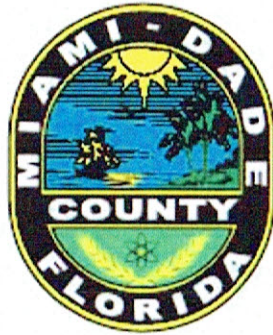

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I. Executive Summary



2013 State Legislative Report Executive Summary

The 2013 Legislative Session commenced on March 5th and came to a close on May 3rd. For the first time in six years, the session opened with no projected budget gap and the formulation of a fiscal plan for 2013-2014 was not a principal source of contention among the parties and House and Senate factions as has been the case in the past several years. In fact, the legislature benefited from a welcomed upswing in the economy and passed the biggest budget in state history at \$74.5 billion, which included \$18.5 billion for education, \$480 million for teacher pay increases and over \$200 million in pay increase for state workers.

The legislative session was largely defined by cooperation and collaboration by the two chambers' leadership and presiding officers and led to the easy passage of higher education, ethics, campaign finance and elections reform packages. Expected differences among Republicans and Democrats on the issue of expanding health care coverage to the needy associated with the federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act did not fully come to a head until the last of days of the session when House Democrats slowed floor debate by requiring legislation to be read in full.

A ban on internet cafés arose suddenly in the first half of the session to become an expedited priority for both chambers and Governor Rick Scott. After allegations of money laundering, racketeering and illegal gaming allegations surfaced in association with an organization with close ties to former Lt. Governor Jennifer Carroll, legislation moved quickly through the process to prohibit electronic games that resemble slot machines and was promptly signed into law upon passage. The controversy led to the Carroll's resignation on March 12th.

Miami-Dade County was successful this session in several critical areas that will be elaborated on in this report, such as:

- Passage of ocean outfalls legislation;
- Elections reform;
- Approval of funds and policies that allows the Jackson Health System to continue providing quality charitable care to the community;

- Funding for early learning and school readiness programs; and
- Averting the preemption of local wage theft and living wage ordinances.

The following report will provide a final review into issues that the Board of County Commissioners to selected as "Critical Priorities" prior to the start of the session and other major issues of interest. The report also includes a summary of resolutions passed by the Board, reports from our contract lobbyists, a summary of major budget issues, and a review of legislation passed by the Miami-Dade County Legislative Delegation.

II. Issue by Issue Review



COUNTY PRIORITIES

Elderly Services:

- **Senior centers/Local Service Providers/senior meal programs (FUNDED)**

The Conference Report on SB 1500 includes funding at \$7.5 million for senior centers, Local Service Providers and senior meal programs in Miami-Dade at line 416. Additional funding is provided at line 416 for:

\$500,000 Little Havana Activity Center Adult Day Care; \$500,000 City of Hialeah - Hot Meals; \$200,000 Hialeah Gardens - Hot Meals; \$250,000 Little Havana Activity Center - Local Services Program (LSP); \$1,000,000 Southwest Social Services - Badia Senior Center (vetoed)

Elder meal programs at line 416 including additional amounts above formula grants for Little Havana Activity Center, the City of Hialeah Hot Meal Program and the City of Hialeah Gardens Hot Meal Program were not vetoed. The Governor did veto an additional \$1 million for the Southwest Social Services – Badia Senior Center; this program still received \$732,000.

Jackson Health:

- **Medicaid Residency Program (PASSED)**

As part of SB 1500, the Governor approved \$80 million for Graduate Medical Education Statewide Medicaid Residency Program to offset the impact to **Jackson Memorial Hospital** and other charity care hospitals as part of the state's transition to the Diagnosis Related Group (DRG) methodology for Medicaid funding.

- **County Medicaid Contributions (PASSED)**

The Conference Report to SB 1520 moves County Medicaid Contributions from review of individual bills to a formula-based system. Initially the formula is based on Medicaid payments, but transitions to Medicaid enrollees over 7 years. The estimated fiscal impact on Miami-Dade is \$3.4 million in the first year and \$10.1 million over 7 years, and these amounts are in addition to the extra \$7 million in Medicaid payments over 5 years the Legislature imposed last session. The Conference Report on SB 1520 also places Miami-Dade's Medicaid contributions on an upward trajectory even though our Medicaid contributions have remained flat over the last decade or so. Five of our 6 Miami-Dade Senators voted against the Conference Report on SB 1520 on the Senate floor. (Approved by the Governor 5/20/13)

- **Health insurance/Affordable Care Act (DIED)**

SB 1816 by Sen. Negrón would have used up to \$50 billion in federal funds over the next decade available under the Affordable Care Act to provide premium assistance to people with incomes up to 138% of the federal poverty level. HB 7169 by Rep. Corcoran would not use federal funds and use \$237 million annually in state funds to cover low-income people by providing a \$2,000 voucher to buy insurance. The House and Senate could not reach agreement on a package both chambers could pass.

Deep Dredge:

- **Seaport Funding (PASSED)**

As part of SB 1500, the Governor approved more than \$278 million to continue the development and enhancement of Florida's seaports. PortMiami's Deep Dredge project along with the expansion of the Panama Canal is expected to significantly contribute towards the increase of Florida's Gross Domestic Product.

Pretrial Release:

- There was no legislation on this issue during the 2013 session.

Ocean Outfalls:

- **Ocean Outfalls (PASSED)**

SB 444 by Sen. Diaz de la Portilla (companion bill HB 707 by Rep. Manny Diaz); allows 5% of treated flows to be discharged during peak flows resulting in an estimated \$1 billion savings to Miami-Dade ratepayers. (Approved by the Governor on 4/24/13)

EARLY LEARNING COALITION:

- **Early Learning/School Readiness (FUNDED)**

The Conference Report on SB 1500 (Education conference, Rep. Fresen) includes an additional \$5 million in equity allocation funding for School Readiness programs earmarked for those Early Learning Coalitions that received funding reductions in Fiscal Year 12-13, including the Miami-Dade/Monroe Early Learning Coalition, which will receive an additional \$2,062,519.

Elections Reform / Voter Rights:

- **Elections (PASSED)**

HB 7013 by the House Elections Committee (companion bill SB 600 by Sen. Latvala) passed both the House and Senate on the last day. HB 7013 increases early voting days, hours and sites; makes it a first degree misdemeanor to possess more than 2 absentee ballots except the voter's own ballot and ballots of immediate family members; allows voters to cure an absentee ballot without a signature, among other provisions. The Final version of HB 7013 did not include language allowing the Secretary of State to place Supervisors of Elections in "noncompliant status". (HB 7013 was approved by the Governor on 5/21/13)

Here is a breakdown of the provisions in CS/ HB 7013:

Early Voting Days and Hours:

- 8 days minimum, 14 days maximum, beginning on the 15th day before and ending on the 2nd day before an election; must be provided on the 10th through the 3rd day before the election; early voting optional at the supervisor of elections' (supervisor) discretion on the Sunday before the general election.
- 64 hours minimum, 168 hours maximum for at least 8 but no more than 12 hours per day.

