

Education was/is the issue

People of Haitian ancestry display most of the characteristics of hard to count communities such as:

- Multi-family housing units and hidden housing
- Adults that are not high school graduates
- People below poverty Households with public assistance income
- Households with English as a second Language ...

Then Census added the online dimension

Address

- Census is a political tool. It ensures that each community is represented in government (apportionment)
- Census is a planning tool Where will we need new schools, roads, hospitals, senior citizens centers...
- Census is an economic tool. Where should the federal, state, county, municipal dollars be spent to stimulate local economic development

Communication

- ☐ Radio is still the most preferred channel of communication in the Haitian community (overall)
- ☐ Social media is a strong contender thus Online Opportunity

Why target the 18-34 age group in the Haitian American community in online campaign?

- 1. They represent one of the most trusted voice for their parents, friends, neighbors, and families
- 2. They are most technology savvy
- 3. They access the internet daily through their phones, laptops, tablets
- 4. They use social networking sites such as Facebook, Whatsapp, Twitter (online social media gurus)
- 5. English and Creole are their dominant languages

The 18-34 age group are the perfect element (often overlooked) for a complete count in the Haitian community. The database is progressing

Continue the coordination

- Municipalities/Districts/County to engage the 18-34 age group
 - ✓ Census jobs
 - √ Volunteers/Coordinators
- The church is still a main rallying point in the Haitian community. Continue to enlist pastors, church members within faith based organizations
- Social service organizations still represent a great contact point for information dissemination
