Established on July 22, 1997, the Asian-American Advisory Board (AAAB) was created to work in an advisory capacity to the Board of County Commissioners, administration, community and all agencies in Miami-Dade County with respect to matters pertaining to the Asian-American community. In addition, the Board and its staff routinely assist people with their grievances and intervene with the appropriate parties to seek a resolution.

About the AAAB

The board focus is to empower the Asian community by engaging public officials, connecting with other communities and educating the community at large about the Asian issues and needs. In order to achieve its goals the Board works individually and collectively representing the Asian diversity in Miami-Dade County and also serves as an advocate and supporter of the Asian Americans in civic, cultural, commercial and community affairs.

About the AAAB

The board is composed of 26 members who are permanent residents and electors of Miami-Dade County and have a knowledge of and interest in the County's Asian Community. The current composition of the Board reflects the diversity of Asia. Nationals of the following Asian nations-states currently sit on the Board: Burma, China, Hong Kong, India, Iran, Japan, Pakistan, Philippines, Taiwan, Thailand, Turkey, and Vietnam.
