WHERE'S MY BUS?

TRANSIT ALLIANCE MIAMI

Earlier this month, Transit Alliance Miami (TA), a non-profit organization advocating for walkable streets, bikeable neighborhoods and better public transit, made a special visit to our district office. As part of the "Transit Marathon," where they visited all 13 commission districts - ALL by bus.

The TA team were welcomed with open arms, as they delivered the Better Bus Project's "<u>Choices Report</u>," which assessed the existing bus network, engaged the public, and developed recommendations for changing the transit network in the future.

The Better Bus Project is an advocacy-led and community-driven bus system redesign focused on the Miami-Dade County bus network. It is a collaborative planning effort to decide where bus service should go, when it should run, and how frequently it should operate.

SENIORS NEED TRANSIT, TOO



As Miami-Dade County and municipalities work towards a better bus system, Commissioner Higgins is making sure that seniors are not left behind.

That's why District 5 is launching a series of Transportation Outreach W orkshops to solicit input regarding transportation and mobility from seniors in the district.

Together with Urban Impact Lab, a local civic

innovation firm, the workshops will serve to identify and map all senior-specific facilities in the district and analyze transportation options. Through facilitated groups, participants will map out where they live, the places they go, and how they get around on weekdays and weekends. They will also discuss technology, ridership programs, and new potential transit services.

WHAT 5 DID



between 29 and 32 streets in early summer months, it was hard to miss the stinky seaweed that inundated Miami-Dade beaches.

Together with the

Miami-Dade Parks, Recreation, and Open Spaces Department (PROS), the Division of Environmental Resources Management, and City of Miami Beach, Commissioner Higgins worked quickly to identify solutions and funding, as well as secure the required permits, to address this new phenomenon that was affecting the quality of life of beach residents and visitors.

Thanks to the leadership of Miami-Dade County Mayor Carlos Gimenez, on July 23, an emergency contract was issued for the removal of seaweed in hot spot areas, locations of the beach with the most accumulation. The seaweed removal began on August 2.

Collaboration with local, state, and federal agencies was the key to navigating the complex permitting process required for the removal of seaweed along the shoreline. Working closely with the Florida Fish and Wildlife Commission and Department of Environmental Protection, the County was issued a permit until October 31.

Thank you to Beach residents for keeping District 5 up-to-date with the progress made since implementing the removal plan. But this was the first step, and Mayor Gimenez has created a Seaweed Advisory Group to create a long termplan to address this much bigger environmental issue and keep our beaches clean.

By using 311, residents (anonymously or not) have the power to report neighborhood problems immediately, right on the spot, by calling the contact center.

You can also upload a picture of the problem you have spotted, add relevant information, and provide contact information for a follow up to the 311 app.

LEGISLATIVE NEWS

THE FUTURE OF DOWNTOWN



In July, the Board of County Commissioners adopted legislation sponsored by Commissioner Higgins to create a master plan for a green, pedestrian-friendly, and transitoriented Downtown Miami.

On July 27, Commissioner Higgins, together with Miami-Dade County Regulatory and Resources Department (RER), hosted a visioning public workshop on "The Future of Downtown."

The workshop allowed residents, organizations,

and public officials to share their ideas on how to revitalize 26 acres of underutilized county property Downtown.

Over 80 attendees discussed future plans for the area including affordable housing, transit connectivity, open green spaces, schools, social and economic impacts, and much more.

With so many county-owned properties in the Downtown Miami area, Commissioner Higgins sees this as an opportunity not just to construct a building or two, but to shape an entire neighborhood.

GOLDEN PASSPORT

Did you know that seniors and social security beneficiaries can get a free EASY card though



Miami-Dade County's Golden Passport program? Miami-Dade County created the Golden Passport program, which provides transportation to residents who are seniors, disabled, or lowincome veterans in our county. Last December, District 5 held a Golden Passport event in Miami Beach where Commissioner Higgins identified ways to improve the program for our residents.

Since the event, Commissioner Higgins lowered the replacement costs for a lost card. The first replacement is now free, the second is \$10, and the third is \$25. The legislation also directed the Department of Transportation and Public Works to create a full-service, online system that allows residents to apply for and replace their Golden Passport cards from the comfort of their

own home.

This update will transform the customer service experience for our Golden Passport users by eliminating burdensome and inefficient processes. Modernizing the process has the added benefit of eliminating the inconvenience of a trip to Government Center for seniors.

The online system will be launching soon. Stay tuned.

LGBTQ TASK FORCE

While progress has been made for the LGBTQ community, more must get done. That's why Commissioner Higgins sponsored legislation that will create a formal Miami-Dade County LGBTQ Advisory Board. The board will be working with community advocates that will serve to address matters that affect the quality of life of LGBTQ residents and visitors to the county. The LGBTQ advisory board will propose policies and recommendations to address social, economic, cultural and political problems facing the LGBTQ community. Similar to other county boards, each county commissioner can appoint a representative, with deep knowledge or involvement in the community.

The item has passed committee and is headed to the Miami-Dade County Board of County Commissioners meeting for final approval on **October 3rd**.
