**TERM:** Four (4) years [\[Miami-Dade County Charter, Article 3, Section 3.01\(A\)\]](#)

The term for Board of County Commissioners shall commence on the second Tuesday next succeeding the date of the General Election in November (November 22, 2022). [\[Miami-Dade County Charter, Article 3, Section 3.01\(C\)\]](#)

**TERM LIMIT:** Two (2) terms [\[Miami-Dade County Charter, Article 3, Section 3.01\(E\)\]](#)

No person shall be elected as Commissioner for more than two consecutive four-year terms. No term of service as a Commissioner commencing prior to 2012 shall be considered a part of or counted toward the two term limit.

**SALARY:** \$6,000 Annually [\[Miami-Dade County Charter, Article 1, Section 1.06\]](#)

**ELECTION DATES:** August 23, 2022 – Primary

(Filing fee of \$300.00 plus an election assessment equal to 1% of the annual salary as of July 1, 2021). [[Miami-Dade County Charter, Article 3, Section 3.04\(A\)](#)] and [F.S. 99.092\(1\)](#)].
9. Who Can Sign Petitions? [[F.S. 99.095](#) and [Miami-Dade County Charter, Article 3, Section 3.04\(B\)](#)]

Any registered elector in the geographical area of candidacy may sign a petition.

Signatures may not be obtained until the candidate has filed the Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository for Candidates pursuant to [F.S. 106.021](#) and valid only for the qualifying period immediately following such filings.

Petition signatures of at least 1% of the total registered electors in the geographical area represented by the office sought for the immediately preceding general election are required as follows:

Deadline for Submitting Petitions: [[F.S. 99.095](#) and [Miami-Dade County Charter, Article 3, Section 3.04\(B\)](#)]

Candidates must submit petitions for verification to the Miami-Dade Elections Department no later than noon of the 28<sup>th</sup> day preceding the first day of the qualifying period (Tuesday, May 3, 2022). All petitions submitted must contain the voter's original signature.

Petition Verification: [[F.S. 99.097](#) and [Miami-Dade County Charter, Article 3, Section 3.04\(B\)](#)]

There is a charge of 10 cents per name for verification of signatures, which must be paid to the Miami-Dade Elections Department upon submission of petitions. The candidate may file an "[Affidavit of Undue Burden](#)" with the Miami-Dade Elections Department to waive the cost of verification. [[F.S. 99.097\(4\)](#)]

If any person is paid to solicit signatures on a petition, an undue burden oath may not subsequently be filed in lieu of paying the fee to have signatures verified for that petition. If an undue burden oath has been filed and payment is subsequently made to any person to solicit signatures on a petition, the undue burden oath is no longer valid and a fee for all signatures previously submitted to the supervisor of elections and any that are submitted thereafter shall be paid by the candidate who submitted the undue burden oath. [[F.S. 99.097\(6\)](#)]

The Supervisor of Elections must certify the number of valid signatures no later than the 7<sup>th</sup> day before the first day of the qualifying period (Tuesday, May 24, 2022) and submit such certification to the Division of Elections.

If the candidate is unable to collect the required number of signatures, he/she may still qualify by paying the qualifying fee.

## **Public Financing**

**Election Campaign Financing Trust Fund** [[Miami-Dade County Code of Ordinances, Chapter 12, Section 12-22](#)]

If applying for Public Funding, candidate must:

1. File the Public Financing Acknowledgement Statement ([MD-ED 11](#)).
2. File the Irrevocable Statement and Application for Election Campaign Financing Trust Fund for Initial and Run-off Elections ([MD-ED 13](#)) no later than ninety (90) days after opening a campaign account or thirty (30) days before the first day of qualifying with the Supervisor of Elections, whichever shall come first. Since the 30<sup>th</sup> day before the first day of qualifying falls on Sunday, May 1, 2022, we strongly encourage candidates to submit this form by Friday, April 29, 2022. If the form is provided to the Supervisor of Elections' Office after the close of business on Friday, it must be received via email at [campaigns@miamidade.gov](mailto:campaigns@miamidade.gov) or fax at 305-499-8501 no later than Sunday. The original signed document must be provided to the Supervisor of Elections' Office in order to be processed.

Alternatively, if participating in the Election Campaign Financing Trust Fund for a run-off election only, file the Irrevocable Statement and Application for Election Campaign Financing Trust Fund – Runoff Election Only ([MD-ED 14](#)) and the Affidavit for Run-off Election Expenditure Limits ([MD-ED 17](#)) by the third business day after the certification of the results of the initial election to the Supervisor of Elections.

3. Limit the loans or contributions from the candidate's personal funds to twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000).
4. Receive the required number of contributions between \$100 and \$500 from the required number of qualified contributors in the District (at least 300 but no more than 360 contributors).
5. Submit the Contributions List for Application for Election Campaign Financing Trust Fund ([MD-ED 15](#)) no later than twenty (20) business days prior to the first day of qualifying (Tuesday, May 3, 2022).
6. Attend, along with the Campaign Treasurer, a seminar conducted by the Miami-Dade County Ethics Commission regarding state and local campaign financing laws, which shall be completed prior to the receipt of contributions from the Fund.
7. File the Trigger Reporting Form for Public Financing Candidates Only ([MD-ED 16](#)) [[Miami-Dade County Code of Ordinances, Chapter 12, Section 12-22](#)]. Any candidate for Board of County Commissioners that is participating in the Election Campaign Financing Trust Fund must file a report within 24 hours of receiving contributions or making expenditures that exceed one hundred percent (100%) of the applicable expenditure limits. The expenditure limits are as follows:

Initial election for Board of County Commissioners	\$200,000	(100%)
Run-off election for Board of County Commissioners	\$150,000	(100%)

Such reports must be filed with the Miami-Dade Elections Department using the Trigger Reporting Form together with a Campaign Treasurer's Report covering the period from the date of the last report to the date that the ceiling was reached. Additionally, the Campaign Treasurer's Report must be filed electronically through the website provided by the Elections Department.