Early Voting Sites:

- Expands currently authorized sites to include fairgrounds, civic centers, courthouses, county commission buildings, stadiums, convention centers, government-owned senior centers and government-owned community centers.
- Allows a supervisor to designate one additional site per county in an area where no authorized sites exist.

- Requires a supervisor to operate at least the same total number of early voting sites for a general election that the county operated in the 2012 general election.

Registering to Vote:

- Authorizes an individual or accompanying family member who returned from military deployment or activation to register to vote until 5pm on Friday before election.

Multi-Language Ballots:

- Authorizes a supervisor in a county subject to multi-language ballot requirements to petition the U.S. Department of Justice for authorization to print and deliver single-language ballots for each minority language required.

Absentee Ballots:

- Requires requests for ballots not being sent to a voter's address on file in the Florida Voter Registration System to be in writing and signed by the elector, but exempts absent uniformed services voters and overseas voters; prohibits delivery of absentee ballots from a supervisor to a voter on Election Day except in emergencies, and requires an affidavit affirming the facts of the emergency.
- Provides that otherwise acceptable ballots of absent uniformed services and overseas voters in a presidential preference primary or general election must be counted if postmarked or dated no later than Election Day and received by the supervisor no later than 10 days after the election.
- Allows supervisors to use a voter's signature on the precinct register, in addition to the registration books, to determine if the elector is duly registered; provides a mechanism to "cure" unsigned absentee ballots by filing an affidavit under certain circumstances until 5 p.m. on the day before an election.

Election Preparation Report:

- Requires each supervisor to prepare and publish a report, at least 3 months before a general election, outlining preparations for the election, including anticipated staffing levels and the anticipated amount of automatic tabulating equipment at each voting site.

Primary Election:

- Provides that a primary election is held on the Tuesday 10 weeks, rather than 12 weeks, prior to the general election.

Vendor Penalties:

- Creates a mechanism for the Department of State to investigate defective voting systems, suspend sales and use of systems, and impose civil penalties of \$25,000 per defect, plus actual costs, against vendors under certain circumstances.
- Requires vendors to file disclosures with the department identifying defects in the vendor's voting system.

Solicitation Zones:

- Prohibits solicitation within 100 feet of a supervisor's office where absentee ballots are requested and printed on demand.

Special Registration:

- Changes from 2016 to 2020 the date by which supervisors are required to provide a voter interface device that meets the voter accessibility requirements for individuals with disabilities.

Voting in a Different Precinct:

- Allows a voter who moves to another county to vote a regular ballot in the precinct to which he or she has moved if the new precinct is in a county that uses an electronic database as a precinct register at the polling place.

Voting System Audit:

- Provides supervisors the option of using an automated, independent audit instead of conducting a manual audit and establishes requirements for automated audits; requires the Department of State to adopt rules for approval of an independent audit system.

Presidential Preference Primary Date:

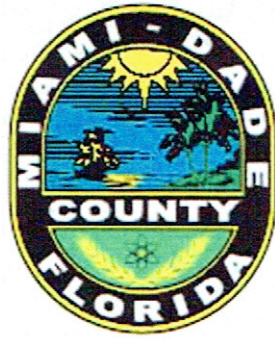
- Provides that the presidential preference primary must be held in each year the number of which is a multiple of 4 on the first Tuesday that the rules of the major political parties allow state delegations to be allocated without penalty.

Canvassing Boards:

- Provides for alternate members of county canvassing boards; requires the results of early voting and absentee ballots canvassed and tabulated by the end of early voting to be uploaded to the county's election management system by 7pm on the day before election.

Legislative Ballot Summaries:

- Applies a 75-word limit to the first of multiple summaries in a joint resolution, while any remaining summaries, including a rewritten summary by the Attorney General, will not be subject to a 75-word limit; applies a 75-word limit to joint resolutions containing only one summary; removes language allowing the full text of an amendment or revision in a ballot statement; removes language requiring voting systems to allow placement of an amendment or revision's full text on the ballot by 2013.



OTHER ISSUES OF INTEREST

Citizens Property Insurance (PASSED)

- SB 1770 by Sen. Simmons (companion bill HB 909 by Rep. Wood) is intended to gradually reduce over time the number of policies in the state-run Citizens Property Insurance Corporation, but is substantially scaled back from the original bills filed. SB 1770 does not increase the current 10% cap on annual Citizens' rate increases (early in the session, these bills would have increased the cap to 13% or 15% and contained other provisions that could have increased rates further). The final version of SB 1770 reduces the maximum amount of coverage available from Citizens from \$1 million to \$700,000 over three years and prohibits Citizens coverage for new buildings seaward of the coastal construction line. It also authorizes Citizens to set up a clearinghouse to shop new policies in the private market.

County Medicaid Contributions (PASSED)

- The Conference Report to SB 1520 moves County Medicaid Contributions from review of individual bills to a formula-based system. Initially the formula is based on Medicaid payments, but transitions to Medicaid enrollees over 7 years. The estimated fiscal impact on Miami-Dade is \$3.4 million in the first year and \$10.1 million over 7 years, and these amounts are in addition to the extra \$7 million in Medicaid payments over 5 years the Legislature imposed last session. The Conference Report on SB 1520 also places Miami-Dade's Medicaid contributions on an upward trajectory even though our Medicaid contributions have remained flat over the last decade or so. Dolphins/Sun Life Stadium (DIED)

- SB 306 by Sen. Braynon; HB 165 by Rep. Gonzalez; SB 1828; HB 7127 all died in messages from the Senate to the House when the House did not take up any of these bills. SB 306 and HB 165 would have provided a \$3 million annual sales tax incentive and authority to raise mainland bed tax from 6% to 7% to fund Sun Life Stadium renovation.

Living wage preemption (DIED)

- HB 655 by House Majority Leader Precourt passed but without the living/responsible wage preemption, which the Senate refused to accept. HB 655 as passed preempts local governments from regulating sick time and other employee benefits for private employers not doing business with local government. There are exceptions for domestic violence and sexual abuse leave ordinances. (Presented to the Governor)

Wage theft preemption (DIED)

- HB 1125 by Rep. Goodson passed the House but died in messages; SB 1216 by Sen. Bradley died on the Senate floor when consideration was temporarily postponed and the Senate never returned to the bill. In any event, both SB 1216 and HB 1125 included a grandfather for Miami-Dade's wage theft program.

