Subject: Juvenile Services Department Community-Based Violence Prevention
Demonstration Program Grant Application

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) ratify the Mayor or Mayor's designee's action in applying for United States Department of Justice OJJDP FY 2010 "Community-Based Violence Prevention Demonstration Program" funds in the amount of \$2.2 million. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Mayor or the Mayor's designee to receive and expend grant funds, and to execute such contracts, agreements, Memoranda of Understanding (MOU), and amendments, after approval by the County Attorney, as required by program guidelines. It is also recommended that the Board authorize the Mayor or the Mayor's designee to apply for, receive, and expend additional funds that may become available during the term of the grant; to file and execute any amendments to the application for and on behalf of the County; and to exercise amendments, modifications, renewal, cancellation, and termination clauses of any contracts and agreements, subject to the approval of the County Attorney's Office.

Scope

The scope of the project is countywide in nature. The Juvenile Services Department (JSD) will implement a violence prevention demonstration program targeting juveniles and young adults, ages 14-17 and 18-25, respectively. The three-year project will enable the JSD and its collaborative partners (Youth Violence Prevention Coalition and the Institute for Child & Family Health) to implement *Project CeaseFire*, a best practice model, made famous in Chicago, to reduce violence, shootings, and deaths.

Fiscal Impact/Funding Source

If funded, the Department of Justice will provide a three-year grant award in the amount of \$2.2 million. This project will enable the Juvenile Services Department, its collaborative partners, and the Miami-Dade Police Department to implement a neighborhood-based initiative. The intended impact of this funding will serve to improve public safety and reduce law enforcement costs. The grant does not require matching funds.

Track Record/Monitor

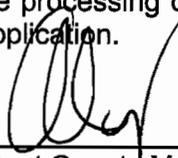
JSD will implement and manage the project. The department has an extensive history of managing DOJ grants. The Department will handle the disbursement and expenditure of grant funds, and manage programmatic and fiscal reporting in accordance with project reporting and auditing procedures stipulated by the Department of Justice.

Background

The Juvenile Services Department will implement *Project CeaseFire*, a best practice evidenced-based model to reduce youth and gang violence, and shootings in MDC, committed by juveniles ages 14 to 17, and young adults 18 to 25. This *Evidence Integration Strategy* will include the Police Department's current targeted initiatives: Gun Bounty Program; 874 Project; Street Terror Offender Program; Drug Abuse Resistance Education; Robbery Intervention Detail; Tactical Narcotics Team; and the Multi-Agency Gang Taskforce. The four (4) hot-spot neighborhoods include: 1) Miami Gardens and Opa-Locka; 2) Liberty City; 3) Little Havana; and 4) Little Haiti. Over 50 percent of all juvenile/young adult criminal and violent crime activity (shootings, reported arrests, and gang-related activity) takes place in the four neighborhoods. This 36-month demonstration project will target 275 participants.

Project goals include: 1) Implement the *CeaseFire Program* to reduce juvenile and gang-related violence and shootings; 2) Engage community service providers for the provision of services; 3) Promote and encourage juveniles and young adults to become responsible and productive members of the community, avoiding violence and criminal behavior; and 4) Increase public safety and reduce violence.

The short turnaround time imposed by the application deadline did not allow sufficient time for the processing of the resolution, and its submission to the Board prior to submission of the application.

RESOLUTION RATIFYING THE COUNTY MAYOR'S OR MAYOR'S DESIGNEE'S ACTION TO APPLY, RECEIVE, AND EXPEND GRANT FUNDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$2.2 MILLION FROM THE OJJDP FY 2010 "COMMUNITY-BASED VIOLENCE PREVENTION DEMONSTRATION PROGRAM FUNDS FROM THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE; AND FURTHER AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MAYOR OR COUNTY MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO EXERCISE AND EXECUTE SUCH CONTRACTS, AGREEMENTS, MEMORANDA OF UNDERSTANDING, MODIFY OR AMEND THE APPLICATION IN ORDER TO RECEIVE ADDITIONAL FUNDS OR TO EXTEND THE PERFORMANCE PERIOD AS REQUIRED IF AWARDED

WHEREAS, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, this Board has adopted Resolution No. R-784-10, authorizing the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to administer County business during the Board of County Commissioners' 2010 summer recess as provided therein, and has directed that all actions taken pursuant to such authority be submitted to this Board for ratification at its October 5, 2010 meeting,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board ratifies the County Mayor's or County Mayor's designee's actions of action in applying for United States Department of Justice OJJDP FY 2010 "Community-Based Violence Prevention Demonstration Program" funds in the amount of \$2.2 million. This Board further authorizes the Mayor or the Mayor's designee to receive and expend grant funds, and to execute such contracts, agreements, Memoranda of Understanding (MOU), and
