



ORDINANCE NO. 09-54

ORDINANCE AMENDING ARTICLE LXIII OF THE CODE OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA CREATING THE MIAMI-DADE COUNTY BLACK AFFAIRS ADVISORY BOARD; SPECIFICALLY AMENDING SECTION 2-832 OF THE CODE TO ALLOW FOR INDIVIDUALS WHO HAVE SHOWN EXCEPTIONAL DEDICATION TO THE BLACK AFFAIRS ADVISORY BOARD TO SERVE IN EXCESS OF THE EIGHT YEAR TERM LIMIT AS ESTABLISHED BY SECTION 2-11.38.2; SAID REAPPOINTMENTS WOULD REQUIRE THE PASSAGE OF A RESOLUTION BY TWO-THIRDS OF THE FULL MEMBERSHIP OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS; PROVIDING SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN THE CODE, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE

**WHEREAS**, the Board of County Commissioners (the "Board") created the Miami-Dade County Black Affairs Advisory Board ("Black Affairs Advisory Board") on July 12, 1994; and

**WHEREAS**, each of the thirteen (13) members of the Board of County Commissioners is tasked with appointing one member to the Black Affairs Advisory Board; and

**WHEREAS**, said member is to be a permanent resident and elector of the County who possesses knowledge of and interest in Miami-Dade County's Black community; and

**WHEREAS**, the Ordinance provides that appointment after the initial term shall be for a term of three (3) years; and

**WHEREAS**, this Board desires to clarify the term of the initial appointment; and

**WHEREAS**, this Board desires to enable members of the Black Affairs Advisory Board who have exhibited exceptional dedication and service to continue serving on the Board in excess of the eight (8) year term limit as established by Section 2-11.38.2(b) of the Miami-Dade County Code; and

**WHEREAS**, a member may only serve in excess of the eight (8) year term limit upon the passage of a resolution by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the full membership of the Board of County Commissioners,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA:**

Section 1. Section 2-832 of Article LXIII of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida, is hereby amended to read as follows<sup>1</sup>

**ARTICLE LXIII.**

**MIAMI-DADE COUNTY BLACK AFFAIRS ADVISORY BOARD**

**Section 2-832 Composition**

The Miami-Dade County Black Affairs Advisory Board shall be composed of thirteen (13) members who shall be permanent residents and electors of the County and who shall have a knowledge and interest in the County's Black community. Each County Commissioner shall appoint one member of the board. Appointments after the initial >>three-year<< term shall be for a term of three (3) years. >>Notwithstanding Section 2-11.38.2(b) of the Miami-Dade County Code, a Commissioner may reappoint an existing member to serve in excess of the eight (8) year term limit, provided that said member has demonstrated exceptional dedication and service to the board and that the reappointment is presented to the Board of County Commissioners in the form of a resolution and approved by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the full membership of the Board of County Commissioners.<<

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<sup>1</sup> Words stricken through and/or [[double bracketed]] shall be deleted. Words underscored and/or >>double arrowed<< constitute the amendment proposed. Remaining provisions are now in effect and remain unchanged.

Section 3. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or provision of this ordinance is held invalid, the remainder of this ordinance shall not be affected by such invalidity.

Section 4. It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners, and it is hereby ordained that the provisions of this ordinance, including any sunset provision, shall become and be made a part of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida. The sections of this ordinance may be renumbered or relettered to accomplish such intention, and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section," "article," or other appropriate word.

Section 5. This ordinance shall become effective ten (10) days after the date of enactment unless vetoed by the Mayor, and if vetoed, shall become effective only upon an override by this Board.

**Summary**

This ordinance amends Article LXIII of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida creating the Miami-Dade County Black Affairs Advisory Board (BAAB). The amendment extends the eight (8) year term limits for members who have shown exceptional dedication and service during their tenure on the board. A member may serve beyond the eight year term limit upon the passage of a resolution by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the full membership of the Board of County commissioners (Board).

**Background and Relevant Legislation**

The Black Affairs Advisory Boards serves in an advocacy and advisory capacity and stands on the principle that all citizens should be educated, involved and served by its local county government. The BAAB is comprised of thirteen (13) volunteer members appointed by each member of the Board.
