Some Highlights from the October 5, 2021, Commission Meeting



Among the County Items:

- <u>Resolution</u> establishing the Illegal Dumping Trust Fund and disbursing funds to be used for crime investigations and enforcement operations conducted by the Miami-Dade Police Department's Illegal Dumping and Environmental Crimes Unit. -- *Passed*
- <u>Ordinance</u> modifying certain requirements for removal of a tree that is causing damage to certain property and reducing tree replacement requirements as well as creating a simplified permitting process. -- *Passed*
- <u>Resolution</u> authorizing establishment of a \$1 million business innovation start up grant program to provide funding assistance for small business formation. -- *Passed*
- <u>Resolution</u> establishing County policy to include scrolling text on webcasts and broadcasts of meetings of the Board of County Commissioners and its committees, informing the public of the current status of all items on the agenda. -- *Passed*
- <u>Resolution</u> exploring the feasibility of creating an affordable housing pilot program in District 8 that would allow for the installation of manufactured modular homes on County-owned property. -- *Passed*
- <u>Resolution</u> implementing bus service adjustments set forth in the Better Bus Network, including service enhancements to improve and expand service. -- *Passed*
- <u>**Resolution**</u> expanding the scope of the graffiti prevention pilot program plan for District 10 to address the feasibility of using wraps as a prevention method for utility facilities and associated equipment. -- *Passed*
- <u>**Resolution**</u> supporting Microsoft's Accelerate Miami-Dade Program to provide County residents with increased digital fluency and baseline skills for a three-year term. -- *Passed*
- <u>Resolution</u> implementing an educational public outreach campaign to promote awareness regarding the importance of the Environmentally Endangered Lands Program and the uniqueness of Miami-Dade County's subtropical ecosystems and natural communities. -- *Passed*
- <u>**Resolution**</u> urging the Florida Legislature to enact Senate Bill 226 or similar legislation that establishes a program to ensure stable funding for the veterinary care of retired law enforcement dogs. -- **Passed**