Florida Department of Transportation Package (DIED)

- HB 7127 by Rep. Artiles (companion bill SB 1132 by Sen. Brandes) was the FDOT package and it died in the closing hours of session. HB 7127 included language creating a strategic airport investment initiative similar to FDOT's seaport program, and also included language leading to consolidation of Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) statewide. Language keeping Miami-Dade as its own MPO was in HB 7127 throughout the session, but dropped out of the bill on the last day when the Senate adopted a 122-page strike-all amendment that also included the Dolphins/Sun Life Stadium language. HB 7127 died in returning messages to the House when the House did not take it up before the session ended.

Miami-Dade express lane toll revenue (DIED)

- Sen. Rene Garcia ran an amendment to the FDOT package, HB 7127, on the Senate floor that would have required all express lane toll revenues generated in Miami-Dade County to in Miami-Dade, but Sen. Brandes, the bill's sponsor,

would not accept the amendment and asked that the issue be further studied for possible inclusion in the FDOT package next session.

Local preference preemption (DIED)

- SB 684 by Sen. Hays; HB 307 by Rep. Tobia and HB 1017 by Rep. Fresen would have preempted county local preference programs and created a preference program where Florida businesses have preference over out-of-state in contracts by the state and local governments. These bills died in committee.

In-house labor preemption (DIED)

- SB 602 by Sen. Hukill and HB 687 by Rep. McBurney would have eliminated the ability of local governments to use in-house labor for construction projects in limits circumstances. These bills died in committee.

Ban on internet cafes/maquinitas (PASSED)

- HB 155 by Reps. Trujillo & Patronis (companion bill SB 1030 by Sen. Thrasher) clarifies state law to ban Internet cafes and maquinitas. (Approved by the Governor on 4/10/13)

FRS reform/closure of pension plan to new employees (DIED)

- HB 7011 by Rep. Brodeur would have closed the FRS pension plan to new employees. HB 7011 passed the House on a party line vote, but died on the Senate floor by a vote of 18-22.

Ban on texting while driving (PASSED)

- SB 52 by Sen. Detert (companion bill HB 13 by Rep. Holder) bans texting while driving as a secondary offense. SB 52 passed in the closing days of session. (Approved by the Governor on 5/21/13)

Red light camera repeal (DIED)

- HB 4011 by Reps. Campbell and Trujillo would have repealed authority for local government red light camera programs, but HB 4011 died in committee. Red light camera language did pass in HB 7125, the Department of Highway Safety & Motor Vehicles package, that further restricts red light camera enforcement on

rights turns; allows a person who receives a red light camera notice of violation 60 days to request a hearing without paying a fee in advance; and provides a local hearing process for red light camera appeals.

Health insurance/Affordable Care Act (DIED)

- SB 1816 by Sen. Negron would have used up to \$50 billion in federal funds over the next decade available under the Affordable Care Act to provide premium assistance to people with incomes up to 138% of the federal poverty level. HB 7169 by Rep. Corcoran would not use federal funds and use \$237 million annually in state funds to cover low-income people by providing a \$2,000 voucher to buy insurance. The House and Senate could not reach agreement on a package both chambers could pass.

Drones (PASSED)

- SB 92 by Sen. Negron (companion bill HB 119 by Rep. Workman) requires a search warrant for the use of drones by law enforcement except in the case of emergencies, such as searches for missing children or escaped fugitives. (SB 92 was approved by the Governor on 4/22/13)

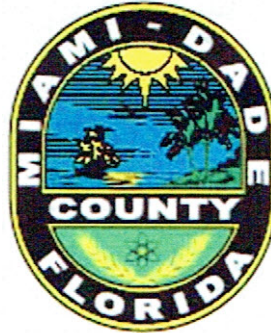
Prohibition on firearms purchases by mentally-ill persons (PASSED)

- HB 1355 by Rep. Barbara Watson (Senate companion bill SB 1000 by Sen. Gibson) expands the prohibition on mentally-ill persons purchasing a firearms to include persons who have had an involuntary examination under the Baker Act and who have voluntarily admitted themselves for outpatient or inpatient treatment if certain circumstances are met. (Presented to the Governor)

National Mortgage Settlement/Affordable Housing (PASSED/FUNDED)

- SB 1852 by Senate Appropriations Committee (Companion bill HB 7111 by House Approps) passed the last week of session (Approved by the Governor on 6/4/13). SB 1852 includes a spending plan for Florida's \$200 million share of the National Mortgage Settlement, which was appropriated as follows:
 - \$50 million for the State Apartment Incentive Loan Program (SAIL) (\$25 million for rental units for the elderly and \$25 million for rental units for extremely-low-income persons);
 - \$10 million for Florida Housing Finance Corporation to fund the construction or rehabilitation of units through SAIL;
 - \$40 million for the State Housing Initiatives Partnership (SHIP) program;

- \$10 million to fund a competitive grant program for housing for homeless persons;
- \$10 million to fund a competitive grant program for housing developments for persons with developmental disabilities;
- \$10 million for capital improvement grants for certified domestic violence centers;
- \$9.1 million for the Florida Prepaid Tuition Scholarship Program for Take Stock in Children to purchase a 2-year dormitory residence advance payment contract for eligible students;
- \$5.2 million for State Court System technology solutions that expedite foreclosure cases;
- \$16 million for the State Court System for supplemental resources to reduce the backlog of pending foreclosure cases;
- \$9.7 million to the Clerks of Court to assist the courts with processing foreclosure cases;
- \$10 million for legal aid services for low and moderate-income homeowners facing foreclosure;
- \$20 million for Habitat for Humanity of Florida for the acquisition and rehabilitation or reconstruction of existing housing stock for low-income affordable housing.



OTHER BUDGET ITEMS OF INTEREST

SW 157 Avenue Canal Interconnect (FUNDED/VETOED)

- The Conference Report on SB 1500 includes \$1.1 million for the SW 157 Avenue Canal Interconnect project at line 1640c. (Vetoed)

SW 157 Avenue Canal Project, Unincorporated Miami-Dade County, \$1.1 million at Line 1640C was vetoed. The Governor vetoed funding in the total amount of approximately \$25 million for 50 or so water projects that did not "demonstrate an ability to contribute to a statewide investment". In addition to the County project, a number of city water projects within Miami-Dade County also were vetoed (see pages 3 and 4 of the attached veto list).

Miami Military Museum (FUNDED)

- The Conference Report on SB 1500 includes \$500,000 for the Miami Military Museum at line 3149.

Film/TV Incentives (NOT FUNDED)

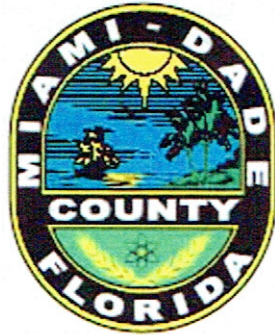
- The Senate, House and Governor could not agree on additional funding for film and TV incentives. Film and TV incentives were funded last year in the amount of \$42 million, and these incentives were immediately used. There are no additional state funds for tax incentives to attract film and TV projects to Florida.

