Candidates for Judicial Office:

Congratulations on your decision to seek election or reelection to judicial office. The courts stand at the heart of the democratic process and, in endeavoring to preserve and strengthen our system of government, the judicial branch relies upon many dedicated individuals willing to serve the public good. Looking ahead to the 2022 elections, I ask you to conduct your campaigns in a manner not only exemplifying this commitment to service but also further justifying continued public trust and confidence in our judicial system.

Toward this end, the Supreme Court of Florida and The Florida Bar Board of Governors, in concert with the state's trial court chief judges and the Judicial Ethics Advisory Committee, will present campaign conduct forums the week following the close of qualifying. All judicial candidates drawing opposition will be expected to participate personally in one of several forums beginning at 1:00 p.m. Eastern Time on Thursday, May 5, or Friday, May 6. The enclosed preliminary schedule lists planned locations.

Candidates, committee chairs, campaign managers, and staff will be provided critical information regarding requirements under Canon 7 of the Code of Judicial Conduct. Given the potential for reprimand, removal from office, or lawyer discipline, failure to

comply with the Code should be a matter of no small concern. Presenters will also more broadly emphasize the seriousness with which the Court views any abuse of the elections process and the consequent impact of campaign misconduct on public trust and confidence in the judicial branch.
