Signatures may not be obtained until the candidate has filed the Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository for Candidates pursuant to <u>F.S. 106.021(1)(a)</u> and valid only for the qualifying period immediately following such filings.

Deadline for Submitting Petitions: [F.S. 99.095 and Miami-Dade County Charter, Article 3, Section 3.04(B)]

Candidates must submit petitions for verification to the Miami-Dade Elections Department no later than noon of the 28th day preceding the first day of the qualifying period (Tuesday, April 30, 2024). All petitions submitted must contain the voter's original signature.

Petition Verification: [F.S. 99.097 and Miami-Dade County Charter, Article 3, Section 3.04(B)]

There is a charge of 10 cents per name for verification of signatures, which must be paid to the Miami-Dade Elections Department upon submission of petitions. The candidate may file an "<u>Affidavit of Undue Burden</u>" with the Miami-Dade Elections Department to waive the cost of verification. [F.S. 99.097(4)]

If any person is paid to solicit signatures on a petition, an undue burden oath may not subsequently be filed in lieu of paying the fee to have signatures verified for that petition. If an undue burden oath has been filed and payment is subsequently made to any person to solicit signatures on a petition, the undue burden oath is no longer valid and a fee for all signatures previously submitted to the supervisor of elections and any that are submitted thereafter shall be paid by the candidate who submitted the undue burden oath. [F.S. 99.097(6)]

The Supervisor of Elections must certify the number of valid signatures no later than the 7th day before the first day of the qualifying period (Tuesday, May 21, 2024) and submit such certification to the Division of Elections.

If the candidate is unable to collect the required number of signatures, he/she may still qualify by paying the qualifying fee.

Public Financing

Election Campaign Financing Trust Fund [Miami-Dade County Code of Ordinances, Chapter 12, Section 12-22]

If applying for Public Funding, candidate must:

- 1. File the Public Financing Acknowledgement Statement (MD-ED 11).
- 2. File the Irrevocable Statement and Application for Election Campaign Financing Trust Fund for Initial and Run-off Elections (MD-ED 13) no later than ninety (90) days after opening a campaign account or thirty (30) days before the first day of qualifying with the Supervisor of Elections, whichever shall come first. Since the 30th day before the first day of qualifying falls on Sunday, April 28, 2024, we strongly encourage candidates to submit this form by Friday, April 26, 2024. If the form is provided to the Supervisor of Elections' Office after the close of business on Friday, it must be received via email at campaigns@miamidade.gov no later than Sunday, April 28, 2024. The original signed document must be provided to the Supervisor of Elections' Office in order to be processed.

Alternatively, if participating in the Election Campaign Financing Trust Fund for a run-off election only, file the Irrevocable Statement and Application for Election Campaign Financing Trust Fund – Run-off Election Only (<u>MD-ED 14</u>) and the Affidavit for Run-off Election Expenditure Limits (<u>MD-ED 17</u>) by the third business day after the certification of the results of the initial election to the Supervisor of Elections.

- 3. Limit the loans or contributions from the candidate's personal funds to twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000).
- 4. Receive the required number of contributions between \$100 and \$500 from the required number of qualified contributors in the District (at least 300 but no more than 360 contributors).
- Submit the Contributions List for Application for Election Campaign Financing Trust Fund (<u>MD-ED 15</u>) before or at least twenty (20) <u>business</u> days prior to the first day of qualifying for office after applying for public funding (Friday, April 26, 2024).
- 6. Attend, along with the Campaign Treasurer, a seminar conducted by the Miami-Dade County Ethics Commission regarding state and local campaign financing laws, which shall be completed prior to the receipt of contributions from the Fund.
- 7. File the Trigger Reporting Form for Public Financing Candidates Only (<u>MD-ED 16</u>) [<u>Miami-Dade County Code of Ordinances</u>, <u>Chapter 12</u>, <u>Section 12-22</u>]. Any candidate for Board of County Commissioners that is participating in the Election Campaign Financing Trust Fund must file a report within 24 hours of receiving contributions or making expenditures that exceed one hundred percent (100%) of the applicable expenditure limits. The expenditure limits are as follows:

Initial election for Board of County Commissioners	\$200,000	(100%)
Run-off election for Board of County Commissioners	\$150,000	(100%)

Such reports must be filed with the Miami-Dade Elections Department using the Trigger Reporting Form together with a Campaign Treasurer's Report covering the period from the date of the last report to the date that the ceiling was reached. Additionally, the Campaign Treasurer's Report must be filed electronically through the website provided by the Elections Department.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Launch of Electronic Filing – Full & Public Disclosure of Financial Interests (Form 6)

Recent changes to the financial disclosure laws provide that beginning January 1, 2023, the Full and Public Disclosure of Financial Interests (Form 6) is available only by utilizing the Florida Commission on Ethics' electronic filing system.

Anyone wishing to file a Form 6 for qualifying purposes MUST register in the system to access the disclosure form. A valid email is required to register. Within the system, candidates will find helpful videos.

Candidates are required to submit a hard copy of the Form 6 to the filing officer at the time of qualifying.

Candidates are urged to allow ample time to register, create a profile, username/password, and complete the disclosure. Waiting until the last day of qualifying may not provide sufficient time to access the system, accurately complete the disclosure, print and file it with the qualifying officer.