Library grants (FUNDED)

- The Conference Report on SB 1500 includes full funding of statewide library grants to local governments in the amount of \$24.7 million at line 3137.

Florida Recreation Development Assistance Program (FRDAP) Grants (FUNDED)

- The budget funds FRDAP at \$642,000.



BCC RESOLUTIONS

719-11: Propose a constitutional amendment to provide local governments the authority to provide local businesses with property reductions, credits and other incentives to install video surveillance cameras; further providing state tax incentives to business to install video surveillance cameras.

- No bills were filed this legislative session

750-11: Strengthening law related to human trafficking and sex trafficking consistent with legislation passed earlier this year by the Georgia General Assembly.

- HB 1325 by Rep. Ross (R-Riverview) and SB 1644 by Sen. Flores (R-Miami) Victims of Human Trafficking: Revises mental, emotional, or developmental age of child victim whose out-of-court statement describing specified criminal acts is admissible in evidence in certain instances; provides for expungement of criminal history record of victim of human trafficking. HB 1325 has been signed into law by the Governor.

938-11: Enact workplace anti-bullying legislation.

- SB 308 by Sen. Braynon (D-Miami Gardens) and Rep. Campbell (D-Miami Shores) would have created the "Abusive Workplace Environment Act", prohibiting a public employer from subjecting his or her employee to an abusive workplace environment. Both bills died in committee.

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940-11: Making it a third degree felony to retrieve or return more than one absentee ballot from a non-relative

- HB 7013 by the House Elections Committee (companion bill SB 600 by Sen. Latvala) passed both the House and Senate and was signed by the Governor. HB 7013 contains a provision addressing the crime of possessing more than two absentee ballots other than the voter's own ballot or those of immediate family members. The crime is now a first degree misdemeanor rather than a third degree felony as previous language suggested.

1091-11: Extend Florida's anti-bullying law to private schools

- No bill was filed this session

1092-11: Requiring that an unemployed person complete an online employment registration application through "Employ Florida Marketplace" before receiving unemployment.

- No bill was filed this session

1094-11: Increase regulation of hiring practices for residential and commercial pest control companies and require non-waivable liability for theft while property is under their control / or grant local governments' ability to enact their own laws.

- No bills were filed this session

182-12: Amend Article 1, Section 2 of the Florida Constitution and repeal the Alien Land Law.

- No bills were filed this session

183-12: Establish a school of Veterinary Medicine in Miami-Dade County and explore affiliation with the University of Florida's College of Veterinary Medicine.

- No bills were filed this session

249-12: Supporting SB 1728 and HB 1467 or similar that would prohibit public high school students from leaving school grounds during designated lunch period.

- No bills were filed this session

439-12: Require that assisted living facilities and community residential homes that are located within areas zoned as residential and serve residents with substance abuse disorders or with severe mental illness to implement effective monitoring and security measures to ensure safety of residents within the facility and surrounding neighborhood.

- Several bills regarding assisted living facilities were filed and died. However, none of the bills specifically addressed the monitoring or security measures described in the resolution.

443-12: Florida Education Commissioner to review out-of-school suspension in public schools.

- Not addressed this session

492-12: Conduct an interim study on how laws can be strengthened related to false, stolen and counterfeit identity documents in an effort to combat human and sex trafficking.

- The human trafficking bill that passed did not specifically address stolen and counterfeit identity documents.

493-12: Reinstate the automatic restoration of voting rights for 5 citizens convicted of non-violent felonies who have completed their sentences.

- No bill was filed this session

495-12: Ban the use of meat containing "Pink Slime" in food that the State of Florida prepares or serves.

- SB 1706 and SB 1708 by Senator Dwight Bullard (D- Cutler Bay) both died in committee. SB 1706 Urged Congress and the United States Food and Drug Administration to ban the use of pink slime in meat products or require labels on meat products containing pink slime. SB 1706 Required persons or entities operating restaurants, eating places, markets, or packinghouses to mark beef containing "pink slime" with certain words.

503-12: Repeal the state preemption of local governments' ability to address abandoned shopping carts. Fausto

- The no bill was filed this session.

521-12: Opposing a proposal by Citizens Property Insurance Corp. to increase property insurance rates by more than the 10 percent annual cap set in statute.

- SB 1770 by Senator David Simmons (Almonte Springs) Property Insurance; Amending provisions relating to the Florida Hurricane Catastrophe Fund; revising the restrictions on public adjuster compensation, payment, commission, fee, or any other thing of value; providing that certain residential structures are not eligible for coverage by the corporation after specified dates; establishing the Office of Inspector General within the corporation; requiring the creation of a clearinghouse program within the corporation.
- SB 1770 as passed does not raise the current 10 percent cap on annual Citizen's rate increases. (Approved by the Governor on 5/29/13)

615-12: Enact Limited Amnesty from penalties and interest to encourage taxpayers who improperly received homestead exemptions to come forward, pay post taxes, and have their properties properly placed on the tax rolls for future taxes.

- This issue was not addressed this session

616-12: Reinstate a universal motorcycle helmet law.

- There was no legislation requiring the reinstatement of a universal motorcycle helmet law this session. However, the legislature did provide a \$250,000 allocation to ABATE for motorcycle safety education, including using helmets.

619-12: Adopt and implement the recommendations of the Education Commissioner's task force on inclusion and accountability related to English language learners and students with disabilities.

723-12: Ban texting while driving.

- SB 52 by Nancy Detert (R-Venice) to ban texting while driving imposes a \$30 fine as a secondary offense. The bill allows the use of talk-to-text phone and texting while stopped at a red light or pulled over. (Approved by the Governor on 5/28/13 and takes effect Oct 1)

724-12: Simplify the current civil penalty procedures for toll violations; authorize FDOT, HSMV and Expressway Authority to use all available means for transmitting toll invoices

and violations; better educate the public about the importance of keeping information current related to Sunpass, Toll-By-Plate and toll violations.

- The Florida Turnpike Authority, Miami-Dade Expressway Authority, and the Orange-Orlando Expressway Authority have jointly agreed to consolidate the statewide “back –office” operations of all tolling authorities. This is intended to streamline invoicing and communications with the public. Additionally, physical offices will open around Miami-Dade County where tolling issues can be addressed. The Florida Transportation Commission approved the proposed agreement and the consolidated services will begin by early next year.

729-12: Exempt from public records disclosure absentee ballot requests and personal information included on such requests.

- Please refer to *Elections* above

730-12: Reinstate “For Cause” requirements for use of absentee ballots to restore integrity to the absentee ballot process.

