OVER 21,000 POUNDS OF GARBAGE AND DEBRIS REMOVED IN BROWNSVILLE

The Clean Community Initiative is part of a continued effort to keep our community safe and clean. On February 21st, the Office of Commissioner Keon Hardemon partnered with multiple county departments to remove 21,000 pounds of garbage and debris from four encampments between SR 112 and Evergreen Memorial Cemetery on NW 41st Street.



JOSEPH CALEB AUDITORIUM SCHEDULED FOR A \$15 MILLION EXPANSION AND RENOVATION

A \$15 million renovation is set to bring significant improvements to the Joseph Caleb Auditorium in Brownsville.

The planned renovations will primarily focus on upgrading the loading dock and service entrance in the back-of-house, which will improve access for backstage users. The auditorium hall and theater area will be upgraded to provide better ADA accessibility, increase the number of restroom facilities, and provide new rigging, lighting and sound systems. A new courtyard will be built to create an intimate outdoor performance space and a new welcoming lounge will be created. Finally, a new digital marquee will be installed on the corner of NW 22nd Avenue and NW 54th Street to welcome visitors to the community center.

The renovation is anticipated to be completed by the 2026-2027 season, coinciding with the 50th anniversary of the Joseph Caleb Auditorium.



COMMISSIONER KEON HARDEMON ALLOCATES UP TO \$2 MILLION TOWARDS BLOCK 55 AT SAWYER'S WALK

Commissioner Keon Hardemon passed a resolution allocating up to \$2 million in grant funding to Block 55 LLC. The funds will be used to cover additional project costs related to the Sawyer's Walk project. MSC Cruises will establish its North American headquarters inside Block 55, creating about 250 new jobs in Overtown.

JACKSON SOUL FOOD OPENS THIRD RESTAURANT INSIDE MIAMI INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

Jackson Soul Food has brought its legendary family recipes to Miami International Airport with the opening of its third restaurant, located just beyond security inside the airport's central terminal on the 2nd level departure area near Gate E2.

Commissioner Keon Hardemon celebrated the opening of the new location at a ribbon cutting ceremony alongside Mayor Daniella Levine Cava, Shirlene Ingraham, and other dignitaries.





STREET CLOSURE PILOT PROJECT ON NE 111TH STREET AND NE 6TH AVENUE

A road closure has been placed as part of a pilot project that aims to reduce the number of accidents on NE 6th Avenue and NE 111th Street. The closure was implemented after travelers were seen making illegal turns, which constantly caused accidents in the intersection.
