Grant Advocacy & Agency Engagement

Pittman Law Group (PLG) continues to monitor and advocate for Miami-Dade County's pending federal grant applications. We have initiated outreach and are coordinating follow-up meetings with key officials within the following agencies:

- Federal Transit Administration (FTA)
- Department of Transportation (DOT)
- Federal Highway Administration (FHWA)
- Department of Justice (DOJ)
- Department of Energy (DOE)

We anticipate beginning to schedule meetings with relevant officials this month to discuss the County's submitted grant applications. Updates will be provided in the next report or immediately following key meetings, whichever preferred.

Legislative Update

With the 119th Congress just underway, the Florida/Miami-Dade County (MDC) Congressional delegation has introduced limited legislation thus far. However, several bills may have a direct impact on Miami-Dade County. Below is a selection of the most relevant bills:

- **H.R. 827** (Rep. Wilson) Addresses the availability of homeowners insurance following natural disasters.
- **H.R. 739** (Rep. Wilson) Expands public school lunch options to include salad bars.
- **H.R. 714** (Rep. Wilson) Establishes funding for local governments and organizations to create jobs.
- **H.R. 305** (Rep. Wilson) Requires at least one registered nurse on staff in elementary and secondary schools.
- H.R. 672 (Rep. Diaz-Balart) Establishes new ZIP codes.