- Please refer to *Elections* above

741-12: Apply early voting uniformly across the state and return early voting to the full possible 14 days in place before the passage of HB 1355 including the Sunday before Election Day.

- HB 7013 by the House Elections Committee (companion bill SB 600 by Sen. Latvala) passed both the House and Senate and was signed into law by the Governor. The bill allows for 8 days minimum, 14 days maximum, beginning on the 15th day before and ending on the 2nd day before an election; must be provided on the 10th through the 3rd day before the election; early voting optional at the supervisor of elections’ (supervisor) discretion on the Sunday before the general election. 64 hours minimum, 168 hours maximum for at least 8 but no more than 12 hours per day.

823-12: Restore school readiness funding to the Early Learning Coalition of Miami-Dade/Monroe that recently has been reduced as a result of new statewide funding formula.

- The conference report on SB 1500 (Education conference, Rep. Erik Fresen (R-Miami)) included an additional \$5 million in equity allocation funding for School Readiness programs for those Early Learning Coalitions that received funding reductions in Fiscal Yr. 2012-1, including Miami-Dade/Monroe Early Learning

Coalition, which will receive an additional \$2,062,519. (Approved by the Governor on 5/20/13)

824-12: Reinstating language prohibiting certain municipal water and sewer utilities from imposing a surcharge on consumers located outside the city as "Taxation without Representation".

- This issue was not addressed this session

825-12: Enact comprehensive legislation during the 2013 session to protect the elderly and other vulnerable populations that reside in assisted living facilities, further take all regulatory and enforcement actions necessary to ensure the health and safety of residents of assisted living facilities.

- HB 87 by Fasano (R- New Port Richey) Assisted Living Facilities: Revises duties of case manager for, & the community living support plan of, mental health resident of assisted living facility; requires revocation of facility license for certain violations that result in death of a resident; requires licensure of facility administrators; revises training requirements for staff who provide care for persons with Alzheimer's disease & related disorders; provides for fines & grounds for disciplinary action for ALF administrators. HB 87 and other compare bills filed all died in committee.

827-12: Provide funding for the restoration of Naval Air Station Richmond Building No. 25 as the Miami Military Museum.

- The Miami Military Museum was funded in the amount \$500,000. This was included as a line item in the Conference Report on SB 1500. (Approved by the Governor on 5/20/13)

859-12: Opposing a new motor vehicle tax based on vehicle miles traveled due to the potential negative impact to economic development and tourism as well as privacy concerns.

- The Florida Legislature will not approve a new motor vehicle tax based on vehicle miles traveled but in the legislative interim may explore imposing this tax in lieu of the state fuel tax.

965-12: Revisit and revise the 2012-2018 state board of education strategic plan to eliminate provisions that set different student proficiency goals for different racial and ethnic groups.

966-12: Increase the size of motorcycle license plates or alternatively to increase the size of letters and numbers used on motorcycle license plates in order to make them easier to read.

- The state redesigned all license plates to make them more readable for police and cameras. The new plates are all flat with solid black letters and were approved by the Florida Cabinet late last year. The cost of the new plates is \$31 million and they will be rolled out beginning in 2014.

984-12: Create a rest stop near Tallahassee for cattle being transported from Texas and other cattle-producing states in that region to Miami for the Miami international agriculture, horse & cattle show.

- This issue is in progress

1082-12: Passage of SB 64 or similar legislation that would impose reasonable regulations on the parasailing industry in the interest of safety AK

- SB 64 died in committee

1090-12: Elections Advisory Group Recommendations

- Please refer to *Elections* under Critical Priorities

11-13: Codesignate SW 152 Street as "Reverend John A. Ferguson Street" from being between SW 99 court and SW 117 Avenue to being between SW 99 court and state road 821/homestead extension of the Florida turnpike.

- SB 300 by Nancy Detert (R-Venice) and HB7117 by the House Transportation & Highway Subcommittee were the companion Senate and House road designation bills. Both bills died.

51-13: Supporting the 2013 legislative program of the Southeast Florida Regional Climate Change Compact

- No movement on this issue this session

52-13: Pass during the 2013 session a statewide wage theft law modeled after the Miami-Dade County wage theft ordinance Ballard

- HB 1125 by Goodson (R-Titusville) and SB 1216 by Bradley (R-Orange Park) failed to pass this session. If enacted, the legislation would have preempted wage theft regulation to state but did include a grandfathering provision to preserve Miami-Dade County's wage theft ordinance.

53-13: Limit the number of constitutional amendments the Florida legislature proposes

- Please see *Elections* under Critical Priorities.

54-13: Opposing a state budget proposal by the Florida department of corrections to shift corrections costs from the state to counties

- No negative impact to the County was reported this session.

55-13: Increase Criminal Penalties for use of Assault Weapons during a felony

- No action taken by Legislature

56-13: Identification for Ammunition Purchase

- No action taken by Legislature

57-13: Possession of an AK-47 or other Semi-Weapons

- No action taken by Legislature

58-13: Gun Show Loophole AK

- No action taken by Legislature

HB 1355 by Watson (D-Miami Gardens) substituted SB 1000 by Gibson (D-Jacksonville) and was passed out of the Senate. HB 1355 has been sent to the Governor. The bill closes a loophole that allowed those who had submitted themselves to inpatient or outpatient mental health treatment to purchase firearms if they were found to be a danger to themselves or others, or would have been committed by the courts had they not committed themselves.

59-13: Ban Possession or Sale of High Capacity Magazine

- No action taken by Legislature

60-13: Increase funding for Mental Health Programs

- There was no funding increase to mental health programs this session

67-13: Enact legislation to enable the county to levy an additional penny of professional sports bed tax and permit the state to grant a state sales tax rebate from the sale of goods and services at sun life stadium in order to fund a portion of the costs expended for the upgrade and modernization of sun life stadium.

- SB 306 by Sen. Braynon (D-Miami Gardens) and its companion, HB 165 by Rep. Gonzalez (R-Hialeah) did not pass. The Senate bill, SB 306 by Senator Braynon, passed all of its four committees. HB 165 by Representatives Gonzalez and Fresen passed two of its three committees of reference, but was not heard in the House Appropriations committee and was not heard on the House floor. During the last week in order to increase options for passage, the substance of SB 306, was amended on to the Senate Appropriations tax administration package, SB 1828, which passed the Senate but was not heard in the House. Subsequently, the sales tax rebate portion of the bill was amended in the Senate onto the Department of Transportation package, HB 7127, changing the title of the bill to a bill related to economic development. That bill was sent to the House and was in messages, where the referendum language was added on in anticipation of that bill being taken up in returning Senate messages to the House. All three vehicles related to the stadium economic development matter, failed to come up before the Legislature adjourned Sine Die.

