COMMISSIONER KEON HARDEMON CELEBRATES FIRST INFILL LOT DEVELOPMENT IN BROWNSVILLE

Commissioner Keon Hardemon celebrated the completion of the first affordable housing development by the Collective Empowerment Group of South Florida at a ribbon-cutting ceremony. The new 2-bedroom, 1-bathroom house is the first of many developments in the Brownsville community.



COMMISSIONER KEON HARDEMON SECURES \$83 MILLION TO COMBAT GUN VIOLENCE IN NEW NAMING RIGHTS AGREEMENT

Revenues secured through the new Kaseya Naming Rights Agreement will continue to fund the Peace and Prosperity Plan, a program designed to target the root causes of poverty and gun violence in Miami-Dade County. The program helps fund multiple initiatives that provide at-risk youth paid internships, jobs, recreational activities, workshops, life improvement and engagement events, mentorship, and critical skills.

The agreement, sponsored by Commissioner Keon Hardemon and unanimously approved by the Miami-Dade County Board of County Commissioners, will pay the county more than \$117 million over the remaining 17-year term generating \$3.5 million more than it stood to earn from the previous FTX deal.



FATHER JOSÉ LUIS MENÉNDEZ HONORED WITH STREET NAMING CEREMONY

Commissioner Keon Hardemon commemorated Father José Luis Menéndez at a street naming ceremony in Allapattah. As the lead pastor for the Corpus Christi Catholic Church, Father Menéndez fought to end the drug house epidemic, marched for civil rights, and contributed to the development of Allapattah, Wynwood, and Edgewater.




OVER 30,000 POUNDS OF DEBRIS CLEARED AT THE MODEL CITY TRAIL

Our office partnered with Miami-Dade County Departments to remove over 30,000 lbs. of trash from three empty lots in Liberty City through the Clean Community Initiative.

The two-day cleanup included clearing multiple encampments, removing illegal dumping, cutting overgrown trees and grass, pressure cleaning, and professionally disinfecting the concrete bus stops and public gathering structures along NW 62nd Street from NW 17th Avenue to NW 22nd Avenue.
