Quarterly Report









Overview

This report is presented by the Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust (also known as the Transportation Trust) with information pertaining to the oversight of the Charter County and Regional Transportation System Surtax Funds (Surtax) and implementation of the People's Transportation Plan (PTP) for the period October 1, 2024 – December 31, 2024.

The Transportation Trust works closely with members of the Miami-Dade Board of County Commissioners (BCC), Miami-Dade County's administration and staff, and municipal officials to ensure Surtax funds are properly invested in local transportation projects.

Transportation Trust Updates



Transportation Trust Meetings

The Transportation Trust meets on a regular basis to fulfill its statutory responsibility to "monitor, oversee, review, audit and investigate" the implementation of the People's Transportation Plan (PTP).

First Quarter:

During the First Quarter of FY 2024-25, the Full Trust met 2 times, and there were 3 committee meetings. (2 Municipal Program and 1 Community Engagement).

Municipal Presentations

There were eight presentations total [at the committee meetings], one from each of the following municipalities: Coral Gables, Key Biscayne, West Miami, Aventura, Sunny Isles Beach, Biscayne Park, Miami Beach, and North Miami Beach.





Resolutions and Contracts Approved by the Transportation Trust

A major responsibility of the Transportation Trust is to review items requesting Transportation Surtax funding for projects listed in the Five-Year Implementation Plan of the People's Transportation Plan (Five Year Plan). These contracts are initiated by the Miami-Dade Department of Transportation and Public Works (DTPW) and are reviewed by staff at the Office of the Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust (OCITT) before they are voted on by the Transportation Trust members. The following contracts were approved during FY 2024-25:

RESOLUTIONS FOR THE FIRST QUARTER OF 2024-25:

Resolution 24-023 – Resolution by the Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust (CITT) recommending to the Board of County Commissioners (BCC), an amendment to the FY2024-28 update of the Five-Year Implementation Plan of the People's Transportation Plan (PTP) to include the fare collection system replacement project funded in part by Charter County Transportation Surtax funds (CITT)

Resolution 24-024— Resolution by the Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust (CITT) recommending the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) authorize rejection of all proposals received in response to a competitive Request for Proposals and award of a competitive designated purchase pursuant to Section 2-8.1(B)(3) of the County Code by a two-thirds vote of the Board Members present; authorize award of Contract No. EVN0001090 in an amount not to exceed \$64,771,337 for the purchase of fare collection equipment for an initial six-year term; authorize the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to execute same for and on behalf of Miami-Dade County and to exercise all provisions of the contract, including any cancellation or extensions, pursuant to Section 2-8.1 of the code of Miami-Dade County, Florida and implementing Order 3-38; and authorize the use of \$44,720,435 of Charter County Transportation Surtax funds for this project which was added to the People's Transportation Plan 2024-2028 Five-Year Implementation Plan. (DTPW BCC Legislative File No. 241972)

Resolution 24-025 – Resolution by the Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust (CITT) recommending to the Board of County Commissioners (BCC), the approval of the FY 2025-29 update of the Five-Year Implementation Plan of the People's Transportation Plan (PTP)

Resolution 24-026 – Resolution by the Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust (CITT) recommending to the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) the rejection of the addition of certain proposed projects to the FY 2025-29 update of the Five-Year Implementation Plan of the People's Transportation Plan (PTP)

Resolution 24-027— Resolution by the Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust (CITT) recommending the Board of County Commissioners (BCC) delegate contracting authority





to the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to award, access, and modify competitively solicited contracts to purchase light and heavy fleet vehicles and mobile/specialized equipment for the Department of Transportation and Public Works, in an aggregate amount not to exceed \$3,883,000 for Fiscal Year 2024-25; directing the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to provide a report to the Board; authorize the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to exercise all provisions of any contracts awarded, accessed, or modified pursuant to this delegation, including any cancellation, renewal and extension provisions; authorize the County Mayor of County Mayor's designee to give notice of any award, issue the appropriate Purchase Order to give effect to same and exercise all provisions of any such contracts pursuant to Section 2-8.1 of the code and implementing Order 3-38; and authorize the use of \$440,000.00 of Charter County Transportation Surtax funds included in the FY25 adopted budget (DTPW BCC Legislative File No. 242220)

Resolution 24-028– Resolution by the Citizens' Independent Transportation Trust (CITT) concurring with the use of Charter County Transportation Surtax funds, in an amount not to exceed \$625,000.00 over five years, for Purchase Order No. 0000023731 under Contract No. RTQ-02047 awarded to Avanza Advertising, LLC for the provision of CITT Community Engagement Services (CITT)

Major Highway and Road Improvement Projects

The Miami-Dade Department of Transportation and Public Works (DTPW) is also responsible for implementing the Surtax funded roadway improvements listed in the Five-Year Implementation Plan of the People's Transportation Plan.

Neighborhood Improvement Projects

DTPW continues to coordinate the Neighborhood Improvement Projects with County Commissioners' offices. Improvements in this category include roadway resurfacing, sidewalks, ADA ramps and connectors, drainage, guardrails, striping, traffic signals, and traffic calming.

DTPW takes advantage of contracting mechanisms, such as the County's Miscellaneous Construction Contract (MCC) Program to accelerate implementation of projects. It is an open competitive process which allows for expedited procurement. The MCC program provides contractors countywide with a fair opportunity to compete for work on County construction projects and has a direct beneficial impact to the County by accelerating construction projects.

Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) and Small Business Participation Reporting

The Transportation Trust monitors and reports on the level of participation by small and disadvantaged businesses in contracts receiving transportation surtax funds. It is supported in this effort by the Department of Transportation and Public Works's Office of Civil Rights and the Miami-Dade Internal Services Department (ISD) Small Business Development Division. The federal Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) program encourages the development and use of companies owned and controlled by minorities, women, and socially and economically disadvantaged individuals on federally-aided projects.

The County's small business program tracks contracts awarded with Surtax funding and subject to local small business goals, wages, and Community Workforce requirements. The following activity is reported during the quarter.

PTP Municipal Update

Approximately 23 percent (23%) of Surtax proceeds are allocated to 33 municipalities eligible to receive People's Transportation Plan (PTP) funds. Each city receives a pro rata share of funds based on population which are used to develop or enhance the city's public transit and transportation systems. 21 municipalities provide fixed-route service funded by the Surtax and 22 municipalities provide on-demand service. The municipalities jointly transported 3,147,012 passengers on fixed-route, on-demand, and micromobility services during the FIRST quarter of Fiscal Year 2024-25. This is the first quarter the Trust is counting micromobility ridership, with 11,745 riders in Quarter 1.

Notes:

The cumulative numbers presented above are as of 12/31/2024 for FY 2025. The "Unspent/Cash Balance" includes Recaptured, Capital Expansion Reserves and/or Unrestricted funds, some of which will be distributed in the future in the appropriate categories. Please note that Surtax transfers/distributions may not always occur in the month Surtax revenue is received.

The cash balance includes \$9,936,007 recaptured from municipalities in non-compliance being held for redistribution to the remaining municipalities; \$9,102,884 being kept in a reserve account for future capital expansion and \$318,434,727 in unrestricted funds.