112-13: Update a national background check database with Florida adjudications of mental defectiveness or commitments to mental institutions and to ensure utilization of the national database in screening Florida applicants for concealed weapon and firearm licenses for disqualifying records from other jurisdictions.

- HB 1355 by Rep Watson (D-Miami Gardens) closes a loophole to guard against gun purchases by people with mental illness. People who voluntarily admit themselves for treatment, then quickly check out would be put into databases to prevent them from buying guns. (Presented to the Governor)

113-13: Pass legislation amending the community redevelopment act to modify the criteria for the creation of a community redevelopment agency to include land previously used as a military facility.

- SB 856 by Sen. Dwight Bullard (D-Cutler Bay) and HB 621 by Rep. Kionne McGhee (D-Miami) would have expanded the definition of “blighted area” for the purposes of the Community Redevelopment Act to include land that previously was uses as a military facility and is located adjacent to a county-owned zoological park, targeted at former Coast Guard facility near Zoo Miami. Both bills died in committee.

118-13: Enact during the 2013 session the state legislative recommendations of the grand jury report on absentee ballot fraud; further amend state elections law to allow supervisors of elections to contact an elector if the elector returns an absentee ballot without a signature on the envelope or if the signature does not match the registered signature on file.

- Please refer to *Elections* under Critical Priorities

119-13: Opposing legislation by the Florida legislature during the 2013 session that would raise the cap on current annual property insurance rate increases by Citizens Property Insurance Corporation.

- SB 1700 by Senator David Simmons (Almonte Springs) Property Insurance; Amending provisions relating to the Florida Hurricane Catastrophe Fund; revising the restrictions on public adjuster compensation, payment, commission, fee, or any other thing of value; providing that certain residential structures are not eligible for coverage by the corporation after specified dates; establishing the Office of Inspector General within the corporation; requiring the creation of a clearinghouse program within the corporation. SB 1700 as passed does not raise the current 10 percent cap on annual Citizen’s rate increases. It reduces the maximum amount of coverage available from \$1 million to \$700 over three years and prohibits Citizens coverage for new buildings seaward of the coastal construction line. It further authorizes Citizens to set up a clearing house to shop new policies in the private market. SB 1700 was signed into law by the Governor.

120-13: Support the opening of a SEED school in Miami-Dade County and to appropriate funds for such a school in Miami-Dade County.

- No action was taken by the Legislature.

124-13: Pass legislation during the 2013 session to restore early voting to the full 14 days that was in place before the passage of HB 1355 including the Sunday before election day; further urging the legislature to provide counties greater flexibility related to the hours for early voting; identifying this issue as a critical county priority for the 2013 session.

- Please refer to *Elections* under Critical Priorities

183-13: Require health insurance companies to cover bariatric procedures when said procedure is a medically necessary treatment as determined by a surgeon or referring physician.

- Bariatric procedures were not addresses this session.

185-13: Supporting Florida international university's 2013 state legislative priorities and urging the Florida legislature to enact the university's legislative priorities.

- No action was taken by the Legislature.

186-13: Maintain funding for the local services program and other vital programs for the elderly in Miami-Dade County.

- There were no cuts to Miami-Dade meals programs, as all were fully funded in the base budget. Additionally funded were the following: Little Havana Activity Center Adult Day Care - \$500,000; City of Hialeah- Hot Meals - \$500,000; Hialeah Gardens- Hot Meals - \$200,000; and Little Havana Activity Center –LSP \$250,000.

260-13: Enact SB 390, HB 1077, or similar legislation prohibiting or making it a criminal offense to make misrepresentations concerning solicitations for veterans.

- SB 390 by Sen. Dean (R-Iverness) (companion bill HB 1077 by Rep. Steube (R-Sarasota)) Prohibits a business entity from advertising or holding itself out to the public as a veterans' organization or similar entity and further prohibits misrepresentation as a service member or veteran and wearing military or veterans' uniform, medal, or insignia. SB 390 awaits the governor's signature. He must act by June 12.

261-13: Enact legislation that imposes mandatory minimum terms of imprisonment to drivers who are found guilty of leaving the scene of a crash.

- No bill addressed this issue during this session.

262-13: Adopt SB 888, the Desline Victor voting rights bill, or similar legislation during the 2013 session.

- SB 888 was filed and referred to four committees but died in its first committee of reference. A similar bill HB 1259 also died in its House subcommittee.

266-13: Utilize toll revenues generated in Miami-Dade County from facilities under their jurisdiction for the construction, maintenance, operation and improvement of eligible transportation infrastructure in Miami-Dade County subject to payment of required debt.

- Senator Rene Garcia (R-Hialeah) offered an amendment on the Senate floor to HB 7127 (FDOT package), that would have required all express lane toll revenues generated in Miami-Dade County to remain in Miami-Dade County. However, companion bill (SB 1132) sponsor Sen. Jeff Brandes (R- St. Petersburg) did not accept the amendment and asked that it be further studied for possible inclusion in the FDOT package next year.

267-13: Oppose language included in SB 1192 or similar legislation that preempts local government regulation of pain management clinics and health care clinics, facilities or individual medical providers that receive reimbursement under the Florida motor vehicle no-fault law.

- SB 1192 by Sen. Grimsley (R-Sebring) died in House messages the last day of session.

268-13: Enact SB 1142, HB 985, or similar legislation promoting and protecting small business participation in state contracting.

- Both SB 1142 and HB 985 died in committee.

280-13: Enact current provisions of SB 1434 AND HB 585 or other similar legislation which would limit the number of lead-acid batteries or parts thereof that a secondary metals recycler may purchase in certain transactions in a single day.

- HB 585 by Rep. Hood (R-Daytona) was substituted for SB 1438 by Sen. Evers (R-Crestview) and passed both Houses. HB 585 includes provisions that limit the number of lead-acid batteries that secondary metals recycler may purchase in certain transactions. (Approved by the Governor on 6/05/13)

IV. Bills Passed by Miami-Dade State Legislative Delegation

Bills Passed by the Miami-Dade County Legislative Delegation – 2013 Legislative Session

SB 86/HB 113 - Senator Anitere Flores and Representative Manny Diaz, Jr - Distribution of Materials Harmful to Minors:

- Prohibiting an adult from knowingly distributing to a minor or posting on school property certain specified materials harmful to minors; providing an exception, etc.

HB 151 – Representative Daphne Campbell – Memorial:

- Haitian Family Reunification Parole Program: Urges U.S. Secretary of Homeland Security & U.S. Department of Homeland Security to create Haitian Family Reunification Parole Program.

HB 155 – Representative Carlos Trujillo (Prime Co-Sponsor: Representative Jimmy Patronis) - Prohibition of Electronic Gambling Devices:

- Revises provisions relating to drawings by chance offered by nonprofit organizations, game promotions in connection with sale of consumer products or services, amusement games or machines, amusement centers, racketeering activity, & promotional offers; provides that violations are deceptive & unfair trade practices; and provides legislative findings & declarations.

