## **Future candidates urged to attend Clean Campaign Class**

Anyone considering running for local office should learn the rules and regulations by attending the next Clean Campaign Class sponsored by the Miami-Dade Commission on Ethics and Public Trust and the Elections Department. Information critical to the early phases of electioneering – including opening bank accounts, filing forms and qualifying -- will be presented. In addition to politicians, campaign managers, treasurers, volunteers and anyone interested in learning what it takes to run a clean campaign, are encouraged to attend.

The two-hour seminar takes place from <u>6:00 – 8:00 p.m.</u> on <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>December 6, 2023</u>, in the <u>Town of Surfside Commission Chambers at 9293 Harding Avenue</u>. Speakers -- including representatives from the Ethics Commission and the Elections Department -- will provide essential information on election law and procedures, fundraising and record keeping. The event is free and open to the public. Attorneys can earn Continuing Legal Education credits from the Florida Bar.
