

Subject: Ordinance related to Dade-Miami Criminal Justice Council

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This proposed ordinance relating to the Dade-Miami Criminal Justice Council amends Article CXLIX, Section 2-2169 of Chapter 2 of the Code of Miami-Dade County creating the Miami Dade Reentry Council Committee as a committee of the Dade-Miami Criminal Justice Council to plan and coordinate local reentry services. This committee's proposed duties would include, among other things, identifying funding opportunities that will be forwarded as recommendations to apply for federal and/or state grants to the Dade-Miami Criminal Justice Council.

The staffing and support of this committee will be absorbed by existing budgeted resources within the Corrections and Rehabilitation Department and are administered by institutional members of the Dade-Miami Criminal Justice Council, as reflected in Section 2-11.38 and 2-11.38.1 of the Code of Miami-Dade County. Therefore, it is anticipated that the implementation of this ordinance would have no additional fiscal impact to the County.

ORDINANCE NO. 15-110

ORDINANCE RELATED TO DADE-MIAMI CRIMINAL JUSTICE COUNCIL; AMENDING ARTICLE CXLIX, SECTION 2-2169 OF CHAPTER 2 OF THE CODE OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA TO CREATE THE MIAMI-DADE REENTRY COUNCIL COMMITTEE AS A COMMITTEE OF THE DADE-MIAMI CRIMINAL JUSTICE COUNCIL; SUPERSEDING RESOLUTION NO. R-321-09; PROVIDING SEVERABILITY, INCLUSION IN THE CODE, AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE

**WHEREAS**, the Board of County Commissioners of Miami-Dade County, Florida created the Miami-Dade Reentry Council (“Reentry Council”) on April 7, 2009 pursuant to Resolution No. R-321-09 to provide a forum for ongoing planning and coordination of local reentry services and to prepare a plan for implementing the recommendations of the Blue Ribbon Advisory Committee Final Report dated March 28, 2008; and

**WHEREAS**, the Dade-Miami Criminal Justice Council encourages and facilitates coordination and cooperation amongst the various agencies in the criminal justice system in Miami-Dade County; and

**WHEREAS**, it is desirable to reconstitute the Reentry Council as a committee of the Dade-Miami Criminal Justice Council; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board wishes to align the requirements of the Reentry Council and the Dade-Miami Criminal Justice Council,

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA:**

**Section 1.** Article CXLIX, Section 2-2169 of Chapter 2 of the Code of Miami-Dade

County, Florida, is hereby amended to read as follows:<sup>1</sup>

**Sec. 2-2169 Organization.**

\* \* \*

(f) Committees. The Chairperson, independently or upon recommendation of the Council, shall establish committees to assist in accomplishing its tasks and shall appoint members thereto and a Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson of committees established, except for the Public Safety Coordinating Council Committee. Only Council members may be appointed to serve as Chairperson or Vice-Chairperson of committees. The Chairperson shall be a voting member of all Committees. Results of all committee action(s) will be made known to all Council members at the next scheduled full Council meeting. The following committees shall be established:

>>(8) The Miami-Dade Reentry Council Committee. The Miami-Dade Reentry Council Committee shall plan and coordinate local reentry services. This Committee may collaborate with the Public Safety Coordinating Council Committee of the Dade-Miami Criminal Justice Council to develop a comprehensive local reentry plan. This committee shall implement the comprehensive local reentry plan and shall provide evidence based methodology and outcome measures for evaluating the efficacy and impact of programs. This committee shall review and analyze federal and state grant programs used to promote safe and successful reintegration into the community, including but not limited to, the Second Chance Act grant program administered by the Office of Justice Programs, United States Department of Justice. This committee shall identify funding opportunities and shall forward recommendations to apply for federal and/or state grants to the Dade-Miami Criminal Justice Council.<<

**Section 2.** This ordinance shall supersede Resolution No. R-321-09.


**Section 3.** If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or provision of this ordinance is held invalid, the remainder of this ordinance shall not be affected by such invalidity.

**Section 4.** It is the intention of the Board of County Commissioners, and it is hereby ordained that the provisions of this ordinance, including any sunset provision, shall become and be made a part of the Code of Miami-Dade County, Florida. The sections of this ordinance may be renumbered or relettered to accomplish such intention, and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section," "article," or other appropriate word.


**Section 5.** This ordinance shall become effective ten (10) days after the date of enactment unless vetoed by the Mayor, and if vetoed, shall become effective only upon an override by this Board.