SB 186 – Senator Miguel Diaz de la Portilla - Jurisdiction of the Courts:

- Providing that a person submits to the jurisdiction of the courts of this state by entering into a contract that specifies that the law of this state governs the contract and that the person agrees to submit to the jurisdiction of the courts of this state; clarifying the circumstances under which an arbitration is international; limiting the application of certain provisions to instances in which an arbitral tribunal orders a party to preserve evidence that may be relevant and material to the resolution of a dispute, etc.

HB 217 – Representative Jose Olive and Representative Travis Cummings - Money Services Businesses:

- Requires licensees engaged in check cashing to submit certain transaction information to OFR related to payment instruments cashed; requires office to maintain transaction information in centralized check cashing database; requires office to issue competitive solicitation for database to maintain certain transaction information relating to check cashing; authorizes office to request funds & to submit draft legislation after certain requirements are met; authorizes FSC to adopt rules.

HB 229 – Representative Jose J. Rodriguez - Land Trusts:

- Providing requirements relating to vesting of ownership in trustee; revises rights, liabilities, & duties of land trust beneficiaries; provides exclusion & applicability; revises provisions relating to land trust transfers of real property & vesting of ownership in trustee; prohibits operation of statute of uses & doctrine of merger to execute land trust or to vest trust property under certain conditions; provides conditions under which beneficial interest is deemed real property; authorizes certain beneficial ownership methods; provides for perfection of security documents; provides that trustee's legal & equitable title to trust property is separate & distinct from beneficiary's beneficial interest in land trust & trust property; prohibits lien, judgment, mortgage, security interest or other encumbrance against one interest from automatically attaching to another interest; provides that appointment of guardian ad litem is not necessary in certain foreclosure litigation affecting title to trust property of land trust; provides for determination of applicable law for certain trusts; provides applicability relating to UCC financing statements; provides requirements for recording effectiveness; revises & provides scope of Florida Trust Code.

HB 277 – Representative Jose F. Diaz and Representative Michelle Rehwinkel-Vasilinda - Assessment of Residential and Nonhomestead Real Property:

- Defines "renewable energy source device"; excludes value of certain installations made after specified date from assessed value of residential real property; provides applicability; specifies additional exceptions to assessment of homestead property at just value; specifies additional exceptions to assessment of nonhomestead property at just value; deletes definition of terms "renewable

energy source device" & "device"; repeals provisions relating to property tax exemption for renewable energy source devices.

HB 301 – Representative Jeanette Nuñez and Representative Debbie Mayfield - Cancer Treatment:

- Creates "Cancer Treatment Fairness Act"; requires that individual or group insurance policy or contract or health maintenance contract that provides coverage for cancer treatment medications provide coverage for orally administered cancer treatment medications; requires that individual or group insurance policy or contract or health maintenance contract provide coverage for orally administered cancer treatment medications on basis no less favorable than that required by policy or contract for intravenously administered or injected cancer treatment medications; excludes grandfathered health plans from coverage & cost-sharing requirements; prohibits insurers, HMOs, & certain other entities from engaging in specified actions to avoid compliance with this act; provides limits on certain cost-sharing requirements.

HB 361 – Representative Daphne Campbell and Representative Dave Kerner - Public Meetings/Criminal Justice Commissions:

- Provides exemption from public meeting requirements for that portion of meeting of duly constituted criminal justice commission at which specified members of commission discuss active criminal intelligence information or active criminal investigative information currently being considered by, or which may foreseeably come before, commission; provides for future review & repeal of exemption; provides statement of public necessity.

HB 413 – Representative Daphne Campbell and Representative Travis Hutson - Physical Therapy:

- Authorizes physical therapist to implement physical therapy treatment plans of specified duration which are developed by physical therapist or provided by practitioner of record or ARNP.

SB 444/HB 707 – Senator Miguel Diaz de la Portilla and Representative Manny Diaz, Jr. - Domestic Wastewater Discharged through Ocean Outfalls:

- Revising the measurement standard for the wastewater flow; revising the requirements for installation of a functioning reuse system by a utility that had a permit for a domestic wastewater facility on a specified date to discharge through ocean outfall; revising plan requirements for the elimination of ocean outfalls; requiring that the Department of Environmental Protection approve certain apportionment of reuse if a facility contracts with another facility to install a functioning reuse system, etc.

SB 464 – Senator Anitere Flores - Disposition of Unclaimed Property:

- Authorizing the Department of Financial Services to adopt rules that allow an apparent owner of unclaimed property to submit a claim to the department electronically; providing for applicability with respect to specified property reported and remitted to the Chief Financial Officer, etc.

HB 465 – Representative Manny Diaz, Jr. and Representative Jason Brodeur - Exceptional Student Education:

- Provides requirements for parent meetings with school district personnel relating to ESE & services; provides terms relating to instructional settings; requires use of parental consent forms for actions in student's IEP; provides requirements for certain changes in IEP; encourages public & private instructional personnel collaboration; provides requirements for renewal of professional certificate relating to teaching students with disabilities.

HB 623 – Representative Frank Artiles - Wine:

- Provides exception to maximum allowable capacity for individual containers of wine sold in this state; provides that wine sold or offered for sale by specified vendors shall be in unopened original container.

SB 626 – Senator Dwight Bullard and Representatives Daphne Campbell and Reggie Fullwood - Bullying in the Public School System:

- Prohibits bullying or harassment with respect to computer-related activities; provides that bullying includes cyberbullying; revises components of school district policy on bullying & harassment.

HB 927 – Representative Holly Raschein - Agritourism:

- Restricts local government's ability to regulate agritourism activity on agricultural land; limits liability of certain agritourism operators & land owners under certain conditions; requires that signs & contracts notify participants of certain inherent risks & assumption of that risk.

HB 953 – Representative Jeanette Nuñez -Warrants:

- Specifies when arrest warrant may be issued; authorizes judge to electronically sign arrest & search warrants if certain conditions are met; provides that such warrants deemed electronically issued & signed by judge at time judge affixes his or her electronic signature to warrant.

SB 990/HB 1403 – Senator Dwight Bullard and Representative Holly Raschien - Key Largo Wastewater Treatment District, Monroe County:

Revises district's governing board vacancies & compensation, subject to annual adjustment according to specified price index.

SB 1094/HB 4031 – Senator Anitere Flores and Representative Jose F. Diaz - Home Health Agencies:

- Revising the requirements for the quarterly reporting by a home health agency of certain data submitted to the Agency for Health Care Administration; imposing a fine for failure to timely submit the quarterly report; providing an exemption to the submission of the report and imposition of the fine, etc.

