounting for 41% of all exports. The total value exported lost 11% or \$1.1 billion over the first half of the year compared to last year, dropping to \$9.2 billion. Communications equipment and data processing machines made up the largest share of commodities in this group.

Transportation-related exports accounted for 14% of all exports and stood at \$3.1 billion for the first half of the year, a 5.5% decrease from the same period last year. Civilian aircraft engines and parts accounted for about 75% of the total in this category.

Miscellaneous products, not medical, and chemical products, each accounting for about 10% of exports, saw slight improvement in export activity, up 1.8% to \$2.2 billion and 2.8% to \$2.1 billion, respectively. Miscellaneous products were comprised of a wide array of products led by exports of repaired imports and charity. The Chemical category was primarily led by medicines.

Trade by region by port of entry: Imports at Miami International Airport (MIA) in the first half of 2015 declined 18% over a year earlier to \$10.4 billion. Imports from the top four regions, combined, accounted for 94% of MIA imports, and all trended downward. South American imports were down 9% to \$4.6 billion, European and Asia – Other imports were each off 6% to \$2.1 billion and \$1.7 billion respectively, and Central America and Caribbean imports fell 55%, nearly \$1.5 billion, to \$1.4 billion.

Import activity at PortMiami, on the other hand, was up 16% in the first half of the year over last year to reach \$7.3 billion. Three regions dominated the trade, accounting for 91% of total imports. Asia-Other imports, primarily China, increased 7% to \$2.8 billion. Imports from Central America and the Caribbean were up 28% to \$2.6 billion, and from Europe up 36% to \$1.3 billion.

Exports from both ports of embarkation fell year-over-year. Exports from MIA totaled \$17 billion for the first six months of 2015, off 8% from a year ago. Just three regions accounted for 90% of all exports from MIA, and one, South America, accounted for 65%. Exports to South America fell 10% from a year earlier to \$11 billion. Exports to Europe grew nearly 38% but totaled

just \$2.4 billion. And exports to Central America and the Caribbean increased 4% to total \$2 billion.

The value of exports leaving PortMiami fell 2% year-over-year to \$5.3 billion, with just two regions, Central America and the Caribbean and South America, accounting for 83% of the total. The value of exports to Central America and the Caribbean were up 10% over the first half of last year to \$3.3 billion. Exports to South America were down 31% to \$1.0 billion in the first half of 2015.

Trade by commodity by port of entry: MIA imported approximately \$10.5 billion worth of goods and exported roughly \$17 billion of merchandise for the first half of this year. Stone and glass imports, especially gold, accounted for the largest share of all imports, accounting for 28% of the total, and decreased 12.6% from a year earlier to \$2.9 billion. Miscellaneous, not medical products making up 24% of the total, were up 26% to \$2.5 billion. Machinery, 20% of all imports, decreased 48% from the first half of last year to \$2.1 billion.

At PortMiami every category of commodity imported improved over the first half of last year. The largest category,

textiles, footwear and headgear goods, accounting for 22% of total PortMiami imports, grew 15% to \$1.6 billion. Machinery, 19% of total imports, was up 3% to \$1.4 billion; and foodstuffs, 13% of the total, was up 17% to \$975 million.

Over the first six months of this year, the overall value of commodity exports from Miami-Dade decreased 7.3%. At MIA, exports dropped 9%, and at PortMiami they were down 2%. MIA exports were led by machinery shipments, 45% of the total, which were down 10% from last year to \$7.6 billion. Transportation equipment, at 15% of total exports, were off 7% to 2.6 billion. Miscellaneous, not medical accounted for 10% of the total and were off 1% to \$1.7 billion while chemicals, also 10% of the total, were up 4% over 2014 to \$1.7 billion.

Exports from PortMiami were also led by machinery with 29% of exports, and they shed 13% from a year earlier to \$1.5 billion. Textiles, footwear and headgear made up 12% of exports and increased over 9% to \$645 million. Transportation commodity exports were 10% of the total and grew 3% to \$523 million, while miscellaneous, not medical exports, at 9% of the total, increased 13% to \$473 million.

Trade by weight: Total trade for the first half of 2015, measured by weight, through Miami-Dade was up 12% over a year earlier to 4.1 million tons. Four regions, Central America and the Caribbean, Asia-Other, South America and Europe, accounted for 91% of the total and all were up over the first half of last year except South America, off 14%.

PortMiami exports totaled 1.6 million tons in the first half of the year, up 10% from 2014. Once again the concentration among regions was very high. Central America and the Caribbean made up 46% of the total at 728,000 tons, and was up 8% from the previous year. Asia-Other, 26% of the total at 407,000 tons, was up 16% from last year, and South America at 174,000 tons and 11% of the total was off 17%.

PortMiami imports totaled 2 million tons over the first half of 2015, up 18% year-over-year, with Asia-Other, Central America and the Caribbean and Europe making up 84% of the total. Asia-


Other imports were up 15% from last year to 683,000 tons. Imports from Central America and the Caribbean were up 44% from a year ago to 532,000 tons, and Europe imports increased 67% to 460,000 tons.

Total tonnage traded through MIA was 522,000 tons, and declined 2.6% from the first half of 2014. MIA exports by weight totaled 186,000 tons and were down 6% from the previous year. South America and Central America and the Caribbean accounted for over 85% of all exports, with 71% being South America alone. Exports to South America declined 9%, year-over-year to 128,000 tons. Central America and the Caribbean exports increased 9% to 31,000 tons.

MIA imports totaled 336,000 tons, again with South America and Central America and the Caribbean dominating with over 87% of the total. South America, again, with at over 72% of the total, declined 5% year-over-year in the first half of 2015. Imports through MIA from Central America and the Caribbean were up 9% to total 51,000 tons.


PortMiami Trade by Weight (%)
