Subject: Medical Examiner Department FY 10 Paul Coverdell Forensic Science  
Improvement Project Grant Application

**Recommendation**

It is recommended that the Board of County Commissioners (Board) ratify the Mayor or Mayor's designee's action in applying for United States Department of Justice FY 2010 Paul Coverdell Forensic Science Improvement Grant Program funds in the amount of \$174,995. It is further recommended that the Board authorize the Mayor or the Mayor's designee to receive and expend grant funds, and to execute such contracts, agreements, Memoranda of Understanding (MOU), and amendments, after approval by the County Attorney, as required by program guidelines. It is also recommended that the Board authorize the Mayor or the Mayor's designee to apply for, receive, and expend additional funds that may become available during the term of the grant; to file and execute any amendments to the application for and on behalf of the County; and to exercise amendments, modifications, renewal, cancellation, and termination clauses of any contracts and agreements, subject to the approval of the County Attorney's Office.

**Scope**

The scope of the project is countywide in nature, and will benefit families of unidentified decedents and missing persons throughout the nation/world. Funds will be used to support staffing resources required to enter over 200 backlogged cases, and new cases of unidentified deceased persons in three important Databases: 1) National Missing and Unidentified Person System (NamUs); 2) Florida UnIDentified Decedents DataBase (FLUIDDB); and 3) Miami-Dade County Medical Examiner Department's Coroner Medical Examiner (CME) database; each for the primary purpose of identifying unknown decedents. In addition to the forensic, medical, and research benefits of the project, family members will be able to obtain closure when a missing loved one is found and identified.

**Fiscal Impact/Funding Source**

If funded, this grant will provide a one-year grant award in the amount of \$174,995. An in-kind match of \$66,625 is provided in personnel and fringe benefits, Odontology consulting, records retrieval, database searches, and courier services.

**Track Record/Monitor**

Medical Examiner Department will serve as the administering agency for the grant project, and be responsible for overall grants management and fiscal administration. The department has an extensive history of managing grant projects. The Department will handle the disbursement and expenditure of grant funds, and manage programmatic and fiscal reporting in accordance with project reporting and auditing procedures stipulated by the Department of Justice.

**Background**

Ratification of this application is necessary because the short turnaround time imposed by the application deadline did not allow sufficient time for the processing of the resolution and its submission to the Board prior to submission of the application.

In May of 2006, the National Missing and Unidentified Person System (NamUs) was launched by the U.S. Department of Justice to serve as a central point for collection of unidentified decedent information across all Federal, State, and local law enforcement officials, medical examiners and coroners. The FLorida UnIDentified Decedents DataBase (FLUIDDB) site is a clearinghouse of information on persons found dead in Florida whose identities remain unknown. A joint Unidentified Decedent Initiative launched by the Medical Examiner Commission and the Missing Endangered Persons Information Clearinghouse (MECIP) in 2008, resulted in the use of a comprehensive uniform methodology to process unidentified decedents by the department since 1956.

The successful application of the uniform methodology for each unidentified decedent, which includes entering such information to both the NamUs and FLUIDDB databases, can take up to 45 days. Since 2008, the Investigation Bureau has successfully completed this activity for 48 unidentified remains of which one potential match is being processed. With only one full-time staff assigned to perform this time consuming procedure, limitations in staffing resources has not allowed for the department to complete this process for 200 backlogged cases. Ongoing budgetary constraints faced by Miami-Dade County government have and continue to significantly impact the department's staffing resources.

RESOLUTION RATIFYING THE MAYOR OR MAYOR'S DESIGNEE'S ACTION TO APPLY FOR, RECEIVE, AND EXPEND GRANT FUNDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$174,995 FROM THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE, FY 2010 PAUL COVERDELL FORENSIC SCIENCE IMPROVEMENT GRANT PROGRAM; AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OR MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO RECEIVE, EXPEND, AND EXECUTE SUCH CONTRACTS, AGREEMENTS, MEMORANDA OF UNDERSTANDING, AND AMENDMENTS AFTER APPROVAL BY THE COUNTY ATTORNEY; AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR OR THE MAYOR'S DESIGNEE TO APPLY FOR, RECEIVE, AND EXPEND ADDITIONAL FUNDS THAT MAY BECOME AVAILABLE

**WHEREAS**, this Board desires to accomplish the purposes outlined in the accompanying memorandum, a copy of which is incorporated herein by reference; and

**WHEREAS**, this Board has adopted Resolution No. R-784-10, authorizing the County Mayor or County Mayor's designee to administer County business during the Board of County Commissioners' 2010 summer recess as provided therein, and has directed that all actions taken pursuant to such authority be submitted to this Board for ratification at its October 5, 2010 meeting,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA**, that this Board hereby ratifies the Mayor or Mayor's designee's action in applying for United States Department of Justice FY 2010 Paul Coverdell Forensic Science Improvement Grant Program funds in the amount of \$174,995.