SB 1160 – Senator Dwight Bullard - Onsite Sewage Treatment and Disposal Systems:

- Deletes provisions relating to development of performance criteria applicable to engineer-designed systems; revises requirements for maintenance entity service agreements for certain engineer designed-systems; authorizes certain property owners to be approved and permitted as maintenance entities for performance-based treatment systems under certain conditions; requires owners of performance-based treatment unit systems to obtain certain permits; requires systems in certain areas to comply with specified rules & standards; provides that certain systems constitute compliance with nitrogen standards; requires certain systems to meet specified standards; provides that certain systems are not required to connect to central sewer system until specified date; authorizes certain property owners to be approved & permitted as maintenance entities for aerobic treatment unit systems under certain conditions; provides requirements for such maintenance entity service agreements; prohibits manufacturers from denying certain septic tank contractors access to aerobic treatment unit system training & parts; authorizes certain replacement parts for aerobic treatment unit systems; requires aerobic treatment unit system owners to obtain permits.

SB 1302 – Senator Rene Garcia - Temporary Certificates for Visiting Physicians:

- Providing that a physician who has been invited by certain medical or surgical training programs or educational symposiums may be issued a temporary certificate for limited privileges solely to provide educational training; modifying criteria; revising the requirements for proof of medical malpractice insurance, etc.

HB 1355 – Representative Barbara Watson - Purchase of Firearms by Mentally Ill Persons:

- Provides conditions under which person who has been voluntarily admitted to mental institution for treatment & has undergone involuntary examination under Baker Act may be prohibited from purchasing firearm; provides requirements for examining physician; provides for judicial review of certain findings; provides specified notice requirements; provides form & contents of notice; provides requirements with respect to filing of specified records with court & presentation of such records to judge or magistrate; provides lawful authority of judge or magistrate to review specified records & order that such records be submitted to FDLE; provides a timeframe for submission of records to FDLE upon order of record by judge or magistrate.

SB 1636 – Senator Anitere Flores - Infants Born Alive:

- Providing that an infant born alive during or immediately after an attempted abortion is entitled to the same rights, powers, and privileges as any other child born alive in the course of natural birth; requiring health care practitioners to preserve the life and health of such an infant born alive, if possible; providing for the transport and admittance of an infant born alive to a hospital; requiring a health care practitioner or certain employees who have knowledge of any violations with respect to infants born alive after an attempted abortion to report those violations to the Department of Health, etc.

SB 1644 – Senator Anitere Flores - Victims of Human Trafficking:

- Revising the mental, emotional, or developmental age of a child victim whose out-of-court statement describing specified criminal acts is admissible in evidence in certain instances; providing for electronic appearances of petitioners and attorneys at hearings; authorizing a person whose records are expunged to lawfully deny or fail to acknowledge the arrests covered by the expunged record; providing that the Department of Law Enforcement or any other criminal justice agency is not required to comply with certain requirements relating to expunging criminal history records until a specified date, etc. APPROPRIATION: \$99,275

SB 1660 – Senator Anitere Flores - Quality Cancer Care and Research;

- Establishing a Cancer Center of Excellence Award for providers that excel in providing cancer care and treatment in this state; requiring the Florida Cancer Control and Research Advisory Council and the Biomedical Research Advisory Council to jointly develop and periodically update performance measures, a rating system, and a rating standard in accordance with specified criteria for applicants to qualify for the award; providing that an award-winning cancer provider is granted preference in competitive cancer care solicitations for a specified period of time; revising the responsibilities of the councils with regard to the Cancer Center of Excellence Award program, etc.

SB 1734 – Senator Anitere Flores - Public Records/Victims of Human Trafficking:

- Providing an exemption from public records requirements for criminal history records of victims of human trafficking expunged under s. 943.0583, F.S.; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption under the Open Government Sunset Review Act; providing a statement of public necessity, etc.

HB 7007 – Representative Carlos Trujillo and Economic Development and Tourism Subcommittee - Economic Development: Establishes Economic Development Programs Evaluation:

- Revises date on which DEO & Enterprise Florida, Inc., are required to report on business climate & economic development in state; provides for exemption from tax imposed under ch. 212, F.S., for certain machinery & equipment; requires DEO to analyze each economic development incentive application; requires DEO to publish on website specified information concerning state investment in economic development programs; provides for expansion of boundaries of enterprise zones that meet certain requirements; provides for state's guarantee of certain federal loans to local governments; creates Triumph Gulf Coast, Inc., as nonprofit corporation; requires corporation to create & administer Recovery Fund for benefit of disproportionately affected counties, etc.

HB 7019 – Representative Carlos Trujillo and Economic Development and Tourism Subcommittee - Development Permits:

- Requires counties & municipalities to attach certain disclaimers & include certain permit conditions when issuing development permits; provides that initiative or referendum process for any local comprehensive plan amendments & map amendments is prohibited; provides for permit authorizing permittee to locate, construct, operate, & maintain communication facilities within new or existing high speed rail system; provides that county may include commercial development that is ancillary to professional sports facility in lease of sports facility, etc.

HB 7029 – Representative Manny Diaz, Jr. and Choice and Innovation Subcommittee - Education:

- Requires DOE to develop online catalog of digital learning courses; revises & clarifies requirements for reporting & funding students in virtual instruction

programs; provides requirements for funding home education students enrolled in Florida Virtual School; provides reporting requirements for Florida Virtual School Global; revises requirements for approval as virtual instruction provider; authorizes district school board to operate district innovation school as pilot program; removes restrictions on students taking online courses across district lines.

 - Ratifies agreement between the **Florida DEP** and **U.S. EPA**, which authorizes implementation of nitrogen and phosphorus limits for streams, downstream waters, springs, lakes & estuaries
- **Biodiesel Fuel** (SB 522/HB 633)
 - Exempts counties that manufacture biodiesel fuel from bonding, licensing and bonding requirements
- **State-Owned & State-Leased Space** (HB 1145/SB 1074)
 - Addresses inventory, sales, lease and reporting requirements for state-owned and state-leased property
 - Requirements for county governments removed from bill

2013 Bills

Environment

- **Environmental Regulation** (HB 999/SB 1684)
 - HB 999 passed; further modifies environmental permitting
 - Addresses RAIs, sovereign submerged lands regulations, water supply well permitting program, stormwater permitting
 - “Florida Fertilizer Regulatory Review Commission” and wetlands/water quality exemption for 298 districts removed from final bill on last day of session
- **Agricultural Lands** (HB 203/SB 1190)
 - Prohibits a “governmental entity” from limiting *bona fide* farm operations on land classified as agricultural land; prohibits governmental entity from charging an *assessment or fee*
- **Agritourism** (SB 1106/HB 927)
 - Prohibits local government from limiting an agritourism activity on land classified as agricultural land
