VOTER SOLICITATION / ELECTIONEERING

(F.S. 102.031)

"Voter solicitation" is also referred to as "electioneering" or "campaigning."

<u>Polling place/Early Voting site</u>: Defined as the <u>building</u> that contains the polling room or Early Voting area where ballots are cast during Early Voting and on Election Day.

Solicitation includes, but it is not limited to:

- seeking or attempting to seek any vote, fact, opinion, or contribution;
- distributing or attempting to distribute any political or campaign materials, leaflets, or handout:
- conducting a poll, except it shall not be construed to prohibit exit polling;
- seeking or attempting to seek a signature on any petition;
- selling or attempting to sell any item and
- engaging in any activity with the intent to influence or effect of influencing a voter.

<u>Restrictions</u>: No person may solicit voters <u>within</u> 150 feet of the <u>entrance</u> to a polling place on Election Day or Early Voting site during Early Voting.

<u>Enforcement</u>: The Miami-Dade County Elections Department will enforce the area <u>within</u> the 150-ft. zone surrounding the polling place or Early Voting site.



Note:

A voter can park their car/truck decorated with campaign materials within 150 feet of the entrance to a polling place or Early Voting site while voting. Otherwise, the car/truck cannot remain parked within the 150-foot zone.
